
Aboriginal as a Noun

According to the $\underline{Oxford\ Dictionary\ of\ English}$, "aboriginal" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Having existed from the beginning; in an earliest or original stage or state.
- $\bullet \ \, {\it Of or pertaining to members of the indigenous people of Australia}.$
- $\bullet \ \textit{Relating to the indigenous peoples of Australia or their languages}.$
- Characteristic of or relating to people inhabiting a region from the beginning.
- Inhabiting or existing in a land from the earliest times or from before the arrival of colonists; indigenous.


