## Associations of "Abducted" (30 Words)

<b>abduction</b>	The action of forcibly taking someone away against their will. <i>The man is also accused of the attempted <b>abduction</b> of another youngster.</i>
<b>abductor</b>	A person who abducts another person. <i><b>Abductor</b> pollicis.</i>
<b>arrogate</b>	Take or claim (something) without justification. <i>They <b>arrogate</b> to themselves the ability to divine the nation s true interests.</i>
<b>assault</b>	Make a physical attack on. <i>The mugger <b>assaulted</b> the woman.</i>
<a href="#">bail</a>	Empty a vessel by bailing. <i>His son called home to get <b>bailed</b> out of jail.</i>
<a href="#">buccaneer</a>	Live like a buccaneer. <i>The company might be a target for an individual <b>buccaneer</b> seeking power and prestige.</i>
<b>child</b>	An immature childish person. <i>She writes books for <b>children</b>.</i>
<a href="#">commandeer</a>	Take possession of (something) by force. <i>The truck was <b>commandeered</b> by a mob.</i>
<a href="#">crime</a>	Illegal activities. <i>They condemned apartheid as a <b>crime</b> against humanity.</i>
<a href="#">crisis</a>	The turning point of a disease when an important change takes place, indicating either recovery or death. <i>He goes to pieces in a <b>crisis</b>.</i>
<b>enslavement</b>	The state of being a slave-Shakespeare. <i>The <b>enslavement</b> of millions of Africans.</i>
<b>guarantor</b>	A person or organization that provides a guarantee. <i>The role of the police as <b>guarantors</b> of public order.</i>

<b><u>hijack</u></b>	An incident or act of hijacking. <i>An unsuccessful <b>hijack</b> attempt.</i>
<b>hijacker</b>	A person who illegally seizes an aircraft, ship, or vehicle while in transit and forces it to go to a different destination or uses it for their own purposes. <i>The <b>hijackers</b> of this government ignore all but their own agenda.</i>
<b>hostage</b>	A prisoner who is held by one party to insure that another party will meet specified terms. <i>Three <b>hostages</b> were released but only after their families paid an estimated 200 000 to the guerrillas.</i>
<b>illegitimate</b>	The illegitimate offspring of unmarried parents. <i>Defending workers against <b>illegitimate</b> managerial practices.</i>
<b>jail</b>	Put someone in jail. <i>The driver was <b>jailed</b> for two years.</i>
<b><u>kidnap</u></b>	The action of kidnapping someone. <i>Militants <b>kidnapped</b> the daughter of a minister.</i>
<b>kidnapping</b>	The action of abducting someone and holding them captive. <i>A new wave of <b>kidnappings</b> and murders.</i>
<b>lascivious</b>	Driven by lust; preoccupied with or exhibiting lustful desires. <i>He gave her a <b>lascivious</b> wink.</i>
<b>maltreat</b>	Treat (a person or animal) cruelly or with violence. <i>Children die from neglect or are <b>maltreated</b> by their carers.</i>
<b><u>pirate</u></b>	A ship that is manned by pirates. <i>The company is seeking compensation from people who <b>pirated</b> the movie.</i>
<b>ransom</b>	Release a captive after receiving a ransom. <i>The lord was captured in war and had to be <b>ransomed</b>.</i>
<b>ravish</b>	Hold spellbound. <i>There is no assurance that her infant child will not be <b>ravished</b> from her breast.</i>
<b>seize</b>	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one's right or possession. <i>The current President <b>seized</b> power in a coup.</i>
<b>surety</b>	Money given to support an undertaking that someone will perform a duty, pay their debts, etc.; a guarantee. <i>The <b>surety</b> of my impending fatherhood.</i>
<b><u>violation</u></b>	An act that disregards an agreement or a right. <i>The aircraft were in <b>violation</b> of UN resolutions.</i>
