Definitions of "Achievable" as an adjective

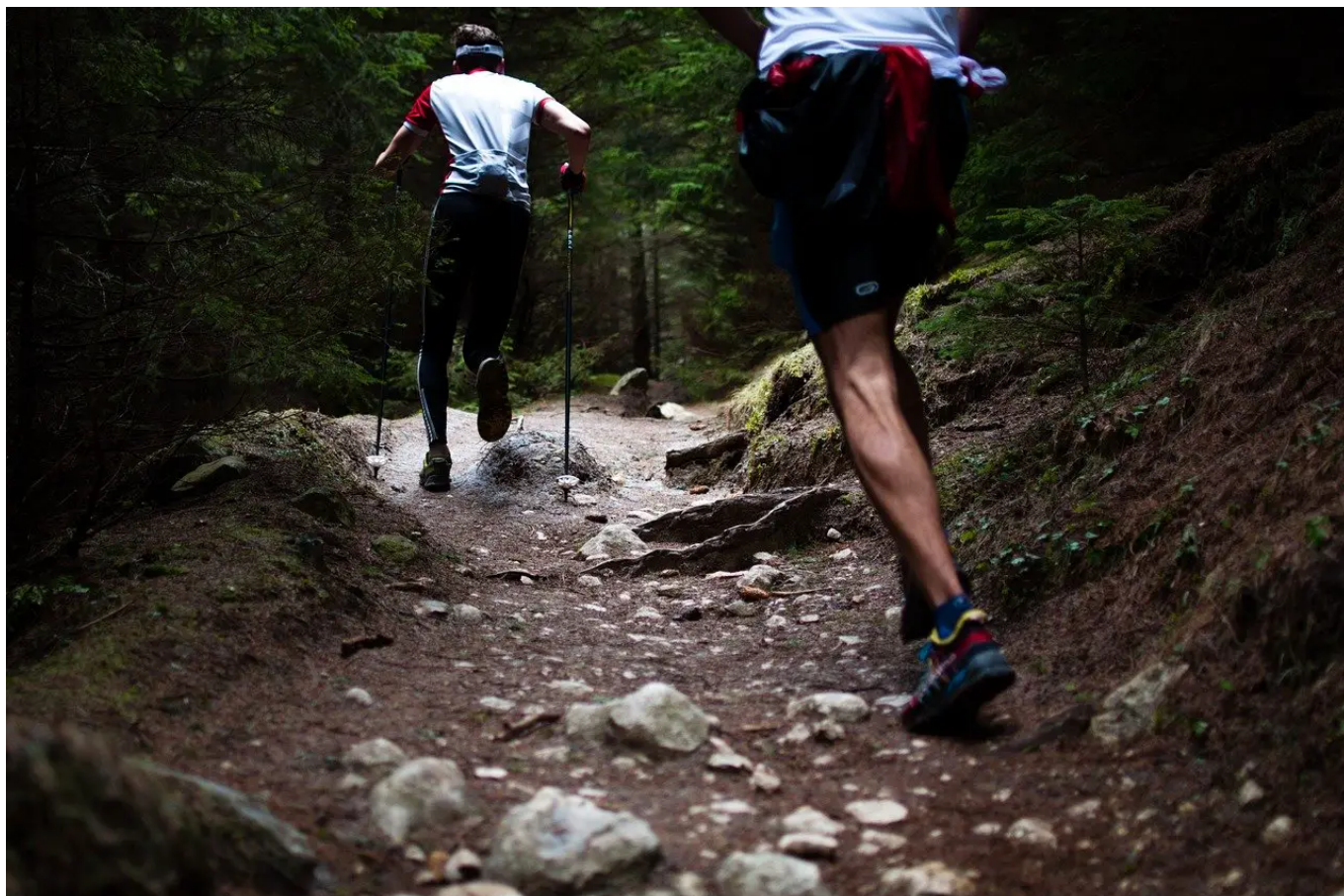
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “achievable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Able to be brought about or reached successfully.*
- *Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do.*



Synonyms of "Achievable" as an adjective (4 Words)

accomplishable	Able to be achieved or completed successfully. <i>We will have to negotiate and see what is accomplishable.</i>
doable	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>None of the jobs were fun but they were doable.</i>
<u>manageable</u>	Capable of being managed or controlled. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and manageable.</i>
realizable	Able to be achieved or made to happen. <i>The need to define realizable targets.</i>



Usage Examples of "Achievable" as an adjective

- *It was an ambitious goal, but it seemed achievable.*
- *He broke the climb into small, achievable stages.*



Associations of "Achievable" (30 Words)

accomplish	To gain with effort. <i>The planes accomplished their mission.</i>
accomplished	Highly trained or skilled in a particular activity. <i>That smoking causes health problems is an accomplished fact.</i>
accomplishment	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>A poet of considerable accomplishment.</i>
achievement	The action of accomplishing something. <i>Assessing ability in terms of academic achievement.</i>
acquire	Gain through experience. <i>He acquired a reputation for scrupulous honesty.</i>
acquirement	Something acquired, typically a skill. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i>

acquisition	The learning or developing of a skill, habit, or quality. <i>A recent acquisition by the museum.</i>
arrive	Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>She arrived home at 7 o'clock.</i>
attain	Succeed in achieving (something that one has worked for). <i>Clarify your objectives and ways of attaining them.</i>
attainment	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>He spoke of the low educational attainments of his workforce.</i>
blowout	An outburst of anger or an argument. <i>The purpose of the blowout is to motivate new customers to visit.</i>
clinch	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>The nails were clinched.</i>
competition	Interaction between animal or plant species, or individual organisms, that are attempting to gain a share of a limited environmental resource. <i>I walked round to check out the competition.</i>
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>The dollars can be placed on deposit and earn interest.</i>
feat	A notable achievement. <i>The new printing presses were considerable feats of engineering.</i>
gain	Reach a destination, either real or abstract. <i>An amplifier of high gain.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>I just don't get him.</i>
goal	An instance of sending the ball into or over the goal especially as a unit of scoring in a game. <i>We won by three goals to two.</i>
jubilant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
jubilation	The utterance of sounds expressing great joy. <i>Unbelievable scenes of jubilation.</i>
procure	Arrange for sexual partners for others. <i>Food procured for the rebels.</i>
purchase	Something acquired by purchase. <i>The horse's hooves fought for purchase on the slippery pavement.</i>
reach	Reach a point in time or a certain state or level. <i>Goodbye she said as they reached the door.</i>

succeed

Become the new rightful holder of an office, title, or property.
*We **succeeded** in getting tickets to the show.*

success

An attainment that is successful.
*His **success** in the marathon was unexpected.*

taking

The action or process of taking something.
*Clothing could be had for the **taking**.*

triumph

A highly successful example of something.
*Here it is Helen's voice rose in **triumph**.*

triumphant

Experiencing triumph.
*A **triumphant** shout.*

victory

An act of defeating an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition.
*They won their heat and went on to **victory** in the final.*

win

Be the winner in a contest or competition be victorious.
*The government is **winning** the battle against inflation.*
