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## Associations of "Absenteeism" (30 Words)

<a href="#">absence</a>	The state of being away from a place or person. <i>Repeated <b>absences</b> from school.</i>
<b>absentee</b>	A person who is expected or required to be present at a place or event but is not. <i>An <b>absentee</b> from the match.</i>
<a href="#">academy</a>	(in England) an inner-city school which is funded by the government and sometimes also by a private individual or organization but is not controlled by the local authority. <i>A police <b>academy</b>.</i>
<b>attendance</b>	The number of people present at a particular place or event. <i><b>Attendance</b> was up by 50 per cent.</i>
<a href="#">campus</a>	A field on which the buildings of a university are situated. <i>For the first year I had a room on <b>campus</b>.</i>
<b>curriculum</b>	An integrated course of academic studies. <i>Course components of the school <b>curriculum</b>.</i>
<b>diploma</b>	A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study.
<a href="#">educator</a>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional <b>educator</b>.</i>
<b>enrol</b>	Recruit (someone) to perform a service. <i>All entrants will be <b>enrolled</b> on new style courses.</i>
<a href="#">enrollment</a>	The act of enrolling.
<b>excessive</b>	Beyond normal limits. <i><b>Excessive</b> charges.</i>
<b>grad</b>	One-hundredth of a right angle.
<b>graduation</b>	An academic exercise in which diplomas are conferred. <i>The ruler had 16 <b>graduations</b> per inch.</i>

<b>headmaster</b>	A man who is the head teacher in a school.
<b>homeroom</b>	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
<b>matriculate</b>	A person who has matriculated. <i>The arms have been <b>matriculated</b> by the Lord Lyon King of Arms in Edinburgh.</i>
<b><u>morale</u></b>	A state of individual psychological well-being based upon a sense of confidence and usefulness and purpose. <i>The team s <b>morale</b> was high.</i>
<b>out</b>	An act of putting a player out. <i>The fire was nearly <b>out</b>.</i>
<b>out-of-town</b>	An administrative division of a county.
<b>pedagogics</b>	The principles and methods of instruction.
<b>pedagogy</b>	The profession of a teacher. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language <b>pedagogy</b>.</i>
<b>pupil</b>	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. <i>They are former <b>pupils</b> of the school.</i>
<b><u>school</u></b>	Educate in or as if in a school. <i><b>School</b> started at 7 a m.</i>
<b>schoolmaster</b>	Any person (or institution) who acts as an educator.
<b>teach</b>	A teacher. <i>She <b>teaches</b> me French.</i>
<b><u>teacher</u></b>	A person who teaches, especially in a school. <i>Experience is a demanding <b>teacher</b>.</i>
<b>textbook</b>	According to or characteristic of a casebook or textbook typical. <i>His economics <b>textbook</b> is in its tenth edition.</i>
<b><u>trainee</u></b>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>
<b>undergraduate</b>	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>A group of Oxford <b>undergraduates</b>.</i>
<b>valedictorian</b>	The student with the best grades who usually delivers the valedictory address at commencement.
