<b>ukrainian</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of ukraine or its people or culture <i>He was especially disapproving of ukrainian settlement.</i>
<b>ulcerated</b>	Having an ulcer or canker <i>They may be hairless, ulcerated, or itchy.</i>
<b>ulcerative</b>	Of or relating to or characterized by ulceration <i>Clinial presentation of ulcerative colitis.</i>
<b>ulcerous</b>	Having an ulcer or canker <i>Too bad henry died of that ulcerous leg.</i>
<b>ulnar</b>	Relating to or near the ulna <i>Radial abduction/ulnar adduction.</i>
<b>ult</b>	In or of the month preceding the present one <i>Anyway, i'm wondering if any of you guys know who this ult.</i>

<b>ulterior</b>	Coming at a subsequent time or stage <i>They all have an ulterior motive in looking for the stolen loot.</i>
<b>ultimate</b>	Furthest or highest in degree or order; utmost or extreme <i>The community is surely the ultimate arbiter.</i>
<b>ultimo</b>	In or of the month preceding the present one <i>At the 'ultimo' the last trick has to be taken with the 'small man'.</i>
<b>ultra</b>	Far beyond the norm <i>It communicates by squeaking or with ultra sound.</i>
<b>ultraconservative</b>	Extremely conservative <i>A politically ultraconservative or reactionary person.</i>
<b>ultramarine</b>	Of a brilliant pure blue to purplish blue color <i>Their armor is painted ultramarine blue.</i>
<b>ultramicroscopic</b>	Too small to be seen without an ultramicroscope <i>An investigation on the nature of ultramicroscopic viruses.</i>
<b>ultramodern</b>	Extremely modern <i>In contrast, one ultramodern status symbol was the movado museum watch.</i>
<b>ultramontane</b>	On or relating to or characteristic of the region or peoples beyond the alps from italy (or north of the alps) <i>Ultramontane has done some work on the hank williams jr. entry.</i>
<b>ultranationalistic</b>	Fanatically patriotic <i>This is clear case of trolling and ultranationalistic behaviors.</i>
<b>ultrasonic</b>	Having frequencies above those of audible sound <i>The carrier is useful in ultrasonic testing of furnace tubes.</i>
<b>ultraviolet</b>	Having or employing wavelengths shorter than light but longer than x-rays; lying outside the visible spectrum at its violet end <i>Sunburn is a condition of the skin after overexposure to ultraviolet radiation.</i>

<b>unaccompanied</b>	Taking place without something specified occurring at the same time <i>Prior to that the congregants sang unaccompanied.</i>
<b>unaccountable</b>	Not to be accounted for or explained <i>Are you to be considered unaccountable</i>
<b>unaccredited</b>	Lacking official approval <i>His teaching position is at an unaccredited theological seminary.</i>
<b>unaccustomed</b>	Not habituated to; unfamiliar with <i>He is timid and narcissistic, as well as unaccustomed to failure.</i>
<b>unachievable</b>	Impossible to achieve <i>An exact time bracketing has been unachievable at present.</i>
<b>unacknowledged</b>	Not openly acknowledged <i>Some of it is unacknowledged or steadfastly denied.</i>
<b>unacquainted</b>	Having little or no knowledge of <i>Brave men, you are not unacquainted with battle.</i>
<b>unacquisitive</b>	Not acquisitive; not interested in acquiring or owning anything
<b>unactable</b>	Not actable
<b>unadaptable</b>	Not adaptable
<b>unadapted</b>	Not changed in form or character for a purpose <i>Unadapted right branching nonterminals.</i>
<b>unaddicted</b>	Not addicted
<b>unaddressed</b>	Not addressed <i>The notability question remains unaddressed.</i>
<b>unadjustable</b>	Not adjustable <i>He has to be unswerving, uncompromising, and unadjustable.</i>
<b>unadjusted</b>	Not altered to fit certain requirements; <i>Biggest opening weekend gross of all time, unadjusted for inflation.</i>
<b>unadoptable</b>	Difficult to place in an adoptive home <i>It also operates a sanctuary for dogs that are unadoptable.</i>
<b>unadorned</b>	Not decorated with something to increase its beauty or distinction <i>It is a relatively unadorned and nasal style.</i>
<b>unadulterated</b>	Not mixed with impurities <i>It was and continues to be pure, unadulterated character assassination.</i>
<b>unadventurous</b>	Lacking in boldness <i>The repertoire may be unadventurous, but the playing is top class.</i>
<b>unadvisable</b>	Not prudent or wise; not recommended <i>To me, the alternative to coming here is unadvisable, at best.</i>

