<b>habilimented</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination
<b>habitable</b>	Fit for habitation <i>The habitable zone varies with the type and age of the central star.</i>
<b>habited</b>	Dressed in a habit <i>Various caves within the gorge were habited by neolithic people.</i>
<b>habitual</b>	Commonly used or practiced; usual <i>Drug abuse is the habitual misuse of a drug.</i>
<b>hackneyed</b>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse <i>It's far too colloquial, hackneyed and uninteresting.</i>
<b>hadal</b>	Relating to the deepest parts of the ocean (below 6000 meters) <i>The area below the abyssal zone is the sparsely inhabited hadal zone.</i>
<b>hadean</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of hades or tartarus <i>It includes three eons, the hadean, archean, and proterozoic eons.</i>
<b>haemal</b>	Relating to the blood vessels or blood <i>The hole so formed is the haemal canal.</i>
<b>haematal</b>	Relating to the blood vessels or blood
<b>haematic</b>	Relating to or containing or affecting blood
<b>haematogenic</b>	Pertaining to the formation of blood or blood cells
<b>haematological</b>	Of or relating to or involved in hematology <i>There are few long term haematological sequelae of restorative proctocolectomy.</i>

<b>haematopoietic</b>	Pertaining to the formation of blood or blood cells <i>Cb2 receptors are mostly located in the immune and haematopoietic systems.</i>
<b>haemic</b>	Relating to or containing or affecting blood
<b>haemolytic</b>	Relating to or involving or causing hemolysis <i>Specific liver diseases and haemolytic disorders able to be identified.</i>
<b>haemophilic</b>	Relating to or having hemophilia
<b>haemopoietic</b>	Pertaining to the formation of blood or blood cells <i>The development of lymphoid and haemopoietic tissues in pig fetuses.</i>
<b>haemorrhagic</b>	Of or relating to a hemorrhage <i>They die with a serous, foamy or haemorrhagic discharge coming out of the nose.</i>
<b>hag-ridden</b>	Tormented or harassed by nightmares or unreasonable fears- c.s.lewis <i>Fences within the water need to be ridden with a good deal of impulsion.</i>
<b>haggard</b>	Showing the wearing effects of overwork or care or suffering <i>A little haggard and unrepentant when reached on thursday.</i>
<b>hagridden</b>	Tormented or harassed by nightmares or unreasonable fears- c.s.lewis
<b>hair-raising</b>	Extremely alarming <i>The crowd was hollering and raising hell.</i>
<b>haired</b>	Having or covered with hair <i>Herrena was a girl with the henna haired, harridan.</i>
<b>hairless</b>	Having no hair or fur <i>The inside of the acorn shell is hairless.</i>
<b>hairlike</b>	Long and slender with a very small internal diameter <i>Each is on a pedicel covered in hairlike black glands.</i>
<b>hairsplitting</b>	Developed in excessively fine detail <i>It's tiresome hairsplitting at this point.</i>
<b>hairy</b>	Having or covered with hair <i>Few birds other than the cuckoo find the hairy caterpillars palatable.</i>
<b>haitian</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of the republic of haiti or its people <i>A simple example is the recent haitian earthquake.</i>
<b>halal</b>	Conforming to dietary laws <i>Aiui the prohibition is specifically on halal meat.</i>
<b>halcyon</b>	Marked by peace and prosperity <i>However, those halcyon days for the government worker may be coming to an end.</i>
<b>hale</b>	Exhibiting or restored to vigorous good health <i>Many hale guys volunteered to join the army.</i>
<b>half</b>	Related through one parent only <i>The first half is decent but the second part is mediocre.</i>

