In the US a member of the electoral college.

He was **elect**ed as councillor.

Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered **elector**s voted.

electorate The body of enfranchised citizens; those qualified to vote.

75 per cent of the **electorate** voted for a Scottish parliament in some form.

Resemble (a parent or other relative) in facial features.

Please **favour** me with an answer.

An act of gerrymandering dividing a voting area so as to give your own

gerrymander party an unfair advantage.

An attempt to **gerrymander** the election result.

hustingsA meeting at which candidates in an election address potential voters.

Revenue; income. *Incoming* mail.

Make a choice from a range of possibilities.

Consumers will **opt** for low priced goods.

option Buy or sell an option on.

She was given the **option** of resigning or being dismissed.

Attack with or as if with a pickaxe of ice or rocky ground for example.

Pick meat from a bone.

Give preference to one creditor over another.

Some people **prefer** camping to staying in hotels.

president The head of a company. The Irish **president**.

Relating to a president or presidency.

presidential Presidential advisers.

reelect Elect again.

referendum A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has

select Selected or chosen for special qualifications.

The commonest phenotype in a population can be **select**ed against.

selection A plot of land acquired by selection.

The publication of a **selection** of his poems.

Intercessory prayers, especially those for the dead.

Universal adult **suffrage**.

An act of giving or registering a vote.

Parliament has **vote**d the money for the proposed expenditure.

voter A person who votes or has the right to vote at an election.

voting A choice that is made by counting the number of people in favor of each
