## **Accented as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Accented" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “accented” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(used of syllables) bearing the principle stress, usually accompanied by a change in pitch.*
- *(of a word, syllable, or musical note or chord) stressed or emphasized.*
- *Spoken with or characterized by a particular accent.*
- *Bearing a stress or accent.*



### Synonyms of "Accented" as an adjective (2 Words)

**stressed** Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed.  
*Elision after a **stressed** syllable.*

**tonic** Relating to, denoting, or producing continuous muscular contraction.  
***Tonic** harmony.*



## Usage Examples of "Accented" as an adjective

- *He spoke in slightly accented English.*
- *A metrical foot consisting of two unaccented syllables followed by one accented syllable.*



## Associations of "Accented" (30 Words)

<b><u>accentuate</u></b>	Make more noticeable or prominent. <i>His jacket unfortunately <b>accentuated</b> his paunch.</i>
<b><u>dialect</u></b>	A particular version of a programming language. <i>It has been said that a language is a <b>dialect</b> with an army and navy.</i>
<b>diction</b>	The articulation of speech regarded from the point of view of its intelligibility to the audience. <i>Wordsworth campaigned against exaggerated poetic <b>diction</b>.</i>
<b>emphasize</b>	To stress, single out as important. <i>Dr Jones <b>emphasizes</b> exercise in addition to a change in diet.</i>
<b><u>emphatic</u></b>	An emphatic consonant. <i>An <b>emphatic</b> World Cup win.</i>
<b><u>emphatically</u></b>	In a forceful way. <i>Greg is <b>emphatically</b> not a slacker.</i>
<b>enunciation</b>	The articulation of speech regarded from the point of view of its intelligibility to the audience.
<b><u>grave</u></b>	A place where a broken or discarded object lies. <i>A mass <b>grave</b>.</i>
<b>highlight</b>	Create highlights in hair. <i>I ve had my hair <b>highlighted</b> regularly for the last ten years.</i>

<b>idiom</b>	The style of a particular artist or school or movement. <i>He had a feeling for phrase and <b>idiom</b>.</i>
<b>impersonate</b>	Pretend to be (another person) for entertainment or fraud. <i>It s a very serious offence to <b>impersonate</b> a police officer.</i>
<b>importance</b>	The state or fact of being of great significance or value. <i>The <b>importance</b> of a well balanced diet.</i>
<b><u>imprint</u></b>	A lasting effect. <i>Years in the colonies had left their <b>imprint</b>.</i>
<b>intension</b>	The internal content of a concept.
<b>intonation</b>	Singing by a soloist of the opening piece of plainsong. <i>She spoke English with a German <b>intonation</b>.</i>
<b>lilt</b>	Speak sing or sound with a lilt. <i>The music <b>lilted</b> and swaggered in a dance rhythm.</i>
<b>literal</b>	Free from exaggeration or distortion. <i>Fifteen years of <b>literal</b> hell.</i>
<b>overburden</b>	An excessive burden. <i>An <b>overburden</b> of costs.</i>
<b>pronunciation</b>	The manner in which someone utters a word. <i>Similar <b>pronunciations</b> are heard in Ulster.</i>
<b><u>spotlight</u></b>	Illuminate with a spotlight as in the theater. <i>She was constantly in the media <b>spotlight</b>.</i>
<b>strain</b>	Separate by passing through a sieve or other straining device to separate out coarser elements. <i>The distant <b>strains</b> of the brass band grew louder.</i>
<b>strength</b>	The number of people comprising a group, typically a team or army. <i>Cycling can help you build up your <b>strength</b>.</i>
<b>stress</b>	Put stress on utter with an accent. <i>This type of workout does <b>stress</b> the shoulder and knee joints.</i>
<b>stressed</b>	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>An iambic foot consists of an <b>unstressed</b> syllable followed by a <b>stressed</b> syllable as in delay.</i>
<b>tension</b>	A relationship between ideas or qualities with conflicting demands or implications. <i>The coup followed months of <b>tension</b> between the military and the government.</i>
<b><u>underline</u></b>	Give extra weight to (a communication). <i>The improvement in retail sales was <b>underlined</b> by these figures.</i>

- underscore** (on a computer or typewriter keyboard) a short horizontal line \_ on the baseline.  
*The company **underscored** the progress made with fuel cells.*
- verbiage** Excessively lengthy or technical speech or writing.  
*The basic idea here despite all the **verbiage** is simple.*
- voice** The melody carried by a particular voice or instrument in polyphonic music.  
*The passive **voice**.*
- wording** The manner in which something is expressed in words- G.S.Patton.  
*The standard form of **wording** for a consent letter.*
