tactile	Of or relating to or proceeding from the sense of touch <i>The measure of the degree of tactile sensitivity is called aesthesiometry.</i>

tactless	Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse <i>It is also tactless to dismiss the usage.</i>
tahitian	Of or relating to or characteristic of the island of tahiti or its residents or their language and culture <i>Tahitian tree snail survived recent mass extirpation.</i>
tai	Of or relating to thailand <i>Gavallan is an aspirant to the office of tai pan.</i>
tailless	Not having a tail <i>This is a cat born entirely tailless.</i>
taillike	Resembling a tail <i>Each leaf is a taillike strip of overlapping lobed leaflets.</i>
tailor-made	Custom-made <i>The tailor cut the cloth in two.</i>
tailored	Severely simple in line or design <i>He had several suits tailored.</i>
tainted	Touched by rot or decay <i>However the party was tainted with associations with the official ira.</i>
taiwanese	Of or relating to or characteristic of the island republic on taiwan or its residents or their language <i>They are not ethnic taiwanese or taiwanese american for that matter.</i>
tajikistani	Of or relating to or characteristic of tajikistan or it people or culture <i>A tajikistani captive was transferred at the same time.</i>
take-home	Remaining after all deductions including taxes <i>He returned to home unscathed.</i>
takeout	Of or involving food to be taken and eaten off the premises <i>So sorry it has to be in a takeout cup.</i>
taking	Very attractive; capturing interest <i>For one thing, it requires taking the cover glass off the chronometer.</i>
talebearing	Prone to communicate confidential information
talented	Endowed with talent or talents <i>He is the most trustworthy and talented.</i>
talentless	Devoid of talent; not gifted <i>He's more like talentless commercial bubblegum pop.</i>
taliped	Having a deformed foot
talismanic	Possessing or believed to possess magic power especially protective power <i>His talismanic ability in the fa cup rarely transferred to regular league form.</i>
talkative	Unwisely talking too much <i>The secret of the southwest solved by talkative tree rings.</i>
talky	Full of trivial conversation <i>Rework talky and awkward first few sentences.</i>
tall	Too improbable to admit of belief <i>The tall trees precipitate the fog.</i>
taller	Lofty in style <i>The tumbler was originally tall and cylindrical.</i>

tallest	Too improbable to admit of belief <i>This tall yazagaku student is the epitome of high class and femininity.</i>
tallish	Somewhat tall <i>But you can't help that she is skinny, tallish and wears glasses. 38.</i>
taloned	Armed with claws or talons <i>Usually, all four legs of a gryphon end in taloned feet of great strength.</i>
tamable	Capable of being tamed <i>That goes to show that feral cats are tamable.</i>
tame	Very docile- langston hughes <i>Tufted coquettes are tame and approachable.</i>
tameable	Capable of being tamed
tamed	Brought from wildness into a domesticated state <i>I thought my response was plainspoken, but tame.</i>
tamer	Flat and uninspiring <i>The battens will tame the luffing sails.</i>

tangible	Having physical substance and intrinsic monetary value <i>Larceny applies only to the stealing of tangible personal property.</i>
tangled	In a confused mass <i>It's in the tangled mess behing the computer.</i>
tangy	Tasting sour like a lemon <i>The tangy citrus flavor is mostly composed of grapefruit.</i>
tanned	Of a light yellowish-brown color <i>The color of the bark is tan and brown.</i>
tannic	Derived from tannin <i>Tannate is the salt or ester of tannic acid.</i>
tannish	Of a color resembling tan <i>Penuche often has a tannish color to it and is lighter than regular fudge.</i>
tantalising	Arousing desire or expectation for something unattainable or mockingly out of reach <i>The lure of classical philosophy is tantalising.</i>

tardy	After the expected or usual time; delayed <i>A tardy maria bernaldez enters the agency and janice fires her on the spot.</i>
tarry	Having the characteristics of pitch or tar <i>I no longer require recourse to tarry with an outer guru.</i>
tarsal	Of or relating to or near the tarsus of the foot <i>It runs with the lateral tarsal artery.</i>
tart	Harsh <i>The berry has a somewhat tart flavor, fairly earthy with traces of sweetness.</i>
tartarean	Of or relating to or characteristic of hades or tartarus
tartaric	Relating to or derived from or resembling tartar <i>Tartaric acid is an ingredient of jam.</i>
tasmanian	Of or relating to tasmania <i>Adults of the tasmanian subspecies average around.</i>
tasseled	Fringed or adorned with tassels <i>A buggy whip had a small, usually tasseled tip called a snapper.</i>
tasselled	Fringed or adorned with tassels <i>Some authors claim that her tasselled aegis may be the remnants of wings.</i>
tasteful	Having or showing or conforming to good taste <i>At least the background colour is reasonably tasteful.</i>

taut	Subjected to great tension; stretched tight <i>It's the force which pulls the string taut.</i>
tautologic	Repetition of same sense in different words <i>It's a bit tautologic, that's all.</i>
tautological	Repetition of same sense in different words <i>The heading 'political and human geography' is tautological.</i>
tawdry	Tastelessly showy <i>They start a tawdry affair and fall in love.</i>

taxable	Subject to taxation <i>One common objective is deferral of the recognition of taxable gains.</i>
