- *Stick to firmly.*
- *Be compatible or in accordance with.*

<b>abide by</b>	Put up with something or somebody unpleasant.
<b>act in accordance with</b>	Perform on a stage or theater.
<b>attach</b>	Be attached be in contact with. <i>I <b>attach</b> a copy of the memo for your information.</i>
<b>be a member of</b>	Have an existence, be extant.
<b>be affiliated to</b>	Be identical to; be someone or something.
<b>be attached to</b>	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
<b>be connected with</b>	Be priced at.
<b>be faithful to</b>	Have an existence, be extant.
<b>become friendly with</b>	Enter or assume a certain state or condition.

<b><u>bind</u></b>	Provide with a binding. <i>Clay is made up chiefly of tiny soil particles that <b>bind</b> together tightly.</i>
<b>bond</b>	Issue bonds on. <i>The failure to properly <b>bond</b> with their children.</i>
<b>cleave</b>	Come or be in close contact with; stick or hold together and resist separation. <i><b>Cleave</b> the bone.</i>
<b><u>cling</u></b>	Adhere or stick firmly or closely to; be hard to part or remove from. <i>You are <b>clinging</b> to him for security.</i>
<b><u>cohere</u></b>	Cause to form a united, orderly, and aesthetically consistent whole. <i>The sushi rice grains <b>cohere</b>.</i>
<b>comply with</b>	Act in accordance with someone's rules, commands, or wishes.
<b>conform to</b>	Be similar, be in line with.
<b>cooperate with</b>	Work together on a common enterprise or project.
<b>get involved with</b>	Cause to move; cause to be in a certain position or condition.
<b>go along with</b>	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life.
<b>go around with</b>	To be spent or finished.
<b>hold fast</b>	Resist or confront with resistance.
<b>hold to</b>	Have or possess, either in a concrete or an abstract sense.
<b>join up with</b>	Cause to become joined or linked.
<b>make friends with</b>	Compel or make somebody or something to act in a certain way.
<b>make the acquaintance of</b>	Compel or make somebody or something to act in a certain way.
<b>pay attention to</b>	Cancel or discharge a debt.
<b>pay regard to</b>	Cancel or discharge a debt.
<b>stand by</b>	Be in effect; be or remain in force.
<b>start seeing</b>	Set in motion, cause to start.
<b>stick</b>	Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation. <i>She <b>sticks</b> to her principles.</i>



<b>stick by</b>	Be a devoted follower or supporter.
<b>stick fast</b>	Be a devoted follower or supporter.
<b>stick to</b>	Stick to firmly.
<b>strike up a friendship with</b>	Arrive at after reckoning, deliberating, and weighing.
<b>string along with</b>	Add as if on a string.
<b>submit to</b>	Make an application as for a job or funding.
<b>take up with</b>	Take by force.



## Usage Examples of "Adhere" as a verb

- *The account adhered firmly to fact.*
- *They adhered to their plan.*
- *The residents of this village adhered to Catholicism.*
- *Will this wallpaper adhere to the wall?*
- *Paint won't adhere well to a greasy surface.*

## Associations of "Adhere" (30 Words)

- adhesive** A substance that unites or bonds surfaces together.  
*An **adhesive** label.*
- affix** A linguistic element added to a word to produce an inflected or derived form.  
*Grammatical morphemes **affix** to the stem.*
- attach** Become attached.  
*The spider s thread **attached** to the window sill.*
- cleave** Split (a molecule) by breaking a particular chemical bond.  
***Cleave** the bone.*
- cling** A clingstone peach.  
*The fish **cling** to the line of the weed.*
- decal** A design prepared on special paper for durable transfer on to another surface such as glass or porcelain.

<b>desperately</b>	In a way that shows despair. <i>He <b>desperately</b> needed a drink.</i>
<b>drill</b>	Make a hole in something by boring with a drill. <i>A sergeant was <b>drilling</b> new recruits.</i>
<b>epoxy</b>	Glue with epoxy. <i><b>Epoxy</b> cement.</i>
<b>glue</b>	Be fixed as if by glue. <i>His eyes were <b>glued</b> on her.</i>
<b>guideline</b>	A light line that is used in lettering to help align the letters. <i>The organization has issued <b>guidelines</b> for people working with prisoners.</i>
<b>impale</b>	Transfix or pierce with a sharp instrument. <i>His head was <b>impaled</b> on a pike and exhibited for all to see.</i>
<b>join</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>They <b>joined</b> up with local environmentalists.</i>
<b>pitchy</b>	Like or as dark as pitch.
<b>poke</b>	Prod and stir a fire with a poker to make it burn more fiercely. <i>She drew the curtains then <b>poked</b> the fire into a blaze.</i>
<b>prickle</b>	Make a small hole into, as with a needle or a thorn. <i>She <b>prickled</b> at the implication that she had led a protected life.</i>
<b>primer</b>	A small pump for pumping fuel to prime an internal combustion engine, especially in an aircraft. <i>No more than four pumps of the <b>primer</b> usually suffice.</i>
<b>spike</b>	Secure with spikes. <i>They used <b>spikes</b> to fasten the rails to a railroad tie.</i>
<b>spiny</b>	Full of or covered with prickles. <i>A <b>spiny</b> cactus.</i>
<b>splinter</b>	Break up into splinters or slivers. <i>A <b>splinter</b> of ice.</i>
<b>stake</b>	Tie or fasten to a stake. <i>Bishop Ridley was burned at the <b>stake</b>.</i>
<b>stick</b>	Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation. <i>The policy so far is all <b>stick</b> and no carrot.</i>
<b>sticker</b>	A small sharp-pointed tip resembling a spike on a stem or leaf. <i>A disabled <b>sticker</b> for our car.</i>
<b>sticky</b>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>A <b>sticky</b> question.</i>



- tacky** Not completely dried and slightly sticky to the touch.  
***Tacky** varnish.*
- tape** A cassette or reel containing magnetic tape for recording.  
***Tape** the shipping label to the box.*
- thorn** A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn.  
*The issue has become a **thorn** in renewing the peace talks.*
- viscid** Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.  
*The **viscid** mucus lining of the intestine.*
- viscous** Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.  
***Viscous** lava.*
- windshield** A window at the front of the passenger compartment of a motor vehicle; a windscreen.
