Synonyms of "Adhesive" as a noun (11 Words)

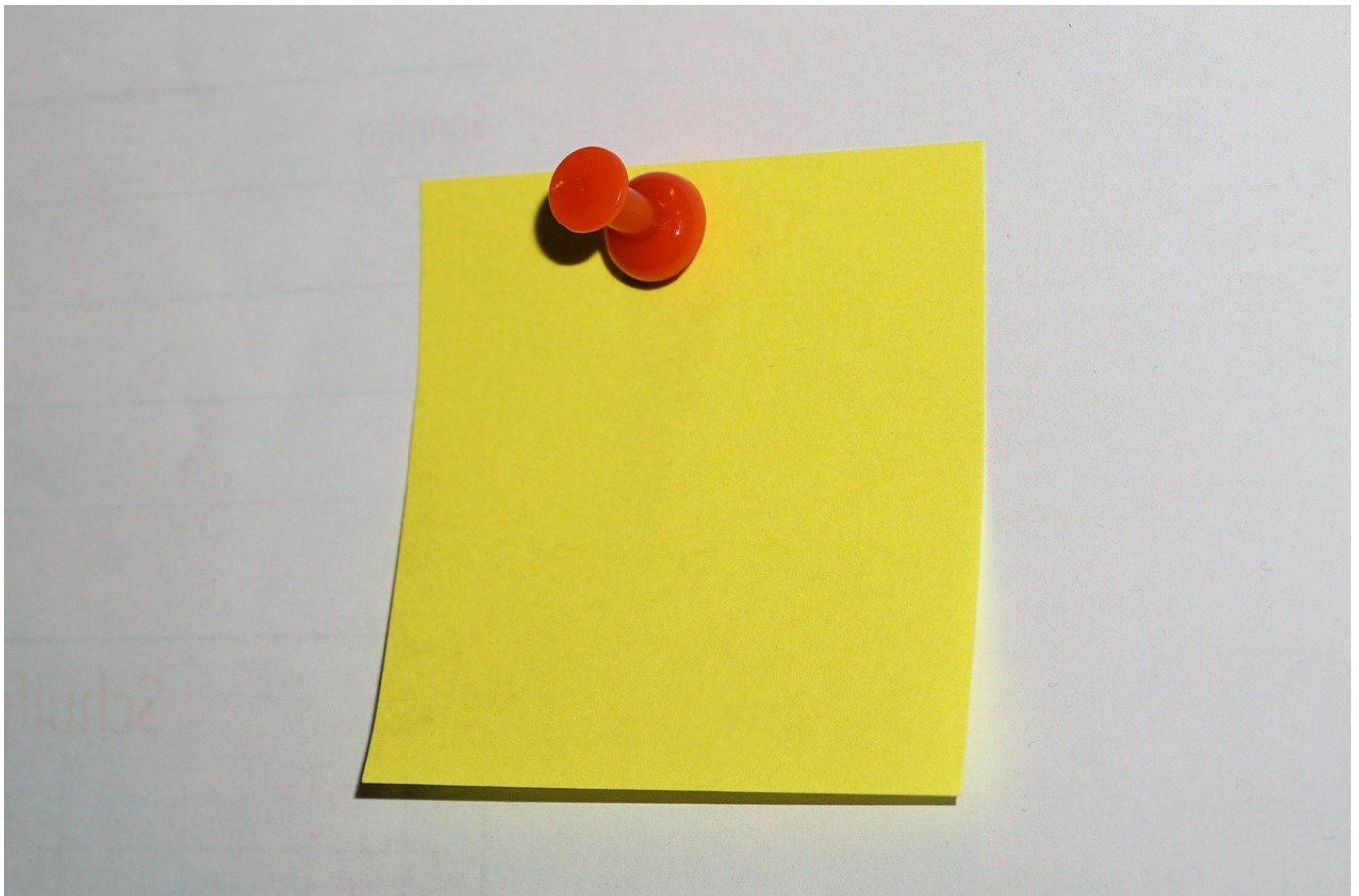
adhesive agent A substance that unites or bonds surfaces together.

binder A bookbinder.