<b>half-baked</b>	Foolish; totally unsound <i>The baked dumpling is popular in american cuisine.</i>
<b>half-blooded</b>	Having only one purebred parent <i>Most dramatic are the cold blooded conscienceless killers.</i>
<b>half-bred</b>	Having only one purebred parent <i>Cut the waffle in half.</i>
<b>half-breed</b>	Having only one purebred parent <i>She was the last of the peripatetic breed.</i>
<b>half-dozen</b>	Denoting a quantity consisting of six items or units <i>Add the dozen figures and any amortization you want, but don't suppress.</i>
<b>half-hearted</b>	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm <i>The soldier was not faint hearted.</i>
<b>half-hourly</b>	Occurring ever half hour <i>One chanter plays the upper half of the octave, the other the lower half.</i>
<b>half-length</b>	Abridged to half its original length <i>The length of submarine cable is and the total length of overhead lines is.</i>
<b>half-timbered</b>	Having exposed wood framing with spaces filled with masonry, as in tudor architecture <i>Yes the first half was very dreary, but the second half was better.</i>
<b>half-way</b>	Including only half or a portion <i>It stands in the south of the city, halfway up the hill.</i>
<b>half-witted</b>	Retarded in intellectual development <i>An oaf is a large dim witted person.</i>
<b>half-yearly</b>	Occurring or payable twice each year <i>The yearly tithe to the levites could be consumed anywhere.</i>
<b>halfhearted</b>	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm <i>He became a model, but he was halfhearted as he said in interview.</i>
<b>halfway</b>	Equally distant from the extremes <i>The charts are halfway down the website.</i>
<b>hallowed</b>	Worthy of religious veneration <i>You're a great debator only in the hallowed halls of your own mind.</i>
<b>hallucinatory</b>	Characterized by or characteristic of hallucination - jean stafford <i>One interpretation of the video is that it's a drug induced hallucinatory trip.</i>
<b>hallucinogenic</b>	Capable of producing hallucinations <i>Hallucinogenic drugs as precipitants of schizophrenia.</i>
<b>halt</b>	Disabled in the feet or legs <i>He was unable to halt the contraband.</i>
<b>halting</b>	Disabled in the feet or legs <i>The effect of halting the german fleet was huge.</i>

<b>hammy</b>	Affectedly dramatic; overacted <i>Ed pressed on, hit another hammy, and lost the money.</i>
<b>hand-held</b>	Small and light enough to be operated while you hold it in your hands <i>The horsemen held the mare.</i>
<b>handed</b>	Having or involving the use of hands <i>He handed over the blueprints to the entire cell.</i>
<b>handelian</b>	Of or relating to or in the manner of george frederick handel <i>The latter sounds rather like a miniature handelian chorus, sung a cappella.</i>
<b>handheld</b>	Small and light enough to be operated while you hold it in your hands <i>Traditional handheld refractometer.</i>
<b>handicapped</b>	Incapable of functioning as a consequence of injury or illness <i>The service is for the handicapped.</i>
<b>handier</b>	Easy to use <i>It seems more handy to demonstrate the incompetence of the editing here.</i>
<b>handiest</b>	Easy to use <i>The title is very handy for dealing with the press.</i>
<b>handled</b>	Having a usually specified type of handle <i>The way you handled this is unbecoming of you.</i>
<b>handleless</b>	Having no handle <i>Handleless cooking vessel nestable inside a serving vessel.</i>
<b>handless</b>	Without a hand or hands <i>The ghost of a handless piper is said to haunt the castle.</i>
<b>handmade</b>	Made by hand or a hand process <i>The work was funded by sale of handmade models and contributions.</i>
<b>hands-off</b>	Not involving participation or intervention <i>He spread out his hands in expostulation.</i>
<b>hands-on</b>	Involving active participation <i>On an exhale, the student releases onto the hands and knees and rests.</i>
<b>handsewn</b>	Sewn by hand rather than machine
<b>handsome</b>	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion- thackeray <i>He is handsome, selfish, amoral and hedonistic.</i>
<b>handsomely</b>	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion- thackeray <i>He is handsome and intelligent, but unbridled and arrogant.</i>
<b>handstitched</b>	Sewn by hand rather than machine
<b>handwoven</b>	Made on a handloom <i>It is known for its pottery and handwoven ceremonial songket cloth.</i>