<b>unadvised</b>	Having received no information <i>The contributor of the text was not identified and so remained unadvised.</i>
<b>unaerated</b>	Not supplied with oxygen <i>The solution is usually gently aerated but may be unaerated.</i>
<b>unaesthetic</b>	Violating aesthetic canons or requirements; deficient in tastefulness or beauty <i>The search bar is essentially redundant and unaesthetic.</i>
<b>unaffected</b>	Emotionally unmoved <i>It is not a decease because the head is unaffected.</i>
<b>unaffecting</b>	Not arousing affect
<b>unaffectionate</b>	Lacking affection or warm feeling <i>Similarly, unaffectionate socialisation causes a tough minded attitude.</i>
<b>unaffiliated</b>	Not affiliated <i>They are entirely unaffiliated with us.</i>
<b>unaffixed</b>	Not affixed
<b>unafraid</b>	Oblivious of dangers or perils or calmly resolute in facing them <i>He was highly experienced and unafraid.</i>
<b>unaged</b>	Not subjected to an aging process <i>The new make spirit , or unaged whisky, is then placed in oak casks to mature.</i>
<b>unaggressive</b>	Not aggressive; not given to fighting or assertiveness <i>His experience and combativeness helped the small and unaggressive flyers team.</i>
<b>unagitated</b>	Not physically disturbed or set in motion <i>The third pond is unagitated and is quiet.</i>
<b>unaided</b>	Carried out without aid or assistance <i>In some cases, the architect can already assemble the end system unaided.</i>
<b>unaired</b>	Lacking fresh air <i>Musso was the unaired pilot only.</i>
<b>unairworthy</b>	Not fit to fly <i>If it were, it would be unairworthy.</i>
<b>unalarms</b>	Not alarming; assuaging alarm
<b>unalarm</b>	Not alert to what is potentially dangerous
<b>unalienable</b>	Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another <i>The simple, unalienable stance that i have is this.</i>
<b>unlike</b>	Not alike or similar <i>They turn out to be, in maya angelou's famous phrase, more alike than unlike.</i>
<b>unalloyed</b>	Free from admixture <i>Major assertions in the article are unalloyed by any verification whatsoever.</i>
<b>unalterable</b>	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times <i>The unalterable position seems to be your position.</i>

<b>unaltered</b>	Remaining in an original state <i>In fact, the size of the fleet remained unaltered until the mid 1990s.</i>
<b>unambiguous</b>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning- mario vargas llosa <i>The message from the representative of the wt society is clear and unambiguous.</i>
<b>unambitious</b>	Having little desire for success or achievement <i>The original plan was quite unambitious.</i>
<b>unamended</b>	Not amended <i>This page seems to have been quite badly vandalised, and then left unamended.</i>
<b>unanalyzable</b>	Representing the furthest possible extent of analysis or division into parts- g.s.brett-m.r.cohen <i>In epistemology, he suggests that the concept of knowledge is unanalyzable.</i>
<b>unanalyzed</b>	Not analyzed or broken down for detailed examination <i>The crucial features that define force are left unanalyzed.</i>
<b>unangry</b>	Not angry
<b>unanimated</b>	Not animated or enlivened; dull <i>However, they unilaterally remain muted and unanimated in regard to palestinians.</i>
<b>unanimous</b>	Acting together as a single undiversified whole <i>The final vote was unanimous in favor of the recommendation.</i>
<b>unannealed</b>	Not annealed and consequently easily cracked or fractured
<b>unannounced</b>	Without warning or announcement- m.a.d.howe <i>At that point, it's an unannounced match, not rumor.</i>
<b>unanswerable</b>	Impossible to answer <i>This is quite simply an unanswerable question.</i>
<b>unanswered</b>	Not returned in kind <i>But spain gamely bounced back into the game with 2 unanswered goals.</i>
<b>unanticipated</b>	Not anticipated- h.w.glidden <i>Fourth, there is the problem of unanticipated results.</i>
<b>unapologetic</b>	Unwilling to make or express an apology <i>They described it as unapologetic in its simplicity.</i>
<b>unappareled</b>	Having removed clothing
<b>unapparent</b>	Not readily apparent <i>The structure of the eyes are unapparent.</i>
<b>unappealable</b>	Not subject to appeal <i>The council's decisions are final and unappealable.</i>
<b>unappealing</b>	Tending to evoke antipathetic feelings <i>That said the display issue is unappealing.</i>
<b>unappeasable</b>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty <i>In him the universal plaint is most settled, unappeasable, and serious.</i>

