<b>agglomerate</b>	Form into one cluster. <i>He is seeking to <b>agglomerate</b> the functions of the Home Office.</i>
<b>amalgamate</b>	Joined together into a whole. <i>Numerous small British railway companies <b>amalgamated</b>.</i>
<b>amplification</b>	The action of making something more marked or intense. <i>Sequences were obtained from multiple <b>amplifications</b> from individual samples.</i>
<a href="#">annex</a>	An addition that extends a main building. <i>Hitler <b>annexed</b> Lithuania.</i>
<a href="#">coalesce</a>	Mix together different elements. <i>His idea served to <b>coalesce</b> all that happened into one connected whole.</i>
<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>Oxygen <b>combines</b> with haemoglobin.</i>
<a href="#">complement</a>	Make complete or perfect supply what is wanting or form the complement to. <i>A full <b>complement</b>.</i>
<a href="#">consolidate</a>	Unite into one. <i>The mud had <b>consolidated</b> overnight.</i>
<a href="#">enlarge</a>	Become larger or bigger. <i>She <b>enlarged</b> the flower beds.</i>
<b>enumeration</b>	A numbered list. <i>The complete <b>enumeration</b> of all possible genetic states.</i>
<b>expand</b>	Expand the influence of. <i>Their business <b>expanded</b> into other hotels.</i>
<a href="#">extension</a>	The ability of a dancer to raise one leg above their waist, especially to the side. <i>They hope to demolish the store and build a bar <b>extension</b>.</i>

<b>extra</b>	Excessive or extravagant. <i>An <b>extra</b> pair of shoes.</i>
<b>growing</b>	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The needs of the <b>growing</b> child.</i>
<b>increase</b>	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The university <b>increased</b> the number of students it admitted.</i>
<b>increasing</b>	Music increasing in tempo and or volume. <i>The <b>increasing</b> numbers of students.</i>
<b>increasingly</b>	Advancing in amount or intensity. <i>An <b>increasingly</b> difficult situation.</i>
<b>merge</b>	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>He crouched low and endeavoured to <b>merge</b> into the darkness of the forest.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b>pavilion</b>	A building at a cricket ground or other sports ground, used for changing and taking refreshments. <i>The form of alternating <b>pavilions</b> also allows the site to be developed in depth.</i>
<b>perpetuation</b>	The continuation or preservation of a situation, idea, etc. <i><b>Perpetuation</b> of the species is our purpose.</i>
<b>plus</b>	On the positive side or higher end of a scale. <i>Companies put losses at 500 000 <b>plus</b>.</i>
<b>progressively</b>	Advancing in amount or intensity. <i>Successive governments <b>progressively</b> increased expenditure on welfare.</i>
<b>prolongation</b>	Extension of the duration of something. <i>There was an indefinite <b>prolongation</b> of the peace talks.</i>
<b>propagation</b>	The spreading of something (a belief or practice) into new regions. <i><b>Propagation</b> techniques such as grafting.</i>
<b>specifier</b>	Someone who draws up specifications giving details (as for obtaining a patent).
<b>stretch</b>	Extend or stretch out to a greater or the full length. <i><b>Stretch</b> out that piece of cloth.</i>
<b>tinge</b>	A slight trace of a feeling or quality. <i>Towards the sun the sky was <b>tinged</b> crimson.</i>
