Associations of "Addicting" (30 Words)

addiction	A formal award by a magistrate of a thing or person to another person (as the award of a debtor to his creditor); a surrender to a master. <i>Under Roman law addiction was the justification for slavery.</i>
addictive	Relating to or susceptible to being or becoming addicted to something. <i>A highly addictive drug.</i>
adherent	Someone who supports a particular party, person, or set of ideas. <i>Any adherent sand grains are easily removed.</i>
alcohol	Drink containing alcohol. <i>Polyvinyl alcohol.</i>
alcoholic	A person suffering from alcoholism. <i>His alcoholic daughter was the cause of his anxiety.</i>
ash	Strong elastic wood of any of various ash trees used for furniture and tool handles and sporting goods such as baseball bats. <i>I turned over the ashes.</i>
binge	A period of excessive indulgence in an activity, especially eating, drinking, or taking drugs. <i>Every so often he might binge a Netflix show.</i>
cigarette	An object similar to a cigarette containing a narcotic or herbal substance.
compulsive	A person with a compulsive disposition someone who feels compelled to do certain things. <i>A compulsive liar.</i>
devotee	A strong believer in a particular religion or god. <i>Devotees of Krishna.</i>
dope	Carbonated drink flavored with extract from kola nuts dope is a southernism in the United States. <i>The resistors have been doped.</i>

drinker	A large brownish European moth, the caterpillar of which bears irritant hairs and is noted for drinking dew. <i>Coffee drinkers.</i>
freak	Behave or cause to behave in a wild and irrational way, typically because of the effects of extreme emotion or drugs. <i>He used to be called a freak at school and knows how much it hurts.</i>
inebriate	Drunk; intoxicated. <i>Those who feel inclined are free to inebriate themselves.</i>
intoxicant	A liquor or brew containing alcohol as the active agent. <i>Intoxicants and drugs are used by some to escape physical or psychological pain.</i>
intoxicate	Poison (someone). <i>We don't allow people into sessions if they are intoxicated by alcohol or drugs.</i>
nut	Gather nuts. <i>A car nut.</i>
overindulge	Gratify the wishes of (someone) to an excessive extent. <i>His mother had overindulged him.</i>
overuse	Use (something) too much. <i>The word hero is overused these days.</i>
peddler	Someone who travels about selling his wares (as on the streets or at carnivals). <i>Peddlers of dangerous Utopianism.</i>
rehabilitate	Return (something, especially a building or environmental feature) to its former condition. <i>The campaign aims to rehabilitate the river's flood plain.</i>
revel	Enjoy oneself in a lively and noisy way, especially with drinking and dancing. <i>Bill said he was secretly revelling in his new found fame.</i>
smoker	A person who smokes tobacco. <i>When the fish is ready put it in the warm smoker.</i>
smoking	The act of smoking tobacco or other substances. <i>The effect of smoking on health.</i>
sobriety	A manner that is serious and solemn. <i>She speaks with such sobriety it's clear she speaks the truth.</i>
stimulant	A substance that raises levels of physiological or nervous activity in the body. <i>A scalp stimulant.</i>
tipple	Drink moderately but regularly. <i>She drank several glasses of sherry her favourite tipple.</i>
