# Abashed as an Adjective

## Definitions of "Abashed" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "abashed" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed.
- Embarrassed, disconcerted, or ashamed.
- Feeling or caused to feel uneasy and self-conscious.

## Synonyms of "Abashed" as an adjective (22 Words)

ashamed Reluctant to do something through fear of embarrassment or humiliation.

His clothes and manners made me **ashamed** of him.

Pink or pale red.

**blushing** I m no **blushing** adolescent giggling at the mere mention of a four letter

word.

**chagrined** Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed.

**Chagrined** at the poor sales of his book.



**confounded** Used for emphasis, especially to express anger or annoyance.

A cloudy and **confounded** philosopher.

confused Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity.

Interviewing **confused** old people does take longer.

**crestfallen** Sad and disappointed.

He came back empty handed and **crestfallen**.

**discomfited** Disappointingly unsuccessful.

discomposed Having your composure disturbed.

She looked a little **discomposed** as she spoke.

**disconcerted** Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion.

Keith looked momentarily **disconcerted**.

**dismayed** Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.

Facing or experiencing financial trouble or difficulty.

**distressed** He dropped out of the race clearly **distressed** and having difficulty

breathing.

dumbfounded Greatly astonished or amazed.

Jay explained to a **dumbfounded** Nick.

Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed.

Too **embarrassed** to say hello to his drunken father on the street.

**humbled** Of low birth or station (`base' is archaic in this sense.

humiliated Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride.

**Humiliated** that his wife had to go out to work.

mortified Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride.

*Felt mortified* by the comparison with her sister.

**nonplussed** Not disconcerted; unperturbed.

Henry looked completely **nonplussed**.

**perturbed** Feeling anxiety or concern; unsettled.

She didn t seem **perturbed** about the noises around her.

red-faced Having a red face from embarrassment or shame or agitation or emotional

upset.

remorseful Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses.

The defendant was **remorseful** for what he had done.

**shamefaced** Showing a sense of shame.

The hangdog and **shamefaced** air of the retreating enemy.

**sheepish** Showing or feeling embarrassment from shame or a lack of self-confidence.

A **sheepish** grin.



## Usage Examples of "Abashed" as an adjective

• Harriet looked slightly abashed.

• She was not abashed at being caught.

• Felt abashed at the extravagant praise.

# Associations of "Abashed" (30 Words)

Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances. annoyed

He was **annoyed** at being woken up so early.

Feeling shame or guilt or embarrassment or remorse. ashamed

His clothes and manners made me **ashamed** of him.

Puzzled, confused, or bewildered. bemused A crowd of **bemused** onlookers.

Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. bewildered

He saw the **bewildered** look on my face.

A pink or pale red tinge. blush

He **blush**ed to think of how he d paraded himself.

Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. confused

The **confused** information supplied by authorities.

Having fallen from favour or a position of power or honour; discredited. disgraced

The **disgraced** city financier.

Deceptive or fraudulent; disposed to cheat or defraud or deceive. dishonorable

**Dishonorable** in thought and deed.

Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. distress

A company in financial **distress**.

Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed. embarrassed

I felt quite **embarrassed** whenever I talked to her.

Causing to feel shame or chagrin or vexation. embarrassing

Awkward or **embarrassing** or difficult moments in the discussion.

A person or thing causing feelings of embarrassment. *An embarrassment of riches.* embarrassment

Pronounce not guilty of criminal charges. exculpate

The article **exculpate**d the mayor.

Have a feeling or perception about oneself in reaction to someone s

behavior or attitude. feel

A cafe with a cosmopolitan feel.



Remove or dispose of an object or substance by flushing.

They re trying to **flush** him out of hiding.

fluster

Be flustered behave in a confused manner.

The false start **fluster**ed me a bit.

Showing a sense of guilt- Eric Linklater.

guilty A quilty look.

**hangdog**Having a dejected or guilty appearance; shamefaced.

The **hangdog** and shamefaced air of the retreating enemy.

**irritated** Showing or feeling slight anger; annoyed.

The **irritated** look on Alec s face.

offend Cause to feel resentment or indignation.

The smell of ash offended him.

Relating to or expressing penitence or penance.

Wrote a **penitential** letter apologizing for her hasty words.

Full of difficulty or confusion or bewilderment.

She gave him a **perplexed** look.

**perplexing** Completely baffling; very puzzling.

A **perplexing** problem.

Share the suffering of.

It s a **pity** you didn t contact us first.

repentant Feeling or expressing remorse for misdeeds.

He is truly **repentant** for his incredible naivety and stupidity.

**resignation** The acceptance of something undesirable but inevitable.

He announced his **resignation**.

**shame** Cause to be ashamed.

*She was hot with shame.* 

**shoplift** Steal goods from a shop while pretending to be a customer.

She was caught **shoplift**ing a pair of shoes.

**steamed** Aroused to impatience or anger.

I was **steamed**.

troubled Characterized by or indicative of distress or affliction or danger or need.

His **troubled** private life.
