## **Accordance as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Accordance" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “accordance” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Concurrence of opinion.*
- *The act of granting rights.*
- *Conformity or agreement.*



## Synonyms of "Accordance" as a noun (3 Words)

### accord

An official agreement or treaty.  
*Opposition groups refused to sign the **accord**.*

**accordance of rights** Concurrence of opinion.

### conformity

Similarity in form or type; agreement in character.  
*These changes are intended to ensure **conformity** between all schemes.*



### **Usage Examples of "Accordance" as a noun**

- *There is good accordance between the values.*
- *The accordance to Canada of rights of access.*



## Associations of "Accordance" (30 Words)

- abidance** The act of abiding (enduring without yielding).
- accede** Assume an office or position.  
*By now John had died and Henry III had **acceded**.*
- acclimate** Get used to a certain climate.  
*This should help new students **acclimate** to college life.*
- accord** Harmony of people's opinions or actions or characters.  
*The government and the rebels are in **accord** on one point.*
- adapt** Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.  
*A large organization can be slow to **adapt** to change.*
- agree** Reach agreement about something after negotiation.  
*The two stories don't **agree** in many details.*

<b>agreed</b>	United by being of the same opinion. <i>The <b>agreed</b> date.</i>
<b>agreement</b>	The absence of incompatibility between two things; consistency. <i>The two parties were in <b>agreement</b>.</i>
<b>coincide</b>	Occur at the same time. <i>The two long distance walks briefly <b>coincide</b> here.</i>
<b>compliance</b>	The property of a material of undergoing elastic deformation or (of a gas) change in volume when subjected to an applied force. It is equal to the reciprocal of stiffness. <i>All imports of timber are in <b>compliance</b> with regulations.</i>
<b>comply</b>	Act in accordance with someone's rules, commands, or wishes. <i>You must <b>comply</b> or else.</i>
<b>conform</b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The pressure to <b>conform</b>.</i>
<b>conformance</b>	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i><b>Conformance</b> to international standards.</i>
<b>conforming</b>	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
<b>conformity</b>	Compliance with standards, rules, or laws. <i>Their financial statements are in <b>conformity</b> with generally accepted accounting practices.</i>
<b>consent</b>	Permission to do something. <i>No change may be made without the <b>consent</b> of all the partners.</i>
<b>correspond</b>	Exchange messages. <i>The carved heads described in the poem <b>correspond</b> to a drawing of Edgcote House.</i>
<b>equity</b>	The difference between the market value of a property and the claims held against it. <i>People who have built up a significant amount of <b>equity</b> in their homes.</i>
<b>exact</b>	Not approximated in any way; precise. <i>An <b>exact</b> copy.</i>
<b>exactly</b>	Used as a reply to confirm or agree with what has just been said. <i>They met in 1989 and got married <b>exactly</b> two years later.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired. <i>Laughing <b>fit</b> to burst.</i>
<b>homogeneity</b>	The quality or state of being all the same or all of the same kind. <i>There is a remarkable <b>homogeneity</b> between the two companies.</i>

<b>observance</b>	The action of watching or noticing something. <i>Official anniversary <b>observances</b>.</i>
<b>painstakingly</b>	In a fastidious and painstaking manner. <i>The property has been <b>painstakingly</b> restored by its current owners.</i>
<b>pedantic</b>	Excessively concerned with minor details or rules; overscrupulous. <i>His analyses are careful and even painstaking but never <b>pedantic</b>.</i>
<b>respectively</b>	In the order given. <i>The brothers were called Felix and Max <b>respectively</b>.</i>
<b>same</b>	Similarly in the same way. <i>The <b>same</b> number.</i>
<b>socialization</b>	The process of learning to behave in a way that is acceptable to society. <i>The <b>socialization</b> of medical services.</i>
<b>strict</b>	Characterized by strictness severity or restraint. <i>A <b>strict</b> interpretation of the law.</i>
<b>uniformity</b>	A condition in which everything is regular and unvarying. <i>An attempt to impose administrative and cultural <b>uniformity</b>.</i>
