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## Associations of "Accreditation" (30 Words)

<b>accepted</b>	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>Several <b>accepted</b> techniques for treating the condition.</i>
<b>accuracy</b>	The quality or state of being correct or precise. <i>We have confidence in the <b>accuracy</b> of the statistics.</i>
<b>acknowledge</b>	Accept as legally binding and valid. <i>The art world has begun to <b>acknowledge</b> his genius.</i>
<b>assurance</b>	A binding commitment to do or give or refrain from something. <i>She drove with <b>assurance</b>.</i>
<b>believe</b>	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. <i>There are those on the fringes of the Church who do not really <b>believe</b>.</i>
<b>cognitive</b>	Relating to cognition. <i>The <b>cognitive</b> processes involved in reading.</i>
<b>confidence</b>	A trustful relationship. <i>The girls exchanged <b>confidences</b> about their parents.</i>
<b><u>credible</u></b>	(a common but incorrect usage where `credulous' would be appropriate) credulous. <i>She was not the <b>credible</b> fool he expected.</i>
<b>dependable</b>	Financially sound. <i>A <b>dependable</b> supply of cold beer.</i>
<b>enlighten</b>	Shed light on (an object). <i>The sun <b>enlightened</b> some such clouds near him.</i>
<b>established</b>	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. <i>An <b>established</b> precedent.</i>
<b>formally</b>	In a formal manner. <i>The club will be <b>formally</b> recognized.</i>
<b>identifiable</b>	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>

<b>indubitable</b>	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
<b>informed</b>	(of a decision or judgement) based on an understanding of the facts of the situation. <i>An <b>informed</b> public.</i>
<b>know</b>	The fact of being aware of information that is known to few people. <i>You are convinced you <b>know</b> your own baby from any other in the world.</i>
<b>known</b>	(of a quantity or variable) having a value that can be stated. <i>The <b>known</b> world.</i>
<b>officially</b>	In a formal and public way. <i>On June 24 the election campaign will <b>officially</b> begin.</i>
<b>perceivable</b>	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i><b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.</i>
<b>proven</b>	Demonstrated by evidence or argument to be true or existing. <i>A <b>proven</b> ability to work hard.</i>
<b>realization</b>	The way in which a particular linguistic feature is used in speech or writing on a particular occasion. <i><b>Realization</b> dawned suddenly.</i>
<b>realize</b>	Cause to happen. <i>It is only now that she is beginning to <b>realize</b> her potential.</i>
<b>recognize</b>	Detect with the senses. <i>Countries which <b>recognized</b> East Germany.</i>
<b>recognized</b>	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>A <b>recognized</b> authority.</i>
<b>reliable</b>	A reliable person or thing. <i>A <b>reliable</b> source of information.</i>
<b>sentient</b>	Consciously perceiving- W.A.White. <i>The living knew themselves just <b>sentient</b> puppets on God's stage.</i>
<b>tested</b>	Tested and proved useful or correct. <i>A <b>tested</b> method.</i>
<b>trust</b>	An organization or company managed by trustees. <i>All persons are forbid to <b>trust</b> sailors.</i>
<b>trustworthy</b>	Worthy of trust or belief. <i>An experienced and <b>trustworthy</b> traveling companion.</i>
<b>understandable</b>	To be expected; natural, reasonable, or forgivable. <i>Though his accent was strange the words were perfectly <b>understandable</b>.</i>