<b>unappendaged</b>	Not having an appendage
<b>unappetising</b>	Not appetizing in appearance, aroma, or taste <i>The crust is a dull unappetising grey.</i>
<b>unappetizing</b>	Not appetizing in appearance, aroma, or taste <i>It's a good photo of an unappetizing tomato.</i>
<b>unappreciated</b>	Having value that is not acknowledged <i>Your overt hostility is unwarranted and unappreciated.</i>
<b>unappreciative</b>	Not likely to be rewarded <i>Both are unappreciated and result in pissing matches that are distasteful.</i>
<b>unapprehensive</b>	Not recognizing or slow to recognize danger
<b>unapproachable</b>	Discouraging intimacies; reserved <i>It's very unapproachable to the common man.</i>
<b>unarbitrary</b>	Not subject to individual determination
<b>unarguable</b>	Against which no argument can be made <i>Ds was a natural, unarguable law of pure science and mathematics.</i>
<b>unargumentative</b>	Not given to or characterized by argument
<b>unarmed</b>	Lacking barbs or stings or thorns <i>Carter kills the commandant in unarmed combat and frees the scientists.</i>
<b>unarmored</b>	Used of animals; without protective covering <i>They were unarmored and only lightly armed.</i>
<b>unarmoured</b>	Used of animals; without protective covering <i>On the roman side, jut the dalmatae and the mounted archers were unarmoured.</i>
<b>unarticulate</b>	Without or deprived of the use of speech or words
<b>unarticulated</b>	Uttered without the use of normal words or syllables <i>Assumptions are the often unarticulated beliefs that pervade and underpin social systems.</i>
<b>unartistic</b>	Lacking aesthetic sensibility; <i>But we talk on and on over unartistic details.</i>
<b>unary</b>	Consisting of or involving a single element or component <i>The advantage of unary templates is obvious.</i>
<b>unascertainable</b>	Not able to be ascertained; resisting discovery <i>I have removed that section because it is nothing but unascertainable innuendo.</i>
<b>unascrivable</b>	Not attributable
<b>unashamed</b>	Used of persons or their behavior; feeling no shame <i>He's also an unashamed monarchist.</i>
<b>unasked</b>	Not asked for <i>Anyway, that's my unasked for input.</i>

<b>unassailable</b>	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with <i>I had the intimate gut feeling the theory was unassailable.</i>
<b>unassertive</b>	Inclined to timidity or lack of self-confidence <i>Slocum was known as an unassertive, exceedingly careful, by the book officer.</i>
<b>unassignable</b>	Incapable of being transferred <i>This also implies the existence of many unassignable errors.</i>
<b>unassigned</b>	Not assigned <i>I never really got the point of the incoming unassigned cases in the template.</i>
<b>unassisted</b>	Unsupported by other people <i>All were able to leave the aircraft unassisted.</i>
<b>unassuming</b>	Not arrogant or presuming <i>He is utterly modest and unassuming.</i>
<b>unassured</b>	Lacking boldness or confidence
<b>unasterisked</b>	Not marked with an asterisk
<b>unattached</b>	Not fastened together <i>He was unattached to the society.</i>
<b>unattackable</b>	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with
<b>unattainable</b>	Impossible to achieve <i>That doesn't seem to be an unattainable goal.</i>
<b>unattended</b>	Lacking accompaniment or a guard or escort <i>The airport is unattended and is privately owned.</i>
<b>unattired</b>	Having removed clothing
<b>unattractive</b>	Not appealing to the senses <i>But by 1912, heavy traffic around the site made the houses unattractive.</i>
<b>unattributable</b>	Not attributable <i>Both gilligan and atts spoke to kelly on an unattributable basis.</i>
<b>unauthentic</b>	Intended to deceive <i>This has recently been shown to be unauthentic.</i>
<b>unauthorised</b>	Not endowed with authority <i>Does it hold the record for containing the most unauthorized fbi wiretaps</i>
<b>unauthorized</b>	Not endowed with authority <i>So was the interpretation of a 1993 letter that the casino was unauthorized.</i>
<b>unavailable</b>	Not available or accessible or at hand <i>In the meantime, why is the dhimmi article sporadically unavailable</i>
<b>unavailing</b>	Producing no result or effect <i>His attempts to persuade her were unavailing.</i>
<b>unavenged</b>	For which vengeance has not been taken <i>This disaster remained unavenged for nearly seventeen years.</i>
<b>unavoidable</b>	Impossible to avoid or evade: <i>Minimizing the moving mass also reduces the unavoidable wear on the records.</i>



