### Definitions of "Adjacent" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “adjacent” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a pair of angles) formed on the same side of a straight line when intersected by another line.*
- *Near or close to but not necessarily touching.*
- *Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.*
- *Nearest in space or position; immediately adjoining without intervening space.*
- *Next to or adjoining something else.*

| <b>neighbouring on</b> | Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching.   |
| <b>next</b>            | (of an event) occurring directly after the present one in time, without anything of the same kind intervening.<br><i>Building materials were <b>next</b> in importance.</i> |
| <b>next door to</b>    | Elected but not yet serving.  |
| <b>next to</b>         | Nearest in space or position; immediately adjoining without intervening space.  |
| <b>proximate to</b>    | Closest in degree or order (space or time) especially in a chain of causes and effects.   |
| <b>side by side</b>    | Located on a side.  |
| <b>touching</b>        | Arousing feelings of sympathy or gratitude.<br><i>Your loyalty is very <b>touching</b>.</i>   |

| <b><u>border</u></b>      | A district near the border between two areas.<br><i>The unknown regions at the <b>borders</b> of physics and electronics.</i>                            |
