## Definitions of "Addendum" as a noun

- The radial distance from the pitch circle of a cogwheel or wormwheel to the crests of the teeth or ridges.
- Textual matter that is added onto a publication; usually at the end.

codicil	A supplement to a will; a testamentary instrument intended to alter an already executed will. Francis has remembered him in a <b>codicil</b> to this will.
postscript	An extra piece of information about an event that is added after it has happened. <i>He added a <b>postscript</b> Leaving tomorrow.</i>
rider	An addition or amendment to a bill at its third reading. <i>Two <b>rider</b>s approached the cottage.</i>
supplement	A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>Our special <b>supplement</b> is packed with ideas for healthy hair.</i>
tailpiece	Appendage added to extend the length of something. There was a <b>tailpiece</b> to the article.

<u>affix</u>	Attach or become attached to a stem word. Panels to which he <b>affix</b> es copies of fine old prints.
append	Fix to; attach. He <b>append</b> ed a glossary to his novel where he used an invented language.
bestow	Bestow a quality on. Stooping to <b>bestow</b> the presents into eager hands.
<u>cater</u>	Supply food ready to eat; for parties and banquets. <i>He cater</i> ed a lunch for 20 people.
codicil	An addition or supplement that explains, modifies, or revokes a will or part of one. <i>Francis has remembered him in a codicil to this will.</i>
credential	Provide with credentials. <i>His campaign has refused to <b>credential</b> any reporter from that outlet.</i>
credentials	A document attesting to the truth of certain stated facts.
cursive	Cursive writing. This style of writing began to compete with Gothic <b>cursive</b> .
dietary	Of or relating to the diet. <b>Dietary</b> restrictions.



<u>directory</u>	(computer science) a listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk.
<u>document</u>	Support or accompany with documentation. The photographer spent years <b>document</b> ing the lives of miners.
dramaturgy	The art of writing and producing plays. <i>Studies of Shakespeare s <b>dramaturgy</b>.</i>
email	A message sent by email. A contract communicated by <b>email</b> .
<u>furnish</u>	Supply someone with (something); give (something) to someone. The proprietor has <b>furnish</b> ed the bedrooms in a variety of styles.
grocer	A retail merchant who sells foodstuffs (and some household supplies.
letter	An emblem in the shape of the initial letter of a school or university s name awarded to a student for achievement in sport. <i>He numbered and lettered the paragraphs.</i>
manuscript	The form of a literary work submitted for publication. Several <b>manuscript</b> s in his own hand.
<u>nutrition</u>	The branch of science that deals with nutrients and nutrition particularly in humans. A feeding tube gives her <b>nutrition</b> and water.
page	Look through the pages of a book magazine etc. A text file reader enables you to <b>page</b> through the authors text file using indexes.
postscript	Textual matter that is added onto a publication; usually at the end. <i>He added a <b>postscript</b> Leaving tomorrow.</i>
presentation	A visual representation of something. The Earl of Pembroke offered Herbert the <b>presentation</b> of the living of Bremerton.
prospectus	A catalog listing the courses offered by a college or university. A <b>prospectus</b> should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.
provide	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. The Constitution <b>provide</b> s for the right to free speech.
provider	Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. <i>He didn t like the thought of Dad being the sole</i> <b>provider</b> <i>for the family again.</i>
purvey	Provide or supply (food, drink, or other goods) as one's business. Shops <b>purvey</b> ing cooked food.



purveyor	A person who sells or deals in particular goods. A <b>purveyor</b> of large luxury vehicles.
<u>submit</u>	Put before. The lawyers <b>submit</b> ted the material to the court.
supplement	Serve as a supplement to. An earnings related <b>supplement</b> was paid during the first six months of unemployment.
<u>supplier</u>	Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. Every major energy <b>supplier</b> upped their prices.
vitamin	A pill containing a specified amount of a particular vitamin or vitamins taken as a dietary supplement. <i>Vitamin deficiency.</i>
