accepted	Generally approved or compelling recognition. Several <i>accepted</i> techniques for treating the condition.
accuracy	The quality or state of being correct or precise. We have confidence in the accuracy of the statistics.
acknowledge	Accept as legally binding and valid. The art world has begun to acknowledge his genius.
assurance	A binding commitment to do or give or refrain from something. <i>She drove with assurance</i> .
believe	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. There are those on the fringes of the Church who do not really believe .
cognitive	Relating to cognition. The cognitive processes involved in reading.
confidence	A trustful relationship. The girls exchanged confidence s about their parents.
<u>credible</u>	(a common but incorrect usage where `credulous' would be appropriate) credulous. <i>She was not the credible fool he expected.</i>
dependable	Financially sound. A dependable supply of cold beer.
enlighten	Shed light on (an object. The sun enlighten ed some such clouds near him.
established	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. An established precedent.
formally	In a formal manner. The club will be formally recognized.
identifiable	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.



indubitable	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. An indubitable truth.
informed	(of a decision or judgement) based on an understanding of the facts of the situation. An informed public.
know	The fact of being aware of information that is known to few people. You are convinced you know your own baby from any other in the world.
known	(of a quantity or variable) having a value that can be stated. <i>The known world</i> .
officially	In a formal and public way. On June 24 the election campaign will officially begin.
perceivable	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. Perceivable through the mist.
<u>proven</u>	Demonstrated by evidence or argument to be true or existing. A proven ability to work hard.
realization	The way in which a particular linguistic feature is used in speech or writing on a particular occasion. <i>Realization dawned suddenly.</i>
realize	Cause to happen. It is only now that she is beginning to realize her potential.
recognize	Detect with the senses. Countries which recognize d East Germany.
recognized	Generally approved or compelling recognition. A recognized authority.
reliable	A reliable person or thing. A reliable source of information.
<u>sentient</u>	Consciously perceiving- W.A.White. The living knew themselves just sentient puppets on God s stage.
tested	Tested and proved useful or correct. A tested method.
trust	An organization or company managed by trustees. All persons are forbid to trust sailors.
<u>trustworthy</u>	Worthy of trust or belief. An experienced and trustworthy traveling companion.
understandable	To be expected; natural, reasonable, or forgivable. Though his accent was strange the words were perfectly understandable .