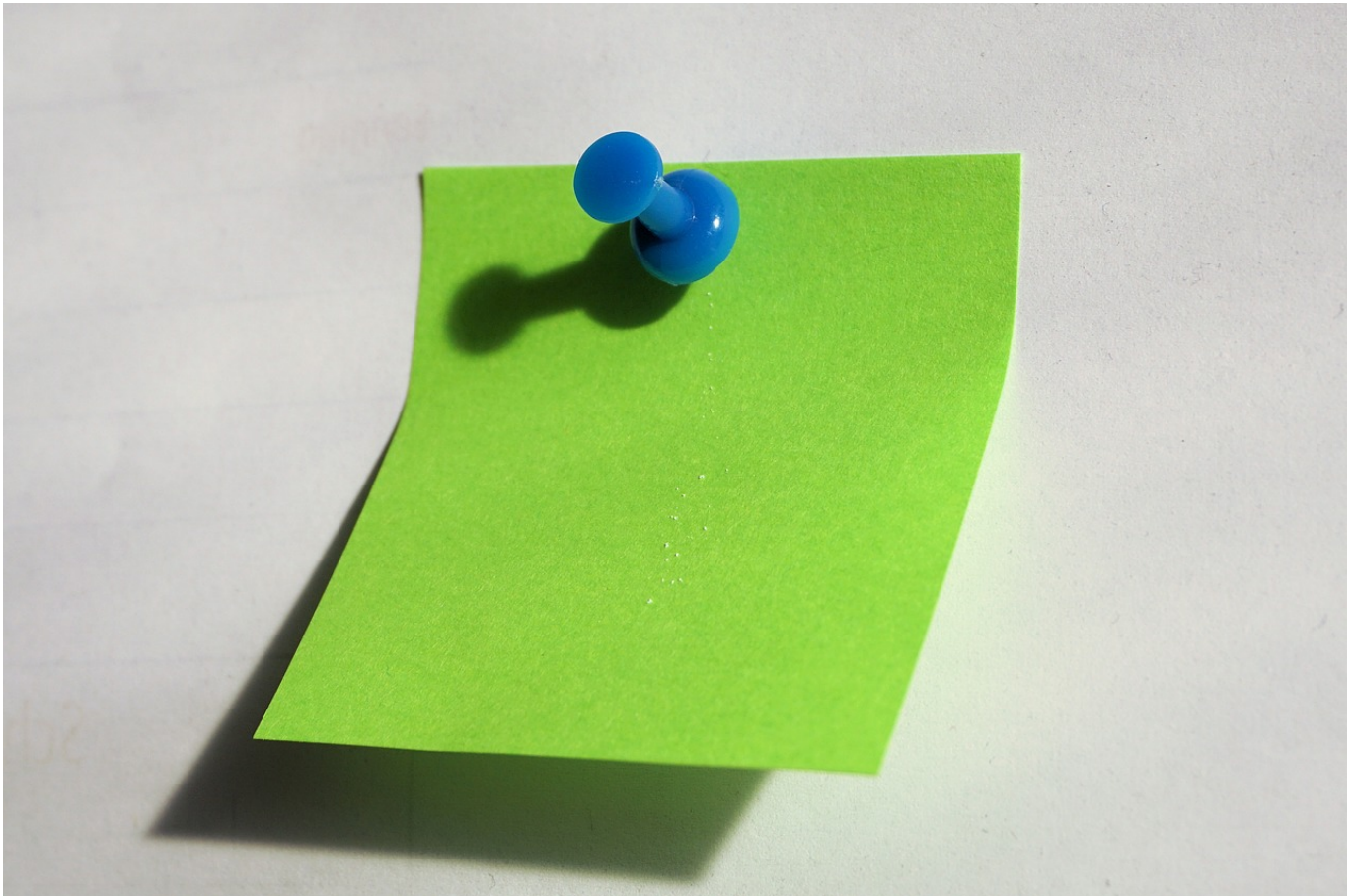
bonding A technique for repairing a tooth; resinous material is applied to the surface of the tooth where it adheres to the tooth's enamel.
*We were friendly to each other but there was no **bonding**.*

