artist	A person who creates paintings or drawings as a profession or hobby. <i>Rip off <b>artist</b>s.</i>
artiste	A public performer (a dancer or singer. <i>Cabaret <b>artiste</b>s.</i>
<u>doer</u>	A person who is admired because of their courage and toughness. I m a <b>doer</b> not a moaner.
histrion	An actor.
member of the cast	Anything that belongs to a set or class.
performer	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b></i> .
<u>player</u>	A person who pursues a number of different social and sexual partners simultaneously. A DVD <b>player</b> .
role player	The actions and activities assigned to or required or expected of a person or group.
theatrical	A professional actor or actress. A boarding house that catered for <b>theatrical</b> s.
thespian	A theatrical performer. An ageing <b>thespian</b> .
trouper	A person who is reliable and uncomplaining and hard working. An old <b>trouper</b> out for one last look at his adoring public.
worker	An employee, especially one who does manual or non-executive work. <i>He was a bogus <b>worker</b> of miracles.</i>

# Associations of "Actor" (30 Words)

<u>acting</u>	The art or occupation of performing fictional roles in plays, films, or television. The <b>acting</b> supervisor.
actress	A woman who behaves in a way that is not genuine. She is one of the great <b>actress</b> es of her generation.
amusing	Providing enjoyment; pleasantly entertaining. An <b>amusing</b> speaker.
audition	Perform an audition. The Royal Ballet gave Nicola an <b>audition</b> .
<u>bard</u>	Shakespeare. Our national <b>bard</b> Robert Burns.
biographer	A person who writes an account of someone's life. An important <b>biographer</b> of contemporary artists.
casting	The act of creating something by casting it in a mold. Bronze <b>casting</b> s.



comedian	A comic actor or playwright. A stand up <b>comedian</b> .
comedienne	A female comedian.
comic	A periodical containing comic strips intended chiefly for children. A <b>comic</b> al look of surprise.
composer	Someone who composes music as a profession. Mozart was her favourite <b>composer</b> .
dramatist	A person who writes plays.
entertainer	A person who tries to please or amuse. She is one of Hollywood s highest paid <b>entertainer</b> s.
film	Record in film. <i>He had already shot a whole roll of <b>film</b>.</i>
histrionic	An actor. A <b>histrionic</b> outburst.
humorous	Having or showing a sense of humour. <i>Humorous</i> stories.
lyricist	A person who writes the words to a popular song or musical.
minstrel	Celebrate by singing in the style of minstrels. The exaggerated dialect of blackface <b>minstrel</b> s.
<u>musician</u>	Someone who plays a musical instrument (as a profession. <i>Your father was a fine <b>musician</b>.</i>
novelist	A writer of novels.
pamphleteer	Write and issue political or controversial pamphlets. <i>The right to</i> <b>pamphleteer</b> <i>and post bills anonymously is as important today as it was three centuries ago.</i>
performer	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b></i> .
playwright	Someone who writes plays.
poet	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more <b>poet</b> than academic because of his gift for language.</i>
role	Normal or customary activity of a person in a particular social setting. <i>Play its role</i> .
<u>singer</u>	A person who sings, especially professionally. A pop <b>singer</b> .
<u>theater</u>	A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>



tragedian	An actor who specializes in tragic roles.
vaudeville	A satirical or topical song with a refrain. <i>His comedic roots are in <b>vaudeville</b>.</i>
<u>writer</u>	A device that writes data to a storage medium. A <b>writer</b> of short stories.
