Associations of "Absenteeism" (30 Words)

absence	The state of being away from a place or person. <i>Repeated absences from school.</i>
absentee	A person who is expected or required to be present at a place or event but is not. <i>An absentee from the match.</i>
academy	(in England) an inner-city school which is funded by the government and sometimes also by a private individual or organization but is not controlled by the local authority. <i>A police academy.</i>
attendance	The number of people present at a particular place or event. <i>Attendance was up by 50 per cent.</i>
campus	A field on which the buildings of a university are situated. <i>For the first year I had a room on campus.</i>
curriculum	An integrated course of academic studies. <i>Course components of the school curriculum.</i>
diploma	A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study.
educator	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional educator.</i>
enrol	Recruit (someone) to perform a service. <i>All entrants will be enrolled on new style courses.</i>
enrollment	The act of enrolling.
excessive	Beyond normal limits. <i>Excessive charges.</i>
grad	One-hundredth of a right angle.
graduation	An academic exercise in which diplomas are conferred. <i>The ruler had 16 graduations per inch.</i>

headmaster	A man who is the head teacher in a school.
homeroom	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. <i>The arms have been matriculated by the Lord Lyon King of Arms in Edinburgh.</i>
<u>morale</u>	A state of individual psychological well-being based upon a sense of confidence and usefulness and purpose. <i>The team s morale was high.</i>
out	An act of putting a player out. <i>The fire was nearly out.</i>
out-of-town	An administrative division of a county.
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.
pedagogy	The profession of a teacher. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language pedagogy.</i>
pupil	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. <i>They are former pupils of the school.</i>
<u>school</u>	Educate in or as if in a school. <i>School started at 7 a m.</i>
schoolmaster	Any person (or institution) who acts as an educator.
teach	A teacher. <i>She teaches me French.</i>
<u>teacher</u>	A person who teaches, especially in a school. <i>Experience is a demanding teacher.</i>
textbook	According to or characteristic of a casebook or textbook typical. <i>His economics textbook is in its tenth edition.</i>
<u>trainee</u>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i>
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>A group of Oxford undergraduates.</i>
valedictorian	The student with the best grades who usually delivers the valedictory address at commencement.