<b>handwritten</b>	Written by hand <i>Signs of a renaissance of the handwritten word are here and there discernible.</i>
<b>handy</b>	Easy to reach <i>Thank you for the welcome and the handy links.</i>
<b>hangdog</b>	Showing a sense of guilt-eric linklater <i>With a hangdog expression, i retreated to the confines of my apartment.</i>
<b>hanoverian</b>	Of or relating to the former english royal house of hanover or their supporters <i>For his zeal in behalf of the hanoverian succession he was well rewarded.</i>
<b>haphazard</b>	Dependent upon or characterized by chance <i>Having haphazard disaster by disaster efforts is pov and will be factious.</i>
<b>hapless</b>	Deserving or inciting pity- galsworthy <i>They feed on the homeless and hapless passersby.</i>
<b>haploid</b>	Of a cell or organism having a single set of chromosomes <i>Fungal mycelia are typically haploid.</i>
<b>haploidic</b>	Of a cell or organism having a single set of chromosomes
<b>happier</b>	Well expressed and to the point <i>The multitude of guests is happy.</i>
<b>happiest</b>	Marked by good fortune <i>Despite the festive atmosphere, they weren't happy.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Well expressed and to the point <i>The multitude of guests is happy.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Occurring by chance <i>He appears to be happy go lucky and good natured, and acts very carefree.</i>
<b>haptic</b>	Of or relating to or proceeding from the sense of touch <i>Categories of haptic communication.</i>
<b>hard</b>	Resisting weight or pressure <i>It was hard to inveigle her.</i>
<b>hard-boiled</b>	Tough and callous by virtue of experience <i>The pumpkin is peeled and boiled in water.</i>
<b>hard-core</b>	Intensely loyal <i>That's the core of the teaching as he described in the core of the teaching.</i>
<b>hard-fought</b>	Requiring great effort <i>Grasps both hard side irreverence and hard core straightforwardness.</i>
<b>hard-hitting</b>	Aggressively and persistently persuasive <i>On weekdays, she works hard.</i>
<b>hard-line</b>	Firm and uncompromising <i>Everyone works hard during the workday.</i>
<b>hard-nosed</b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory <i>The hard work is worthless.</i>
<b>hard-pressed</b>	Facing or experiencing financial trouble or difficulty <i>But when pressed speer dropped 'eine kleine' clanger.</i>

<b>hardback</b>	Having a hard back or cover <i>It was first published in hardback in 2003.</i>
<b>hardbacked</b>	Having a hard back or cover
<b>hardbound</b>	Having a hard back or cover <i>A hardcover, hardbound book has rigid covers and is stitched in the spine.</i>
<b>hardcore</b>	Intensely loyal <i>The band is at the forefront of hardcore and punk music today.</i>
<b>hardcover</b>	Having a hard back or cover <i>It was the author's first hardcover collection.</i>
<b>hardened</b>	Made tough by habitual exposure- robert lynd- v.s.pritchett <i>It hardened around the shift in gene frequencies in the fifties.</i>
<b>harder</b>	Very strong or vigorous <i>Ant is a hard working insect.</i>
<b>hardest</b>	Very strong or vigorous <i>It was hard to inveigle her.</i>
<b>hardfisted</b>	Unwilling to part with money
<b>hardheaded</b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory <i>I don't think english is hardheaded, either.</i>
<b>hardhearted</b>	Lacking in feeling or pity or warmth <i>Mccarthy's reaction to the assassination was singularly hardhearted.</i>
<b>hardline</b>	Firm and uncompromising <i>He was considered to be a hardline communist.</i>
<b>hardscrabble</b>	Barely satisfying a lower standard <i>They have had a hardscrabble to get the well from each other.</i>
<b>hardworking</b>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance <i>The people are friendly and hardworking.</i>
<b>hardy</b>	Able to survive under unfavorable weather conditions <i>The plant is a hardy dwarf bush seedling, of the outdoor type.</i>
<b>harebrained</b>	Very foolish <i>Anyway, i resolve to keep thinking of harebrained schemes to make money.</i>
<b>harmful</b>	Causing or capable of causing harm <i>Vehicles emit gas and fumes that are harmful.</i>
<b>harmless</b>	Not causing or capable of causing harm <i>Medicinal leeches are perfectly harmless.</i>
<b>harmonic</b>	Of or relating to harmonics <i>Ore's harmonic number redirects to harmonic divisor number.</i>
<b>harmonical</b>	Involving or characterized by harmony <i>The latter has a harmonical function, while the former refers to rhythm.</i>

