Associations of "Abducted" (30 Words)

abduction	The action of forcibly taking someone away against their will. <i>The man is also accused of the attempted abduction of another youngster.</i>
abductor	A person who abducts another person. <i>Abductor pollicis.</i>
arrogate	Take or claim (something) without justification. <i>They arrogate to themselves the ability to divine the nation s true interests.</i>
assault	Make a physical attack on. <i>The mugger assaulted the woman.</i>
bail	Empty a vessel by bailing. <i>His son called home to get bailed out of jail.</i>
buccaneer	Live like a buccaneer. <i>The company might be a target for an individual buccaneer seeking power and prestige.</i>
child	An immature childish person. <i>She writes books for children.</i>
commandeer	Take possession of (something) by force. <i>The truck was commandeered by a mob.</i>
crime	Illegal activities. <i>They condemned apartheid as a crime against humanity.</i>
crisis	The turning point of a disease when an important change takes place, indicating either recovery or death. <i>He goes to pieces in a crisis.</i>
enslavement	The state of being a slave-Shakespeare. <i>The enslavement of millions of Africans.</i>
guarantor	A person or organization that provides a guarantee. <i>The role of the police as guarantors of public order.</i>

hijack	An incident or act of hijacking. <i>An unsuccessful hijack attempt.</i>
hijacker	A person who illegally seizes an aircraft, ship, or vehicle while in transit and forces it to go to a different destination or uses it for their own purposes. <i>The hijackers of this government ignore all but their own agenda.</i>
hostage	A prisoner who is held by one party to insure that another party will meet specified terms. <i>Three hostages were released but only after their families paid an estimated 200 000 to the guerrillas.</i>
illegitimate	The illegitimate offspring of unmarried parents. <i>Defending workers against illegitimate managerial practices.</i>
jail	Put someone in jail. <i>The driver was jailed for two years.</i>
kidnap	The action of kidnapping someone. <i>Militants kidnapped the daughter of a minister.</i>
kidnapping	The action of abducting someone and holding them captive. <i>A new wave of kidnappings and murders.</i>
lascivious	Driven by lust; preoccupied with or exhibiting lustful desires. <i>He gave her a lascivious wink.</i>
maltreat	Treat (a person or animal) cruelly or with violence. <i>Children die from neglect or are maltreated by their carers.</i>
pirate	A ship that is manned by pirates. <i>The company is seeking compensation from people who pirated the movie.</i>
ransom	Release a captive after receiving a ransom. <i>The lord was captured in war and had to be ransomed.</i>
ravish	Hold spellbound. <i>There is no assurance that her infant child will not be ravished from her breast.</i>
seize	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one's right or possession. <i>The current President seized power in a coup.</i>
surety	Money given to support an undertaking that someone will perform a duty, pay their debts, etc.; a guarantee. <i>The surety of my impending fatherhood.</i>
violation	An act that disregards an agreement or a right. <i>The aircraft were in violation of UN resolutions.</i>