<b>unavowed</b>	Not affirmed or mentioned or declared
<b>unawakened</b>	Still asleep <i>The buddha's skandhas are said to be incomprehensible to unawakened vision.</i>
<b>unaware</b>	Not aware <i>I was unaware of the injunction.</i>
<b>unawed</b>	Not awed
<b>unbacked</b>	Unsupported by other people <i>Sorry about the unbacked up edit.</i>
<b>unbaffled</b>	Not perplexed by conflicting situations or statements
<b>unbalanced</b>	Affected with madness or insanity <i>The second half of the article is still very unbalanced.</i>
<b>unbalconied</b>	Not having balconies
<b>unbanded</b>	Not identified with a band <i>A heading mechanism is provided to square an unbanded bale push into the press.</i>
<b>unbaptised</b>	Not having undergone the christian ritual of baptism <i>For unbaptised sikhs it certainly isn't compulsory.</i>
<b>unbaptized</b>	Not having undergone the christian ritual of baptism <i>To say that the church believes the unbaptized will go to hell is misleading.</i>
<b>unbarred</b>	Not firmly fastened or secured <i>I'm thinking just one, unbarred spiral.</i>
<b>unbarreled</b>	Not in a barrel
<b>unbarrelled</b>	Not in a barrel
<b>unbearable</b>	Incapable of being put up with <i>This is the unbearable lightness of being postmodern.</i>
<b>unbeatable</b>	Hard to defeat <i>However, that was already the reign of the unbeatable italian blue team.</i>
<b>unbeaten</b>	Not conquered <i>In 2008 they went unbeaten and are so far unbeaten in the 2009 season.</i>
<b>unbecoming</b>	Not in keeping with accepted standards of what is right or proper in polite society <i>It is unbecoming to attack an editor and not the edits.</i>
<b>unbefitting</b>	Not befitting <i>There is surely something wrong and unbefitting in that type of conduct.</i>
<b>unbeholden</b>	Free of moral obligation <i>Sometimes, we need a body of government unbeholden to public opinion.</i>
<b>unbeknown</b>	Occurring or existing without the knowledge of <i>It is unbeknown to me why i must beguile such force.</i>
<b>unbeknownst</b>	Occurring or existing without the knowledge of <i>Unbeknownst to them, it's all a trap.</i>

<b>unbelievable</b>	Beyond belief or understanding <i>He illumined the world with his unbelievable inventions.</i>
<b>unbelieving</b>	Holding that only material phenomena can be known and knowledge of spiritual matters or ultimate causes is impossible <i>Israel is a temporary unbelieving picture of the people of god.</i>
<b>unbeloved</b>	Unhappy in love; suffering from unrequited love
<b>unbelted</b>	Lacking a belt <i>Such occupants are frequently ejected or found unbelted inside the car.</i>
<b>unbendable</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable <i>As it says often on the site, the rules are not unbendable.</i>
<b>unbending</b>	Incapable of adapting or changing to meet circumstances <i>Despite his unbending resistance, his state fell to an innings defeat.</i>
<b>unbeneficed</b>	Not having a benefice
<b>unbent</b>	Erect in posture <i>That was from an earlier discussion, and sts has unbent somewhat.</i>
<b>unbiased</b>	Without bias <i>Disabuse yourself of the notion that you have an unbiased reading.</i>
<b>unbiassed</b>	Without bias <i>I question the allegedly unbiased opinions in the article.</i>
<b>unbigoted</b>	Not opinionated
<b>unbitter</b>	Having or showing no resentment or desire for revenge
<b>unbleached</b>	Not artificially colored or bleached <i>Environmentally friendly toilet paper may also be unbleached.</i>
<b>unblemished</b>	Free from physical or moral spots or stains <i>Not a self purported honourable endeavour to keep wiki unblemished.</i>
<b>unblended</b>	Not blended or mixed together <i>It can also appear unblended, in which case it may be labeled blanc de noirs.</i>
<b>unblessed</b>	Not provided with something desirable <i>The result will be unblessed chaos.</i>
<b>unblinking</b>	Not shrinking from danger <i>Across from it, hugh the hand and the dog watch her with unblinking eyes.</i>
<b>unbloody</b>	Achieved without bloodshed
<b>unblushing</b>	Feeling no shame
<b>unbodied</b>	Having no body
<b>unbolted</b>	Not firmly fastened or secured <i>The tail can be unbolted and let down, then have a barrel rolled on.</i>
<b>unbooked</b>	Not reserved in advance