<b>harmonious</b>	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities <i>Welcome to the harmonious editing club</i>
<b>harmonised</b>	Involving or characterized by harmony <i>But they need to be harmonised, or whatever the right word is.</i>
<b>harmonizable</b>	Capable of being made harmonious or consistent
<b>harried</b>	Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances <i>As a result, the germans harried the team.</i>
<b>harrowing</b>	Extremely painful <i>The farmer is harrowing a field.</i>
<b>harsh</b>	Severe <i>They treated the coltish harsh.</i>
<b>harsher</b>	Of textures that are rough to the touch or substances consisting of relatively large particles <i>His meanness and harsh tongue were also renowned.</i>
<b>harshest</b>	Unpleasantly stern <i>Criticism ranges from the harsh to the approving.</i>
<b>hasidic</b>	Of or relating to the jewish hasidim or its members or their beliefs and practices <i>The hasidic answer is generally in the negative.</i>
<b>hassidic</b>	Of or relating to the jewish hasidim or its members or their beliefs and practices <i>The other two pictures of people lighting menorahs are of hassidic rabbis.</i>
<b>hastate</b>	Like a spear point, with flaring pointed lobes at the base <i>The triangular hastate leaves are long and wide, and violet on the underside.</i>
<b>hasty</b>	Excessively quick <i>I was hasty in choosing the name.</i>
<b>hateful</b>	Evoking or deserving hatred- joseph priestly <i>Sometimes doing nothing is the most hateful option of all in this world.</i>
<b>hatefully</b>	Characterized by malice <i>Sometimes doing nothing is the most hateful option of all in this world.</i>
<b>hatless</b>	Not wearing a hat <i>Men of the upper classes often went hatless.</i>
<b>hatted</b>	Wearing a hat or a hat of a particular kind <i>These, again over time, turned into the red hatted gnomes.</i>
<b>haughty</b>	Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one views as unworthy <i>He himself was proud and haughty in his bearing.</i>
<b>haunting</b>	Continually recurring to the mind- claudia cassidy <i>I removed the stuff about the haunting.</i>
<b>hawaiian</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of the state or island of hawaii or to the people or culture or language <i>Kalo was the staple starch crop of the hawaiian diet.</i>

<b>hawk-eyed</b>	Having very keen vision <i>A hawk is perched on the man's outstretched hand.</i>
<b>hawkish</b>	Disposed to warfare or hard-line policies <i>Her foreign and security policies are often regarded as hawkish.</i>
<b>haywire</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular <i>Mahone climbs up the silo to meet haywire.</i>
<b>hazardous</b>	Involving risk or danger <i>The circumstances of the Pearson executions were hazardous.</i>
<b>hazel</b>	Of a light brown or yellowish brown color <i>The forest had been pine with an underbrush of hazel, alder, birch, and willow.</i>
<b>hazy</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline <i>Why change terminology from the clear specific, to the hazy general</i>

<b>hearing</b>	Able to perceive sound <i>Hearing the news began to seethe the man.</i>
<b>hearsay</b>	Heard through another rather than directly <i>You should keep hearsay and innuendo out of the articles.</i>
<b>heart-whole</b>	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion <i>My heart began to palpitate.</i>
<b>heartbreaking</b>	Causing or marked by grief or anguish <i>The holocaust is a very perplexing, and interesting and heartbreaking topic.</i>
<b>heartbroken</b>	Full of sorrow <i>The heartbroken astronaut shrugs and walks off.</i>
<b>heartfelt</b>	Earnest <i>My heartfelt apologies for the whole incident.</i>
<b>heartless</b>	Devoid of courage or enthusiasm <i>There's also a heartless symbol.</i>
<b>heartrending</b>	Causing or marked by grief or anguish <i>You then added the heartrending story about the pregnant woman.</i>
<b>heartsick</b>	Full of sorrow <i>He appears to be more distracted than heartsick or emotionally undone.</i>
<b>heartwarming</b>	Causing gladness and pleasure <i>A heartwarming series to tug the heart strings.</i>
<b>hearty</b>	Consuming abundantly and with gusto <i>My grandpa is hale and hearty.</i>
<b>heatable</b>	Capable of becoming hot <i>A heater is mounted adjacent the supply conduit heatable section.</i>
<b>heated</b>	Made warm or hot ('het' is a dialectal variant of 'heated') <i>The column is heated from the bottom.</i>
<b>heathen</b>	Not acknowledging the god of christianity and judaism and islam <i>But the dance was forbidden by the missionaries as too heathen.</i>
<b>heathenish</b>	Not acknowledging the god of christianity and judaism and islam <i>The reverence for the cross they looked upon as heathenish.</i>
<b>heathlike</b>	Resembling heath
<b>heatless</b>	Without generating heat
<b>heavenly</b>	Of or relating to the sky <i>This mnemonic reminds one of the symbols the heavenly kings carry.</i>
<b>heavenward</b>	Directed toward heaven or the sky <i>Eyes of bearcat roll heavenward, how am i such a drama magnet, yadda yadda.</i>
<b>heavier</b>	Unusually great in degree or quantity or number <i>They were overburdened with heavy tax.</i>