- cement** Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement.
*Dental **cement**.*
- fixative** A liquid sprayed on to a pastel or charcoal drawing to fix colours or prevent smudging.
*Ten double drops of **fixative**.*
- glue** An adhesive substance used for sticking objects or materials together.
*What is the **glue** that holds companies together.*
- gum** Any of various trees of the genera Eucalyptus or Liquidambar or Nyssa that are sources of gum.
- paste** A paste used as an adhesive especially for sticking paper.
***Paste** brooches.*
- sealant** A kind of sealing material that is used to form a hard coating on a porous surface (as a coat of paint or varnish used to size a surface).
*Blobs of silicone **sealant**.*
- sealer** A jar with a hermetic seal designed to preserve food such as fruit, pickles, and jams.
*Lumber can be sealed with waterproof **sealer**.*

Adhesive as an Adjective

Definitions of "Adhesive" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "adhesive" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Able to stick fast to a surface or object; sticky.*
- *Tending to adhere.*

- mucilaginous** (of a plant, seed, etc.) containing a polysaccharide substance that is extracted as a viscous or gelatinous solution and used in medicines and adhesives.
*A **mucilaginous** paste.*
- sticking** Extending out above or beyond a surface or boundary.
*A pile of boards **sticking** over the end of his truck.*
- sticky** Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.
*A **sticky** thread is now live on the forum.*
- tacky** Not completely dried and slightly sticky to the touch.
*The paint was still **tacky**.*
- viscid** Having a glutinous or sticky consistency.
*The **viscid** mucus lining of the intestine.*
- viscous** Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.
***Viscous** lava.*

adhere	Believe in and follow the practices of. <i>You must adhere to the rules.</i>
adherence	Attachment or commitment to a person, cause, or belief. <i>A strict adherence to etiquette.</i>
adhesion	Allegiance to a particular person, party, or set of ideas. <i>Endoscopic surgery for pelvic adhesions.</i>
attach	Cause to be attached. <i>Attach your safety line to the bridge.</i>
attachment	An extra part or extension that is or may be attached to something to perform a particular function. <i>She felt a sentimental attachment to the place creep over her.</i>
cheap	Low in price, especially in relation to similar items or services. <i>A cheap restaurant.</i>
composite	A composite constructional material. <i>The next decade may well see the introduction of more designer polymers and composites.</i>
dumpling	Small balls or strips of boiled or steamed dough. <i>He was a 250 pound dumpling.</i>
epoxy	Consisting of epoxy. <i>Epoxy cement.</i>
glue	Be fixed as if by glue. <i>His eyes were glued on her.</i>
glutinous	Like glue in texture; sticky. <i>Glutinous mud.</i>
gum	Fasten with gum or glue. <i>The receipts are gummed into a special book.</i>
meretricious	Apparently attractive but having no real value. <i>Meretricious praise.</i>
mucous	Relating to, producing, covered with, or of the nature of mucus. <i>Mucous glands of the intestine.</i>
paint	Apply a liquid to e g paint the gutters with linseed oil. <i>One has false curls another too much paint.</i>
pitchy	Of the blackest black; similar to the color of jet or coal.
polyurethane	Coat or protect with polyurethane. <i>I stained and polyurethaned the rest of the wood.</i>

primer	An introductory textbook. <i>The nitro cellulose is ignited by the spark that comes from the primer.</i>
resin	Rub or treat with resin. <i>Clear resin had oozed to the surface trickled down and set.</i>
<u>slimy</u>	Covered by or resembling slime. <i>Thick slimy mud.</i>
sticker	An adhesive label. <i>A disabled sticker for our car.</i>
<u>sticky</u>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>His new nickname has proved to be surprisingly sticky.</i>
<u>tacky</u>	Not completely dried and slightly sticky to the touch. <i>Tacky varnish.</i>
<u>tape</u>	Record on videotape. <i>Tape the shipping label to the box.</i>
taping	A recording made on magnetic tape.
tarry	Like or covered with tar. <i>A length of tarry rope.</i>
video	Make a video recording of something broadcast on television. <i>He videoed our wedding.</i>
viscid	Having a glutinous or sticky consistency. <i>The viscid mucus lining of the intestine.</i>
<u>viscosity</u>	Resistance of a liquid to shear forces (and hence to flow). <i>Cooling the fluid raises its viscosity.</i>
<u>viscous</u>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>Viscous lava.</i>
