<b>accent</b>	Put stress on utter with an accent. <i>The <b>accent</b> falls on the middle syllable.</i>
<b>dazzle</b>	To cause someone to lose clear vision, especially from intense light. <i>She was <b>dazzled</b> by the headlights.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>He looked <b>decidedly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b>dialect</b>	The usage or vocabulary that is characteristic of a specific group of people. <i>It has been said that a language is a <b>dialect</b> with an army and navy.</i>
<b>emphasis</b>	Special importance or significance. <i>They placed great <b>emphasis</b> on the individual s freedom.</i>
<b>emphasize</b>	To stress, single out as important. <i>Dr Jones <b>emphasizes</b> exercise in addition to a change in diet.</i>
<b>emphasized</b>	Spoken with emphasis.
<b>emphatic</b>	An emphatic consonant. <i>An <b>emphatic</b> movement of his hand.</i>
<b>emphatically</b>	In a forceful way. <i>Jane though born in California feels <b>emphatically</b> English.</i>
<b>floodlight</b>	The illumination provided by a floodlight. <i>We are <b>floodlighting</b> the building to highlight the structure.</i>
<b>foreground</b>	Move into the foreground to make more visible or prominent. <i>Sexual relationships are <b>foregrounded</b> and idealized.</i>
<b>grave</b>	Used as an allusive term for death. <i>Life beyond the <b>grave</b>.</i>
<b>highlight</b>	Mark with a highlighter. <i>He views that season as the <b>highlight</b> of his career.</i>

<b>illuminate</b>	Make free from confusion or ambiguity; make clear. <i>Placing the events of the 1930s in a broader historical context helps to <b>illuminate</b> their significance.</i>
<b>importance</b>	A prominent status. <i>An issue of great <b>importance</b>.</i>
<u><b>imprint</b></u>	An impression produced by pressure or printing. <i>We <b>imprint</b> our ideas onto our children.</i>
<b>intension</b>	What you must know in order to determine the reference of an expression.
<b>lilt</b>	Speak sing or sound with a lilt. <i>The <b>lilt</b> of the Hawaiian music.</i>
<b>limelight</b>	Intense white light obtained by heating lime, formerly used in theatres. <i>He enjoyed being in the <b>limelight</b>.</i>
<b>overburden</b>	The surface soil that must be moved away to get at coal seams and mineral deposits. <i>They were <b>overburdened</b> with luggage.</i>
<b>significance</b>	The extent to which a result deviates from that expected to arise simply from random variation or errors in sampling. <i>The <b>significance</b> of his remark became clear only later.</i>
<u><b>spotlight</b></u>	Illuminate with a spotlight. <i>The dancers are <b>spotlighted</b> from time to time throughout the evening.</i>
<b>strain</b>	Rub through a strainer or process in an electric blender. <i>The mental <b>strain</b> of staying alert hour after hour was too much for him.</i>
<b>strength</b>	The influence or power possessed by a person, organization, or country. <i>Many people find <b>strength</b> in religion.</i>
<b>stress</b>	The relative prominence of a syllable or musical note especially with regard to stress or pitch. <i>She endured the <b>stresses</b> and strains of life.</i>
<b>stressed</b>	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>An iambic foot consists of an <b>unstressed</b> syllable followed by a <b>stressed</b> syllable as in delay.</i>
<u><b>tend</b></u>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>She <b>tends</b> to the children.</i>
<b>tension</b>	The state of being stretched tight. <i>There is a <b>tension</b> created between narrative time and movie time.</i>
<u><b>underline</b></u>	Emphasize (something). <i>Certain phrases had been <b>underlined</b>.</i>

**underscore** A line drawn underneath (especially under written matter).  
*The company **underscored** the progress made with fuel cells.*
