| dwelling | Housing that someone is living in. <i>He built a modest dwelling near the pond.</i> |
| dwelling house | Housing that someone is living in. |

| habitat | A person's usual or preferred surroundings. <i>A marine habitat.</i> |
| habitation | Housing that someone is living in. <i>Signs of human habitation.</i> |
| home | Base consisting of a rubber slab where the batter stands; it must be touched by a base runner in order to score. <i>They have made Provence their home.</i> |
| house | The people living in a house a household. <i>A house of Cotswold stone.</i> |
| place of habitation | Any area set aside for a particular purpose. |
| place of residence | A general vicinity. |
| residence | A large and imposing house. <i>She took up residence in Paris.</i> |
| seat | A center of authority (as a city from which authority is exercised). <i>He was elected to a seat in the Senate.</i> |

- address** Address or apply oneself to something direct one's efforts towards something such as a question.
*He failed in his manner of **address** to the captain.*
- addressee** One to whom something is addressed.
*The need to state clearly the **addressees** of reports.*
- cottage** Perform homosexual acts in a public toilet.
*Farm **cottages**.*
- deliver** Deliver a speech oration or idea.
*The court was due to **deliver** its verdict.*
- destination** The ultimate goal for which something is done.
*He was nearly exhausted as their **destination** came into view.*

| dwelling | A house, flat, or other place of residence. <i>The proposed dwelling is out of keeping with those nearby.</i> |
| email | A message sent by email. <i>Email messages.</i> |
| gambit | A maneuver in a game or conversation. <i>He tried the dubious Budapest gambit.</i> |
| grotto | A small cave (usually with attractive features). <i>Visits to Father Christmas s grotto.</i> |
| habitable | Suitable or good enough to live in. <i>The house should be habitable by Christmas.</i> |
| habitat | The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>Wild chimps in their natural habitat.</i> |
| habitation | Housing that someone is living in. <i>He studied the creation and inhabitation and demise of the colony.</i> |
| hall | A building or large room used for meetings, concerts, or other events. <i>He dined in hall.</i> |
| headed | (of certain green vegetables) having the edible leafy part at the top of the stem. <i>Headed notepaper.</i> |
| hermitage | The abode of a hermit. |
| home | Provide an animal with a home as a pet. <i>Low cost homes for first time buyers.</i> |
| homestead | Settle land given by the government and occupy it as a homestead. |
| mailing | The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The candidate sent out three large mailings.</i> |
| mansion | A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle Mansions.</i> |
| orate | Make a speech, especially pompously or at length. <i>Lend me your ears Fred orated.</i> |
| orator | A person who delivers a speech or oration. <i>A theatrically effective orator.</i> |
| postage | The sending of letters and parcels by post. <i>The prices include postage and packing.</i> |
