

In this article, we present one of the web's largest lists of adjectives that begin with "A". We give a definition and a quick usage example for each word.

**Over 1440 adjectives in English start with "A". The letter A is one of the most popular letter for adjectives.**

If we sort the list of adjectives by their SECOND letter, it is very interesting to see that AN- is the clear winner (mainly due to the prefixes *an-* and *anti-*) followed by AL (135 words), AC (132 words) and AR (128 words). On the other end of the spectrum, AJ and AO only have 1 adjective each.

For your convenience, we have organized the list by the second letter. Feel free to jump right to the section you are interested in. Enjoy!
