agglomerate	Form into one cluster. <i>He is seeking to agglomerate the functions of the Home Office.</i>
amalgamate	Joined together into a whole. <i>Numerous small British railway companies amalgamated.</i>
amplification	The action of making something more marked or intense. <i>Sequences were obtained from multiple amplifications from individual samples.</i>
annex	An addition that extends a main building. <i>Hitler annexed Lithuania.</i>
coalesce	Mix together different elements. <i>His idea served to coalesce all that happened into one connected whole.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>Oxygen combines with haemoglobin.</i>
complement	Make complete or perfect supply what is wanting or form the complement to. <i>A full complement.</i>
consolidate	Unite into one. <i>The mud had consolidated overnight.</i>
enlarge	Become larger or bigger. <i>She enlarged the flower beds.</i>
enumeration	A numbered list. <i>The complete enumeration of all possible genetic states.</i>
expand	Expand the influence of. <i>Their business expanded into other hotels.</i>
extension	The ability of a dancer to raise one leg above their waist, especially to the side. <i>They hope to demolish the store and build a bar extension.</i>

extra	Excessive or extravagant. <i>An extra pair of shoes.</i>
growing	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The needs of the growing child.</i>
increase	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The university increased the number of students it admitted.</i>
increasing	Music increasing in tempo and or volume. <i>The increasing numbers of students.</i>
increasingly	Advancing in amount or intensity. <i>An increasingly difficult situation.</i>
merge	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>He crouched low and endeavoured to merge into the darkness of the forest.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
pavilion	A building at a cricket ground or other sports ground, used for changing and taking refreshments. <i>The form of alternating pavilions also allows the site to be developed in depth.</i>
perpetuation	The continuation or preservation of a situation, idea, etc. <i>Perpetuation of the species is our purpose.</i>
plus	On the positive side or higher end of a scale. <i>Companies put losses at 500 000 plus.</i>
progressively	Advancing in amount or intensity. <i>Successive governments progressively increased expenditure on welfare.</i>
prolongation	Extension of the duration of something. <i>There was an indefinite prolongation of the peace talks.</i>
propagation	The spreading of something (a belief or practice) into new regions. <i>Propagation techniques such as grafting.</i>
specifier	Someone who draws up specifications giving details (as for obtaining a patent).
stretch	Extend or stretch out to a greater or the full length. <i>Stretch out that piece of cloth.</i>
tinge	A slight trace of a feeling or quality. <i>Towards the sun the sky was tinged crimson.</i>

unite

Be or become joined or united or linked.
*Lady Midlothian **united** herself to a man of bad character.*
