Usage Examples of "Accountable" as an adjective

- The delayed introduction of characters' names is accountable, if we consider that names have a low priority.
- $\bullet \ Parents \ cannot \ be \ held \ accountable \ for \ their \ children's \ actions.$
- Fully accountable for what they did.
- Ministers are accountable to Parliament.
- Governments must be accountable to someone beside themselves.
