- behavior** Behavioral attributes the way a person behaves toward other people.
*The **behavior** of small particles can be studied in experiments.*
- chant** The style of music consisting of chants.
*Gregorian **chant**.*
- demonstration** A show or display; the act of presenting something to sight or view.
*Acts of faith are not capable of mathematical **demonstration**.*

| insurgence | An act of rising in active revolt. <i>The sudden insurgence in munitions funding.</i> |
| <u>liberal</u> | Tolerant of change; not bound by authoritarianism, orthodoxy, or tradition. <i>Liberal amounts of wine had been consumed.</i> |
| matriarchy | The state of being an older, powerful woman in a family or group. <i>She cherished a dream of matriarchy catered to by grandchildren.</i> |
| <u>militant</u> | A militant reformer. <i>Militants became increasingly impatient of parliamentary manoeuvres.</i> |
| misogynist | Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A misogynist attitude.</i> |
| movement | A campaign undertaken by a political social or artistic movement. <i>It was an expensive watch with a diamond movement.</i> |
| opponent | Characterized by active hostility. <i>Opponent or opposing armies.</i> |
| <u>pacifist</u> | A person who believes that war and violence are unjustifiable. <i>She was a committed pacifist all her life.</i> |
| <u>protest</u> | Write or obtain a protest in regard to a bill. <i>He shouted his protests at the umpire.</i> |
