Definitions of "Abstention" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “abstention” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An instance of declining to vote for or against a proposal or motion.*
- *The trait of abstaining (especially from alcohol).*
- *Restraint in one's consumption; abstinence.*

Synonyms of "Abstention" as a noun (15 Words)

abstemiousness Restricted to bare necessities.

abstinence The practice of restraining oneself from indulging in something, typically alcohol or sex.

*I started drinking again after six years of **abstinence**.*

bachelorhood A man who has never been married.

celibacy The state of abstaining from marriage and sexual relations.
*A priest who had taken a vow of **celibacy**.*

chastity Morality with respect to sexual relations.
*Vows of **chastity**.*

continence	The exercise of self constraint in sexual matters. <i>You can improve your continence by strengthening the muscles of the pelvic floor.</i>
refusal to vote	The act of refusing.
self-denial	The trait of practicing self discipline.
self-restraint	Exhibiting restraint imposed on the self.
singleness	The quality of concentrating on one central objective. <i>The singleness of his motives could not be questioned.</i>
sobriety	The quality of being staid or solemn. <i>The price of beer compelled me to maintain a certain level of sobriety.</i>
spinsterhood	The state of being a spinster (usually an elderly unmarried woman).
teetotalism	Abstaining from alcohol.
temperance	The act of tempering. <i>The temperance movement.</i>
virginity	The condition or quality of being a virgin. <i>I lost my virginity.</i>

Usage Examples of "Abstention" as a noun

- *A resolution passed by 126 votes to none, with six abstentions.*
- *Alcohol consumption versus abstention.*

Associations of "Abstention" (30 Words)

abstain	Restrain oneself from doing or enjoying something. <i>Forty one voted with the Opposition and some sixty more abstained.</i>
ballot	Vote by ballot. <i>There were fifty three abstentions and twenty eight spoilt ballots.</i>
candidate	Someone who is considered for something (for an office or prize or honor etc). <i>She was the perfect candidate for a biography.</i>
choose	Pick out select or choose from a number of alternatives. <i>I ll stay as long as I choose.</i>
chosen	Having been selected as the best or most appropriate. <i>He is by no means a forerunner in his chosen field.</i>
cloture	Terminate debate by calling for a vote. <i>A cloture motion.</i>

done	Socially acceptable. <i>Therapy was not the done thing then.</i>
<u>elect</u>	Elected but not yet installed in office. <i>He was elected as councillor.</i>
election	A vote to select the winner of a position or political office. <i>The results of the election will be announced tonight.</i>
<u>elective</u>	An optional course of study. <i>He had never held elective office.</i>
elector	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered electors voted.</i>
electorate	The body of enfranchised citizens; those qualified to vote. <i>75 per cent of the electorate voted for a Scottish parliament in some form.</i>
favour	Resemble (a parent or other relative) in facial features. <i>Please favour me with an answer.</i>
gerrymander	An act of gerrymandering dividing a voting area so as to give your own party an unfair advantage. <i>An attempt to gerrymander the election result.</i>
hustings	A meeting at which candidates in an election address potential voters. <i>I was out on the hustings talking to people.</i>
incoming	Revenue; income. <i>Incoming mail.</i>
opt	Make a choice from a range of possibilities. <i>Consumers will opt for low priced goods.</i>
option	Buy or sell an option on. <i>She was given the option of resigning or being dismissed.</i>
<u>pick</u>	Attack with or as if with a pickaxe of ice or rocky ground for example. <i>Pick meat from a bone.</i>
<u>prefer</u>	Give preference to one creditor over another. <i>Some people prefer camping to staying in hotels.</i>
<u>president</u>	The head of a company. <i>The Irish president.</i>
presidential	Relating to a president or presidency. <i>Presidential advisers.</i>
reelect	Elect again.
referendum	A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.

select	Selected or chosen for special qualifications. <i>The commonest phenotype in a population can be selected against.</i>
selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>The publication of a selection of his poems.</i>
suffrage	Intercessory prayers, especially those for the dead. <i>Universal adult suffrage.</i>
vote	An act of giving or registering a vote. <i>Parliament has voted the money for the proposed expenditure.</i>
voter	A person who votes or has the right to vote at an election.
voting	A choice that is made by counting the number of people in favor of each alternative.
