## Addendum as a Noun

### Definitions of "Addendum" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “addendum” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An item of additional material added at the end of a book or document, typically in order to correct, clarify, or supplement something.*
- *The radial distance from the pitch circle of a cogwheel or wormwheel to the crests of the teeth or ridges.*
- *Textual matter that is added onto a publication; usually at the end.*

### Synonyms of "Addendum" as a noun (9 Words)

<b>accompaniment</b>	The act of accompanying someone or something in order to protect them. <i>Sonatas for piano with violin <b>accompaniment</b>.</i>
<b>afterword</b>	A concluding section in a book.
<b>appendix</b>	A tube shaped sac attached to and opening into the lower end of the large intestine in humans and some other mammals In humans the appendix is small and has no known function but in rabbits hares and some other herbivores it is involved in the digestion of cellulose. <i>I m merely standing in while Stella is having her <b>appendix</b> out.</i>

<b>coda</b>	The concluding passage of a piece or movement, typically forming an addition to the basic structure. <i>His new novel is a kind of <b>coda</b> to his previous books.</i>
<b>codicil</b>	A supplement to a will; a testamentary instrument intended to alter an already executed will. <i>Francis has remembered him in a <b>codicil</b> to this will.</i>
<b>postscript</b>	An extra piece of information about an event that is added after it has happened. <i>He added a <b>postscript</b> Leaving tomorrow.</i>
<b>rider</b>	An addition or amendment to a bill at its third reading. <i>Two <b>riders</b> approached the cottage.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>Our special <b>supplement</b> is packed with ideas for healthy hair.</i>
<b>tailpiece</b>	Appendage added to extend the length of something. <i>There was a <b>tailpiece</b> to the article.</i>

## Associations of "Addendum" (30 Words)

<b><u>affix</u></b>	Attach or become attached to a stem word. <i>Panels to which he <b>affixes</b> copies of fine old prints.</i>
<b>append</b>	Fix to; attach. <i>He <b>appended</b> a glossary to his novel where he used an invented language.</i>
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stooping to <b>bestow</b> the presents into eager hands.</i>
<b><u>cater</u></b>	Supply food ready to eat; for parties and banquets. <i>He <b>catered</b> a lunch for 20 people.</i>
<b>codicil</b>	An addition or supplement that explains, modifies, or revokes a will or part of one. <i>Francis has remembered him in a <b>codicil</b> to this will.</i>
<b>credential</b>	Provide with credentials. <i>His campaign has refused to <b>credential</b> any reporter from that outlet.</i>
<b>credentials</b>	A document attesting to the truth of certain stated facts.
<b>cursive</b>	Cursive writing. <i>This style of writing began to compete with Gothic <b>cursive</b>.</i>
<b>dietary</b>	Of or relating to the diet. <i><b>Dietary</b> restrictions.</i>

<b>directory</b>	(computer science) a listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk).
<b>document</b>	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The photographer spent years <b>documenting</b> the lives of miners.</i>
<b>dramaturgy</b>	The art of writing and producing plays. <i>Studies of Shakespeare s <b>dramaturgy</b>.</i>
<b>email</b>	A message sent by email. <i>A contract communicated by <b>email</b>.</i>
<b>furnish</b>	Supply someone with (something); give (something) to someone. <i>The proprietor has <b>furnished</b> the bedrooms in a variety of styles.</i>
<b>grocer</b>	A retail merchant who sells foodstuffs (and some household supplies).
<b>letter</b>	An emblem in the shape of the initial letter of a school or university s name awarded to a student for achievement in sport. <i>He numbered and <b>lettered</b> the paragraphs.</i>
<b>manuscript</b>	The form of a literary work submitted for publication. <i>Several <b>manuscripts</b> in his own hand.</i>
<b>nutrition</b>	The branch of science that deals with nutrients and nutrition particularly in humans. <i>A feeding tube gives her <b>nutrition</b> and water.</i>
<b>page</b>	Look through the pages of a book magazine etc. <i>A text file reader enables you to <b>page</b> through the authors text file using indexes.</i>
<b>postscript</b>	Textual matter that is added onto a publication; usually at the end. <i>He added a <b>postscript</b> Leaving tomorrow.</i>
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>The Earl of Pembroke offered Herbert the <b>presentation</b> of the living of Bremerton.</i>
<b>prospectus</b>	A catalog listing the courses offered by a college or university. <i>A <b>prospectus</b> should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>The Constitution <b>provides</b> for the right to free speech.</i>
<b>provider</b>	Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. <i>He didn t like the thought of Dad being the sole <b>provider</b> for the family again.</i>
<b>purvey</b>	Provide or supply (food, drink, or other goods) as one s business. <i>Shops <b>purveying</b> cooked food.</i>

<b>purveyor</b>	A person who sells or deals in particular goods. A <b>purveyor</b> of large luxury vehicles.
<b><u>submit</u></b>	Put before. <i>The lawyers <b>submitted</b> the material to the court.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	Serve as a supplement to. <i>An earnings related <b>supplement</b> was paid during the first six months of unemployment.</i>
<b><u>supplier</u></b>	Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. <i>Every major energy <b>supplier</b> upped their prices.</i>
<b>vitamin</b>	A pill containing a specified amount of a particular vitamin or vitamins taken as a dietary supplement. <b>Vitamin</b> deficiency.
