- *Capable of being regulated.*
- *Capable of being changed so as to match or fit.*



Synonyms of "Adjustable" as an adjective (8 Words)

- accommodating** Obliging; willing to do favors.
*The warden was always **accommodating** in allowing visitors in.*
- adaptable** Able to adjust to new conditions.
*The frame was **adaptable** to cloth bolts of different widths.*
- alterable** (of the punishment ordered by a court) capable of being changed to one less severe.
- convertible** Able to be changed in form, function, or character.
*A formal commitment by the East European countries to **convertible** currencies.*
- modifiable** Capable of being modified in form or character or strength (especially by making less extreme) - Alexis Carrel.
- multiway** Having several paths, routes, or channels.
*A **multiway** switch.*

variable

Not consistent or having a fixed pattern; liable to change.
Variable winds.

versatile

Able to adapt or be adapted to many different functions or activities.
An insect's **versatile** antennae can move up and down or laterally.



Usage Examples of "Adjustable" as an adjective

- *Adjustable seat belts.*
- *An adjustable spanner.*
- *The car has fully adjustable seats and steering wheel.*
- *Adjustable interest rates.*

elastic	A fabric made of yarns containing an elastic material. <i>A youthful and elastic walk.</i>
environment	The area in which something exists or lives. <i>Survival in an often hostile environment.</i>
flexibility	The property of being flexible; easily bent or shaped. <i>He enjoyed the flexibility of his working arrangement.</i>
<u>flexible</u>	Bending and snapping back readily without breaking. <i>Flexible rubber seals.</i>
<u>impressionable</u>	Easily impressed or influenced. <i>An impressionable youngster.</i>
limber	Attach the limber. <i>Limber a cannon.</i>
<u>malleable</u>	Easily influenced; pliable. <i>A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
plasticity	The adaptability of an organism to changes in its environment or differences between its various habitats. <i>Fine clay at the right degree of plasticity is more useful.</i>
<u>pliable</u>	Able to adjust readily to different conditions. <i>Pliable teenage minds.</i>
pliant	Able to adjust readily to different conditions. <i>A more pliant prime minister.</i>
readjust	Adjust or adapt to a changed situation. <i>After moving back to America he had to readjust.</i>
responsiveness	The quality of reacting quickly and positively. <i>A bank s responsiveness to customer problems engenders trust.</i>
saddle	Put a saddle on a horse. <i>He s saddled with debts of 12 million.</i>
setting	The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event. <i>If you find the room getting too hot check the thermostat setting.</i>
stanchion	An upright bar, post, or frame forming a support or barrier.
strap	Sharpen with a strap. <i>The children were strapped into their car seats.</i>
<u>susceptible</u>	(often followed by `of' or `to') yielding readily to or capable of. <i>Patients with liver disease may be susceptible to infection.</i>
tensile	Capable of being drawn out or stretched. <i>A tensile steel rod.</i>
thermostat	Control the temperature with a thermostat.

- tractability** The trait of being easily persuaded.
- tractable** (of a person) easy to control or influence.
*The natives being of an intelligent **tractable** disposition.*
- versatile** Changeable; inconstant.
*A **versatile** writer.*
- warp** In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth.
*The **warp** or muddy deposit dug from an old riverbed.*
- waxy** Easily impressed or influenced.
*Careful the floor is **waxy**.*
