- *Shorten (a piece of writing) without losing the sense.*

| <u>crop</u> | Yield crops. <i>She wanted her hair cropped short.</i> |

| cut short | Shorten as if by severing the edges or ends of. Shorten lines in a drawing so as to create an illusion of depth. |
| foreshorten | <i>Our experience is that it is usually a mistake to try to foreshorten the process.</i> |
| lessen | Decrease in size, extent, or range. <i>The years have lessened the gap in age between us.</i> |
| pare down | Remove the edges from and cut down to the desired size. |
| prune | Cultivate, tend, and cut back the growth of. |
| reduce | Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements. <i>The sauce should reduce to one cup.</i> |
| <u>shorten</u> | Make (a vowel or syllable) short. <i>The preceding vowels are shortened.</i> |
| trim | Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs. <i>The airplane trimmed.</i> |
| truncate | Replace (an edge or an angle) by a plane, typically so as to make equal angles with the adjacent faces. <i>The torso has been truncated just below the neck line.</i> |

- *Even the right to free speech can be abridged.*
- *The new law might abridge our freedom of expression.*
- *The introduction is abridged from the author's afterword to the novel.*

| condensation | The conversion of a vapour or gas to a liquid. <i>A readable condensation of the recent literature.</i> |
| <u>contraction</u> | A shortening or tensing of a part or organ (especially of a muscle or muscle fiber). <i>Neurons control the contraction of muscles.</i> |
| <u>curtail</u> | Deprive someone of (something). <i>Curtail drinking in school.</i> |
| decrement | A reduction or diminution. <i>Relaxation produces a decrement in sympathetic nervous activity.</i> |
| diminish | Decrease in size, extent, or range. <i>The trial has aged and diminished him.</i> |
| elision | Omission of a sound between two words (usually a vowel and the end of one word or the beginning of the next). <i>The movie s elisions and distortions have been carefully thought out.</i> |
| <u>encapsulate</u> | Enclose (something) in or as if in a capsule. <i>The company would encapsulate the asbestos waste in concrete pellets.</i> |
| expurgate | Edit by omitting or modifying parts considered indelicate. <i>Editors heavily expurgated the novel before its initial publication.</i> |
| haircut | The style in which a person's hair is cut. <i>He s always very particular about his haircut.</i> |
| outline | Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>Her eyes were darkly outlined with kohl.</i> |
| precis | Make a precis of a text or speech. |
| profile | Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>A profile of a Texas tycoon.</i> |
| reduce | Reduce in size reduce physically. <i>Reduce the influx of foreigners.</i> |

| resume | Take up or begin anew. <i>The judge resumed his seat.</i> |
| retrench | (of an organization or individual) reduce costs or spending in response to economic difficulty. <i>If there are excess staff they should be retrenched.</i> |
| <u>rundown</u> | An analysis or summary of something by a knowledgeable person. <i>A rundown in the business would be a devastating blow to the local economy.</i> |
| short | Of a vowel categorized as short with regard to quality and length e g in standard British English the vowel in good is short as distinct from the long vowel u in food. <i>He is short and tubby.</i> |
| <u>shorten</u> | Make shorter than originally intended; reduce or retrench in length or duration. <i>In winter the days shorten.</i> |
| <u>shrink</u> | Become withdrawn. <i>You should see a shrink.</i> |
| shrinkage | The amount by which something shrinks. <i>Give long curtains good hems to allow for shrinkage.</i> |
| <u>summarize</u> | Give a brief statement of the main points of (something). <i>To summarize there are three main categories.</i> |
| summary | A brief statement or account of the main points of something. <i>Summary justice.</i> |
| <u>synopsis</u> | An outline of the plot of a play, film, or book. <i>A synopsis of the insurance cover provided is set out below.</i> |
