## Adjacent as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Adjacent" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “adjacent” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a pair of angles) formed on the same side of a straight line when intersected by another line.*
- *Near or close to but not necessarily touching.*
- *Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.*
- *Nearest in space or position; immediately adjoining without intervening space.*
- *Next to or adjoining something else.*



## Synonyms of "Adjacent" as an adjective (18 Words)

<b>abreast of</b>	Being up to particular standard or level especially in being up to date in knowledge.
<b>adjoining</b>	(of a building, room, or piece of land) next to or joined with. <i>They ended up buying the <b>adjoining</b> land.</i>
<b>attached to</b>	Used of buildings joined by common sidewalls.
<b>close by</b>	Marked by fidelity to an original.
<b>close to</b>	Fitting closely but comfortably.
<b>conterminous</b>	Having the same area, context, or meaning. <i>The side of Germany <b>conterminous</b> with France.</i>
<b>contiguous</b>	Very close or connected in space or time. <i>Utah and the <b>contiguous</b> state of Idaho.</i>
<b>contiguous with</b>	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.
<b>near to</b>	Not far distant in time or space or degree or circumstances.

<b>neighboring</b>	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>Neighboring cities.</i>
<b>neighbouring</b>	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>Neighbouring countries.</i>
<b>neighbouring on</b>	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.
<b>next</b>	(of an event) occurring directly after the present one in time, without anything of the same kind intervening. <i>Building materials were <b>next</b> in importance.</i>
<b>next door to</b>	Elected but not yet serving.
<b>next to</b>	Nearest in space or position; immediately adjoining without intervening space.
<b>proximate to</b>	Closest in degree or order (space or time) especially in a chain of causes and effects.
<b>side by side</b>	Located on a side.
<b>touching</b>	Arousing feelings of sympathy or gratitude. <i>Your loyalty is very <b>touching</b>.</i>

<b>adjoin</b>	Lie adjacent to another or share a boundary. <i>Canada <b>adjoins</b> the U S.</i>
<b><u>approximate</u></b>	Come close or be similar to something in quality, nature, or quantity. <i>I had to <b>approximate</b> the weight of my horse.</i>
<b>around</b>	All around or on all sides. <i>Traveled <b>around</b> in Asia.</i>
<b><u>border</u></b>	A district near the border between two areas. <i>The unknown regions at the <b>borders</b> of physics and electronics.</i>
<b>close</b>	Come to a close. <i>Animals in <b>close</b> confinement.</i>
<b><u>closely</u></b>	In a way that involves a strong resemblance or connection. <i>A <b>closely</b> guarded plan.</i>
<b>connected</b>	Joined or linked together. <i>A <b>connected</b> series of cargo holds.</i>
<b>contiguous</b>	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>The <b>contiguous</b> 48 states.</i>
<b>edge</b>	Strike the ball with the edge of the bat strike a ball delivered by the bowler with the edge of the bat. <i>The pool is <b>edged</b> with paving.</i>
<b><u>juxtapose</u></b>	Place or deal with close together for contrasting effect. <i>Black and white photos of slums were starkly <b>juxtaposed</b> with colour images.</i>
<b>lateral</b>	A lateral consonant. <i><b>Lateral</b> sclerosis.</i>
<b>laterally</b>	At, towards, or from the side or sides; sideways. <i>Most coral reefs have extended <b>laterally</b> rather than vertically.</i>
<b>locality</b>	The position or site of something. <i>The rock s size and <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>near</b>	Come near to approach. <i>His retirement was drawing <b>near</b>.</i>
<b><u>nearby</u></b>	Not far away in relative terms. <i>The <b>nearby</b> towns.</i>
<b>neighboring</b>	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i><b>Neighboring</b> cities.</i>
<b><u>next</u></b>	The next person or thing. <i>Building materials were <b>next</b> in importance.</i>

<b>perimeter</b>	An instrument for measuring the extent and characteristics of a person's field of vision. <i>A <b>perimeter</b> fence.</i>
<b>proximate</b>	Nearly accurate approximate. <i>The failure of the <b>proximate</b> military power to lend assistance.</i>
<b>purlieu</b>	A tract on the border of a forest, especially one earlier included in it and still partly subject to forest laws. <i>They wished the <b>purlieus</b> to be completely free from the Forest law.</i>
<b>side</b>	The amount of writing needed to fill one side of a sheet of paper. <i>A <b>side</b> entrance.</i>
<b>superimpose</b>	Place or lay (one thing) over another, typically so that both are still evident. <i>The number will appear on the screen <b>superimposed</b> on a flashing button.</i>
<b>surrounding</b>	Closely encircling. <i>Cardiff and the <b>surrounding</b> area.</i>
<b>thereabout</b>	Near that place. <i>Come at noon or <b>thereabouts</b>.</i>
<b>throughout</b>	From first to last. <i>The house is in good order <b>throughout</b>.</i>
<b>vicinity</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The number of people living in the immediate <b>vicinity</b> was small.</i>