<b>heaviest</b>	Deep and complete <i>The wood is hard and heavy and is used in general construction and for firewood.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	Of great gravity or crucial import; requiring serious thought <i>Floods ravage scotland after heavy rain.</i>
<b>heavy-armed</b>	Having massive arms <i>The colonists armed themselves, and the attack was averted.</i>
<b>heavy-duty</b>	Designed for heavy work <i>Otherwise it is pure dereliction of duty.</i>
<b>heavy-handed</b>	Unjustly domineering <i>The parietal callus is moderately heavy.</i>
<b>heavyhearted</b>	Depressed
<b>heavysset</b>	Having a short and solid form or stature <i>Zaffarano was a portly, heavysset, tall and handsome man with a brooding face.</i>
<b>hebdomadal</b>	Of or occurring every seven days <i>He was for many years a leading member of the hebdomadal board.</i>
<b>hebdomadary</b>	Of or occurring every seven days
<b>hebephrenic</b>	Suffering from a form of schizophrenia characterized by foolish mannerisms and senseless laughter along with delusions and regressive behavior
<b>hebraic</b>	Of or relating to the language of the hebrews <i>There appears to be a hebraic bias in this article.</i>
<b>hebraical</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of the hebrews
<b>hebrew</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of the hebrews <i>The use of the hebrew language in worship was forbidden.</i>
<b>hebridean</b>	Of or relating to the hebrides <i>They are thought to be unrelated to the west coast and hebridean morrison.</i>
<b>hectic</b>	Marked by intense agitation or emotion <i>It was hectic the last couple of days here.</i>
<b>hedonic</b>	Devoted to pleasure <i>Hedonic damages also can apply in cases that involve no injury.</i>
<b>hedonistic</b>	Devoted to pleasure <i>He is handsome, selfish, amoral and hedonistic.</i>
<b>heedful</b>	Giving attention <i>At all times he obeys the order of the emperor with heedful attention.</i>
<b>heedless</b>	Marked by or paying little heed or attention-franklin d. roosevelt <i>He also attacked heedless of odds.</i>
<b>heftier</b>	Of considerable weight and size <i>The power supply is also pretty hefty.</i>

<b>hefty</b>	Of considerable weight and size <i>She agreed and henry paid her the hefty sum of money.</i>
<b>hegelian</b>	Of or relating to hegel or his dialectic philosophy <i>In short, a subject in the hegelian sense is subjected to subjection.</i>
<b>heinous</b>	Extremely wicked, deeply criminal <i>I support the death penalty for the most heinous criminals.</i>
<b>heliac</b>	Pertaining to or near the sun; especially the first rising of a star after and last setting before its invisibility owing to its conjunction with the sun <i>In any case, heliac is the only one who removed any content.</i>
<b>heliacal</b>	Pertaining to or near the sun; especially the first rising of a star after and last setting before its invisibility owing to its conjunction with the sun <i>The sothic year is the interval between heliacal risings of the star sirius.</i>
<b>helical</b>	In the shape of a coil <i>A helical spring urges the two apart to expand the palate.</i>
<b>heliocentric</b>	Having the sun as the center <i>It is currently in a 355 day heliocentric orbit.</i>
<b>hell-bent</b>	Recklessly determined <i>Soon, he bent a leonine face toward a girl.</i>
<b>hellenic</b>	Relating to or characteristic of the classical greek civilization <i>Hellenic neopaganism appeared in the 1990s.</i>
<b>hellenistic</b>	Relating to or characteristic of the classical greek civilization <i>Alchemy in the hellenistic world.</i>
<b>hellenistical</b>	Relating to or characteristic of the classical greek civilization
<b>hellish</b>	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell <i>The unit continues their march through jungle and hellish swamps.</i>
<b>helmet-shaped</b>	Having the convex shape of a helmet <i>Cutout areas in the helmet are provided for venting.</i>
<b>helmeted</b>	Equipped with or wearing a helmet <i>The african helmeted turtle is omnivorous and will eat almost anything.</i>
<b>helminthic</b>	Capable of expelling or destroying parasitic worms <i>Theoretical explanation of helminthic therapy.</i>
<b>helpful</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function <i>Infrangible is friendly, good humored and helpful.</i>
<b>helpfully</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function <i>Discourtesy is not helpful in this situation.</i>

<b>helpless</b>	Lacking in or deprived of strength or power <i>He awakes but, stupefied with wine, is helpless.</i>
<b>hemal</b>	Relating to the blood vessels or blood <i>Hoznek a, hubert j, antiphon p, gettman mt, hemal ak, abbou cc.</i>
<b>hematal</b>	Relating to the blood vessels or blood
<b>hematic</b>	Relating to or containing or affecting blood
<b>hematogenic</b>	Pertaining to the formation of blood or blood cells
<b>hematologic</b>	Of or relating to or involved in hematology <i>Hematologic malignancies such as leukemia are more common in children with ds.</i>
