pretension A claim or aspiration to a particular quality.

Institute legal proceedings in respect of (a claim or offence.

They were **prosecute**d for obstructing the highway.

reluctantly In an unwilling and hesitant way.

He **reluctantly** agrees to do his duty.

smatter Speak with spotty or superficial knowledge.
