Definitions of "Academy" as a noun

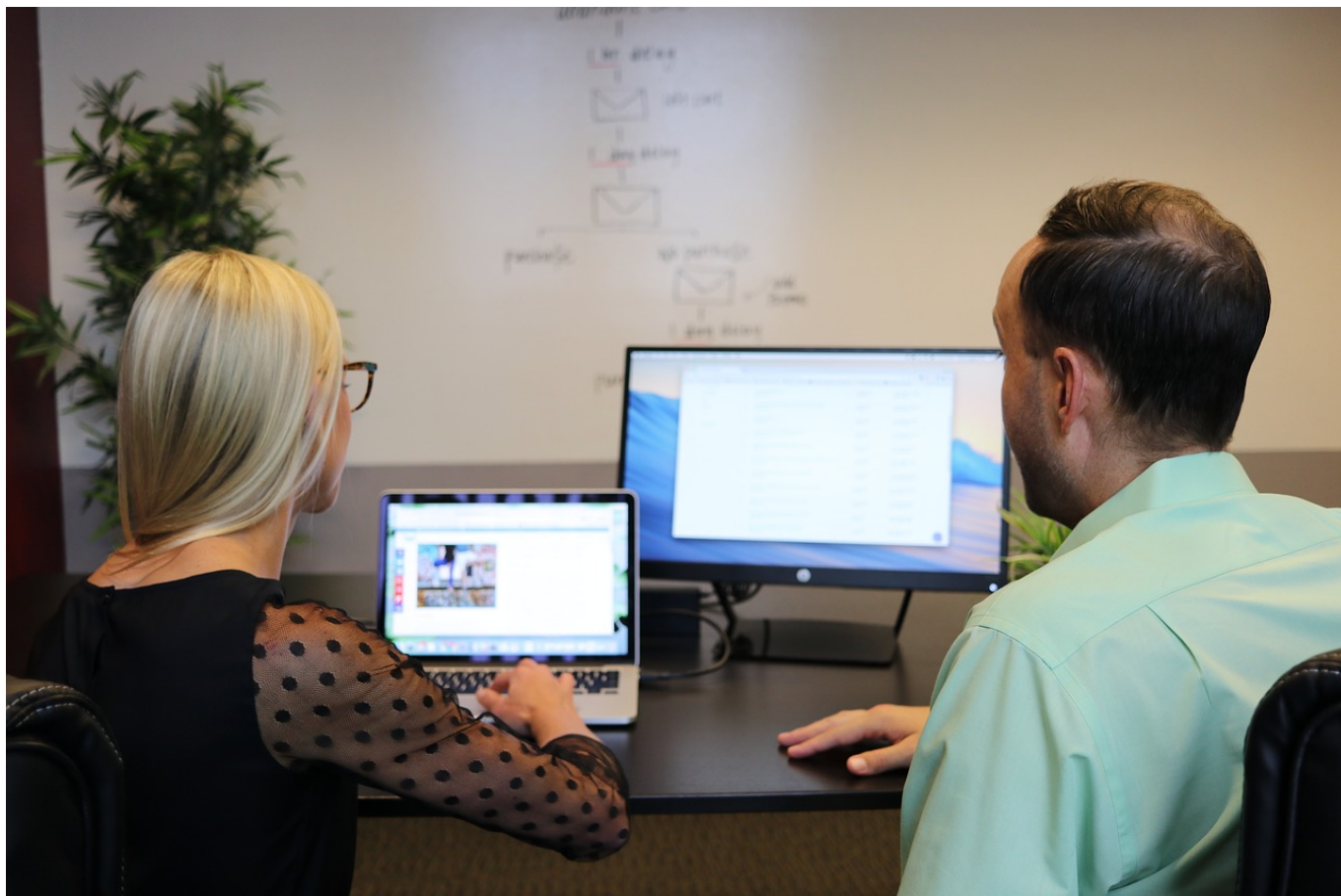
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “academy” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A place of study or training in a special field.*
- *The teaching school founded by Plato.*
- *A society or institution of distinguished scholars and artists or scientists that aims to promote and maintain standards in its particular field.*
- *A learned establishment for the advancement of knowledge.*
- *A school for special training.*
- *A secondary school, in the US typically a private one.*
- *A secondary school (usually private).*
- *A place of study.*
- *An institution for the advancement of art or science or literature.*
- *(in England) an inner-city school which is funded by the government and sometimes also by a private individual or organization but is not controlled by the local authority.*



Synonyms of "Academy" as a noun (7 Words)

centre	The object upon which interest and attention focuses. <i>A new centre party.</i>
centre of learning	The cognitive process of acquiring skill or knowledge.
establishment	A business organization, public institution, or household. <i>She became an establishment figure.</i>
foundation	The action of establishing an institution or organization. <i>Apply moisturizer a few minutes before using foundation.</i>
institution	An organization founded and united for a specific purpose. <i>The institution of marriage.</i>
organization	The act of forming or establishing something. <i>A research organization.</i>
training establishment	Activity leading to skilled behavior.

- *A police academy.*
- *Mark left St Andrews Academy with five highers, and studied maths at Glasgow University.*

absenteeism

Habitual absence from work.

*High levels of **absenteeism** caused by low job motivation.*

attendance

The act of being present (at a meeting or event etc.

*My **attendance** at church was very patchy.*

bursar

A student who holds a bursary.

campus

The grounds and buildings of a university or college.

*For the first year I had a room on **campus**.*

college

The body of faculty and students of a college.

***Colleges** of further education.*

diploma

A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study.

dorm

A dormitory.

<u>educate</u>	Create by training and teaching. <i>She was educated at a boarding school.</i>
<u>educator</u>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional educator.</i>
enrol	Recruit (someone) to perform a service. <i>He enrolled in drama school.</i>
<u>enrollment</u>	The act of enrolling.
grad	One-hundredth of a right angle.
graduation	The act of arranging in grades. <i>The ruler had 16 graduations per inch.</i>
headmaster	Presiding officer of a school.
homeroom	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. <i>The arms have been matriculated by the Lord Lyon King of Arms in Edinburgh.</i>
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.
pedagogy	The method and practice of teaching, especially as an academic subject or theoretical concept. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language pedagogy.</i>
polytechnic	An institution of higher education offering courses at degree level or below, especially in vocational subjects.
pupil	A person who is taught by another, especially a schoolchild or student in relation to a teacher. <i>They are former pupils of the school.</i>
<u>schooling</u>	The process of being formally educated at a school. <i>Schooling fences.</i>
schoolmaster	An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.
semester	One of two divisions of an academic year. <i>The opening week of Harvard's autumn semester.</i>
studying	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
teach	Work as a teacher. <i>He came one day each week to teach painting.</i>
teaching	The profession of a teacher. <i>I went into teaching because I like working with children.</i>

trainee

A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession.

***Trainee** solicitors.*

undergraduate

Denoting or relating to an undergraduate.

*A group of Oxford **undergraduates**.*

university

The body of faculty and students at a university.

*I went to **university** at the Sorbonne.*

valedictorian

The student with the best grades who usually delivers the valedictory address at commencement.
