<b><u>applaud</u></b>	Show strong approval of (a person or action); praise. <i>His speech was loudly <b>applauded</b>.</i>
<b>commend</b>	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. <i>As they set out on their journey I <b>commend</b> them to your care.</i>

<b>creditable</b>	Worthy of often limited commendation. <i>A very <b>creditable</b> 2 4 defeat.</i>
<b>eminent</b>	(of a positive quality) present to a notable degree. <i>An <b>eminent</b> peak.</i>

<b>estimable</b>	Deserving of respect or high regard. <i><b>Estimable</b> assets.</i>
<b>excellent</b>	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>Made an <b>excellent</b> speech.</i>
<u><b>fame</b></u>	The state or quality of being widely honored and acclaimed. <i>The song's success rocketed him to stardom and <b>fame</b>.</i>
<b>glorious</b>	Very enjoyable. <i>A <b>glorious</b> autumn day.</i>
<u><b>glory</b></u>	A luminous ring or halo, especially as depicted around the head of Christ or a saint. <i>The <b>glory</b> of the sunrise.</i>
<b>good</b>	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>Too much sun is not <b>good</b> for you.</i>
<u><b>honorable</b></u>	Deserving of esteem and respect. <i><b>Honorable</b> service to his country.</i>
<b>honored</b>	Having an illustrious reputation; respected.
<b>laudable</b>	(of an action, idea, or aim) deserving praise and commendation. <i><b>Laudable</b> motives of improving housing conditions.</i>
<b>outstanding</b>	Not yet paid, resolved, or dealt with. <i>Much of the work is still <b>outstanding</b>.</i>
<b>praiseworthy</b>	Deserving approval and admiration. <i>A significant and <b>praiseworthy</b> increase in computer intelligence.</i>
<b>prestigious</b>	Inspiring respect and admiration; having high status. <i>A <b>prestigious</b> academic post.</i>
<u><b>reputable</b></u>	Having a good reputation. <i>A <b>reputable</b> wine.</i>
<u><b>respectable</b></u>	Of some merit or importance. <i>They thought the stage no life for a <b>respectable</b> lady.</i>
<u><b>respected</b></u>	Deeply admired or esteemed. <i>A <b>respected</b> family.</i>
<b>respectful</b>	Feeling or showing deference and respect. <i><b>Respectful</b> behavior.</i>
<b>splendid</b>	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>A <b>splendid</b> view of Windsor Castle.</i>
<u><b>surprising</b></u>	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>She earned a <b>surprising</b> amount of money.</i>
