## Associations of "Abducted" (30 Words)

abduction	The action of forcibly taking someone away against their will. The man is also accused of the attempted <b>abduction</b> of another youngster.
abductor	A person who abducts another person. <i>Abductor pollicis</i> .
arrogate	Take or claim (something) without justification. They <b>arrogate</b> to themselves the ability to divine the nation s true interests.
assault	Make a physical attack on. The mugger <b>assault</b> ed the woman.
<u>bail</u>	Empty a vessel by bailing. His son called home to get <b>bail</b> ed out of jail.
<u>buccaneer</u>	Live like a buccaneer. The company might be a target for an individual <b>buccaneer</b> seeking power and prestige.
child	An immature childish person. She writes books for <b>child</b> ren.
<u>commandeer</u>	Take possession of (something) by force. The truck was <b>commandeer</b> ed by a mob.
<u>crime</u>	Illegal activities. They condemned apartheid as a <b>crime</b> against humanity.
<u>crisis</u>	The turning point of a disease when an important change takes place, indicating either recovery or death. <i>He goes to pieces in a crisis.</i>
enslavement	The state of being a slave-Shakespeare. The <b>enslavement</b> of millions of Africans.
guarantor	A person or organization that provides a guarantee. <i>The role of the police as <b>guarantor</b>s of public order.</i>



<u>hijack</u>	An incident or act of hijacking. An unsuccessful <b>hijack</b> attempt.
hijacker	A person who illegally seizes an aircraft, ship, or vehicle while in transit and forces it to go to a different destination or uses it for their own purposes. <i>The hijackers of this government ignore all but their own agenda.</i>
hostage	A prisoner who is held by one party to insure that another party will meet specified terms. Three <b>hostage</b> s were released but only after their families paid an estimated 200 000 to the guerrillas.
illegitimate	The illegitimate offspring of unmarried parents. Defending workers against <b>illegitimate</b> managerial practices.
jail	Put someone in jail. The driver was <b>jail</b> ed for two years.
<u>kidnap</u>	The action of kidnapping someone. Militants <b>kidnap</b> ped the daughter of a minister.
kidnapping	The action of abducting someone and holding them captive. A new wave of <b>kidnapping</b> s and murders.
lascivious	Driven by lust; preoccupied with or exhibiting lustful desires. <i>He gave her a <b>lascivious</b> wink.</i>
maltreat	Treat (a person or animal) cruelly or with violence. Children die from neglect or are <b>maltreat</b> ed by their carers.
<u>pirate</u>	A ship that is manned by pirates. The company is seeking compensation from people who <b>pirate</b> d the movie.
ransom	Release a captive after receiving a ransom. The lord was captured in war and had to be <b>ransom</b> ed.
ravish	Hold spellbound. There is no assurance that her infant child will not be <b>ravish</b> ed from her breast.
seize	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one s right or possession. The current President <b>seize</b> d power in a coup.
surety	Money given to support an undertaking that someone will perform a duty, pay their debts, etc.; a guarantee. The <b>surety</b> of my impending fatherhood.
<u>violation</u>	An act that disregards an agreement or a right. The aircraft were in <b>violation</b> of UN resolutions.
