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## Associations of "Acted" (30 Words)

<b>assigned</b>	Appointed to a post or duty. <i><b>Assigned</b> personnel.</i>
<b>attitude</b>	A position of the body indicating a particular mental state. <i>The actor struck just the right <b>attitude</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>behave</u></a>	Behave in a certain manner show a certain behavior conduct or comport oneself. <i>Each car <b>behaves</b> differently.</i>
<b>behavioral</b>	Of or relating to behavior. <i><b>Behavioral</b> sciences.</i>
<b>behaviour</b>	The way in which an animal or person behaves in response to a particular situation or stimulus. <i><b>Behaviour</b> patterns.</i>
<b>comport</b>	Behave well or properly. <i>Articulate students who <b>comported</b> themselves well in interviews.</i>
<b>conduct</b>	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>Surveys <b>conducted</b> among students.</i>
<b>conscious</b>	(followed by `of') showing realization or recognition of something. <i>A <b>conscious</b> effort to walk properly.</i>
<b>deed</b>	Convey or transfer property or rights by legal deed. <i>Mortgage <b>deeds</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>demeanor</u></a>	(behavioral attributes) the way a person behaves toward other people.
<b>dissemble</b>	Conceal or disguise one's true feelings or beliefs. <i>An honest sincere person with no need to <b>dissemble</b>.</i>
<b>do</b>	Get something done. <i>Joe was <b>doing</b> sums aloud.</i>
<a href="#"><u>equipped</u></a>	Provided or fitted out with what is necessary or useful or appropriate. <i><b>Equipped</b> for service in the Arctic.</i>

<b>ethology</b>	The branch of zoology that studies the behavior of animals in their natural habitats.
<b>inclined</b>	Leaning or turning away from the vertical or horizontal; sloping. An <b>inclined</b> ramp.
<b><u>inconsiderate</u></b>	Lacking regard for the rights or feelings of others. Slovenly <b>inconsiderate</b> reasoning.
<b>moralistic</b>	Narrowly and conventionally moral. A <b>moralistic</b> stance on advertising.
<b>participation</b>	The condition of sharing in common with others (as fellows or partners etc). <b>Participation</b> in chapel activities.
<b>prepared</b>	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <b>Prepared</b> to take risks.
<b><u>pretend</u></b>	Represent fictitiously as in a play or pretend to be or act like. The children poured out <b>pretend</b> tea for the dolls.
<b>pretension</b>	A claim or aspiration to a particular quality. His <b>pretensions</b> to the imperial inheritance.
<b><u>prosecute</u></b>	Institute legal proceedings in respect of (a claim or offence). They were <b>prosecuted</b> for obstructing the highway.
<b>reluctantly</b>	In an unwilling and hesitant way. He <b>reluctantly</b> agrees to do his duty.
<b>smatter</b>	Speak with spotty or superficial knowledge. She <b>smatters</b> Russian.
<b>standby</b>	The state of waiting to secure an unreserved place for a journey or performance, allocated on the basis of earliest availability. <b>Standbys</b> are allowed to board when all the passengers with confirmed reservations are seated.
<b>unforced</b>	Not compelled or constrained. An <b>unforced</b> cheerfulness.
<b>volitional</b>	Relating to the use of one's will. A <b>volitional</b> act.
<b><u>voluntary</u></b>	A person who freely enlists for service. <b>Voluntary</b> manslaughter.
<b>willful</b>	Done by design. <b>Willful</b> disobedience.
<b><u>willing</u></b>	Not brought about by coercion or force. <b>Willing</b> and prompt obedience.
