- *Make a reality of.*
- *Represent or describe realistically.*



## Synonyms of "Actualize" as a verb (20 Words)

<b><u>accomplish</u></b>	To gain with effort. <i>Once this form has been <b>accomplished</b> the applicant needs to secure supporting documents.</i>
<b>achieve</b>	To gain with effort. <i>She <b>achieved</b> her goal despite setbacks.</i>
<b>actualise</b>	Make real or concrete; give reality or substance to.
<b>bring about</b>	Be accompanied by.
<b>bring off</b>	Bestow a quality on.
<b>bring to fruition</b>	Attract the attention of.
<b>carry out</b>	Sing or play against other voices or parts.

<b>carry through</b>	Support or hold in a certain manner.
<b>consummate</b>	Make (a marriage or relationship) complete by having sexual intercourse. <i>The property sale is <b>consummated</b>.</i>
<b>effect</b>	Produce. <i><b>Effect</b> a change.</i>
<b>execute</b>	Make (a legal instrument) valid by signing or sealing it. <i>The Mafioso who collaborated with the police was <b>executed</b>.</i>
<b>fulfil</b>	Fill, satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction. <i>Customers expect online orders to be <b>fulfilled</b> reliably quickly and cheaply.</i>
<b>make a reality</b>	Organize or be responsible for.
<b>make concrete</b>	Reach in time.
<b>make happen</b>	Gather and light the materials for.
<b>make real</b>	Proceed along a path.
<b>perform</b>	Carry out or perform an action. <i>The band will be <b>performing</b> live in Hyde Park.</i>
<b>realise</b>	Be fully aware or cognizant of.
<b>realize</b>	Be sold for. <i>He <b>realized</b> his mistake at once.</i>
<b>substantiate</b>	Solidify, firm, or strengthen. <i>The president's trip will <b>substantiate</b> good relations with the former enemy country.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Actualize" as a verb

- *He had actualized his dream and achieved the world record.*
