Definitions of "Adjacent" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "adjacent" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of a pair of angles) formed on the same side of a straight line when intersected by another line.
- Near or close to but not necessarily touching.
- Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.
- Nearest in space or position; immediately adjoining without intervening space.
- Next to or adjoining something else.

abreast of	Being up to particular standard or level especially in being up to date in knowledge.
adjoining	(of a building, room, or piece of land) next to or joined with. They ended up buying the adjoining land.
attached to	Used of buildings joined by common sidewalls.
close by	Marked by fidelity to an original.
close to	Fitting closely but comfortably.
conterminous	Having the same area, context, or meaning. The side of Germany conterminous with France.
contiguous	Very close or connected in space or time. Utah and the contiguous state of Idaho.
contiguous with	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.
near to	Not far distant in time or space or degree or circumstances.




neighboring	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>Neighboring cities.</i>
neighbouring	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>Neighbouring countries</i> .
neighbouring on	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.
<u>next</u>	(of an event) occurring directly after the present one in time, without anything of the same kind intervening. <i>Building materials were</i> next <i>in importance</i> .
next door to	Elected but not yet serving.
next to	Nearest in space or position; immediately adjoining without intervening space.
proximate to	Closest in degree or order (space or time) especially in a chain of causes and effects.
side by side	Located on a side.
touching	Arousing feelings of sympathy or gratitude. <i>Your loyalty is very touching.</i>

purlieu	A tract on the border of a forest, especially one earlier included in it and still partly subject to forest laws. They wished the purlieu s to be completely free from the Forest law.
<u>side</u>	The amount of writing needed to fill one side of a sheet of paper. A side entrance.
superimpose	Place or lay (one thing) over another, typically so that both are still evident. The number will appear on the screen superimpose d on a flashing button.
surrounding	Closely encircling. Cardiff and the surrounding area.
thereabout	Near that place. <i>Come at noon or thereabouts.</i>
throughout	From first to last. The house is in good order throughout .
vicinity	A surrounding or nearby region. The number of people living in the immediate vicinity was small.
