- antagonist** A substance which interferes with or inhibits the physiological action of another.

- behavior** Behavioral attributes the way a person behaves toward other people.
*The **behavior** of small particles can be studied in experiments.*
- chant** The style of music consisting of chants.
*Gregorian **chant**.*
- demonstration** A show or display; the act of presenting something to sight or view.
*Acts of faith are not capable of mathematical **demonstration**.*

demonstrator	A participant in a public protest meeting or march. <i>The demonstrators arrived and launched into a two hour sales pitch.</i>
<u>drastic</u>	Forceful and extreme and rigorous. <i>Drastic measures.</i>
<u>extremist</u>	A person who holds extreme political or religious views, especially one who advocates illegal, violent, or other extreme action. <i>Right wing extremists.</i>
female	Relating to women or the female gender. <i>Female sensitiveness.</i>
feminism	A doctrine that advocates equal rights for women.
<u>feminist</u>	Relating to or supporting feminism. <i>Feminist literature.</i>
<u>girl</u>	A person's girlfriend. <i>A chorus girl.</i>
ideology	Visionary speculation, especially of an unrealistic or idealistic nature. <i>The ideology of republicanism.</i>
instigation	Deliberate and intentional triggering (of trouble or discord). <i>The Domesday Survey was compiled at the instigation of William I.</i>
insurgence	An act of rising in active revolt. <i>The sudden insurgence in munitions funding.</i>
<u>liberal</u>	Tolerant of change; not bound by authoritarianism, orthodoxy, or tradition. <i>Liberal amounts of wine had been consumed.</i>
matriarchy	The state of being an older, powerful woman in a family or group. <i>She cherished a dream of matriarchy catered to by grandchildren.</i>
<u>militant</u>	A militant reformer. <i>Militants became increasingly impatient of parliamentary manoeuvres.</i>
misogynist	Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A misogynist attitude.</i>
movement	A campaign undertaken by a political social or artistic movement. <i>It was an expensive watch with a diamond movement.</i>
opponent	Characterized by active hostility. <i>Opponent or opposing armies.</i>
<u>pacifist</u>	A person who believes that war and violence are unjustifiable. <i>She was a committed pacifist all her life.</i>
<u>protest</u>	Write or obtain a protest in regard to a bill. <i>He shouted his protests at the umpire.</i>

radical	A radical sign. <i>Radical</i> opinions on education.
reformer	A disputant who advocates reform. A catalytic <i>reformer</i> .
revolutionary	A person who advocates or engages in political revolution. A <i>revolutionary</i> new drug.
sexist	A person with sexist views. A blatantly <i>sexist</i> remark.
suffragette	A woman advocate of women's right to vote (especially a militant advocate in the United Kingdom at the beginning of the 20th century).
suffragist	A person advocating that the right to vote be extended to more people, especially to women.
woman	A disrespectful form of address to a woman. A drawing of a young <i>woman</i> .