<b>unbordered</b>	Having no border <i>The images are unbordered right now and should stay that way.</i>
<b>unborn</b>	Not yet brought into existence <i>Appropriately, the cover of the album depicts a sketch of an unborn baby.</i>
<b>unbound</b>	Not restrained or tied down by bonds <i>Compound of unbound with suffix i.</i>
<b>unbounded</b>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent <i>A month later, it was judged to be finite but unbounded.</i>
<b>unbowed</b>	Erect in posture <i>Selvin and the unconditional solution stand unbowed.</i>
<b>unbraced</b>	Without braces or props
<b>unbrainwashed</b>	Not successfully subjected to brainwashing
<b>unbranched</b>	Without branches <i>It is typically self supporting and unbranched.</i>
<b>unbranching</b>	Without branches <i>A related unbranching architecture is a ring polymer.</i>
<b>unbranded</b>	Not marked with a brand <i>Supermarkets and bargain stores in europe sell unbranded tennis balls.</i>
<b>unbreakable</b>	Impossible to break especially under ordinary usage <i>Yet she's tied to him for life, both of them caught in an unbreakable mate bond.</i>
<b>unbridgeable</b>	Not bridgeable <i>The article talks about irreconcilable differences and an unbridgeable schism.</i>
<b>unbridled</b>	Not restrained or controlled <i>Caliban planted their roots in the scene with unbridled metalcore.</i>
<b>unbroken</b>	Not broken; whole and intact; in one piece <i>The costa is unbroken and the sub costa is apparent on the insect.</i>
<b>unbrushed</b>	Not brushed
<b>unburdened</b>	Not encumbered with a physical burden or load <i>There is more of a focus on feeling, and automatism is unburdened with meaning.</i>
<b>unburied</b>	Not buried <i>They disposed of their shares of the unburied treasure diversely.</i>
<b>unburnished</b>	Of metals e.g.; not made shiny and smooth by friction
<b>unbuttoned</b>	Not under constraint in action or expression- curtis bok <i>Easiest choice is a casual shirt worn underneath but then unbuttoned.</i>
<b>uncamphorated</b>	Not containing camphor
<b>uncanny</b>	Suggesting the operation of supernatural influences- john galsworthy <i>In fact, the two share uncanny similarities.</i>

<b>uncapped</b>	Used especially of front teeth <i>All modes can be capped at 15bps or completely uncapped.</i>
<b>uncarbonated</b>	Not having carbonation
<b>uncaring</b>	Lacking affection or warm feeling <i>Eudoxia's maker was very cold and uncaring.</i>
<b>uncarpeted</b>	Not carpeted
<b>uncarved</b>	Not carved <i>In uncarved simplicity the people attain their true nature.</i>
<b>uncastrated</b>	Not castrated <i>Bulls uncastrated males are also used in many parts of the world.</i>
<b>uncategorised</b>	Not categorized or sorted <i>Lots of these are now transferred but are uncategorised.</i>
<b>uncategorized</b>	Not categorized or sorted <i>And, yes, it may also be uncategorized.</i>
<b>uncaulked</b>	Not caulked or sealed
<b>uncaused</b>	Having no cause or apparent cause <i>There is still some aspect of the choice that is uncaused.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely <i>I appreciate your unceasing work very much.</i>
<b>uncensored</b>	Not subject to censorship <i>This is the true story of the student bar uncensored</i>
<b>unceremonial</b>	Without ceremony or formality
<b>unceremonious</b>	Without ceremony or formality <i>So their destruction was necessarily unceremonious and brief.</i>
