- addict** A person who is addicted to a particular substance typically an illegal drug.  
*A self confessed chocolate **addict**.*
- adherent** Someone who supports a particular party, person, or set of ideas.  
*He was a strong **adherent** of monetarism.*
- adorer** Someone who admires a young woman.

<b>aficionado</b>	A serious devotee of some particular music genre or musical performer. <i>A crossword <b>aficionado</b>.</i>
<b>beau</b>	A man who is the lover of a man or woman.
<b>beloved</b>	A beloved person used as terms of endearment. <i>He watched his <b>beloved</b> from afar.</i>
<b>booster</b>	A person who backs a politician or a team etc. <i>Job fairs are a great morale <b>booster</b>.</i>
<b>boyfriend</b>	Denoting an item of clothing for a woman or girl that is designed to be loose-fitting or slightly oversized. <i>When the law changed Pet could finally married his long time <b>boyfriend</b> Jim.</i>
<b>champion</b>	A person who vigorously supports or defends a person or cause. <i>He became the determined <b>champion</b> of a free press.</i>
<b>devotee</b>	A person who is very interested in and enthusiastic about someone or something. <i><b>Devotees</b> of Krishna.</i>
<b>disciple</b>	A follower or pupil of a teacher, leader, or philosopher. <i>A <b>disciple</b> of Rousseau.</i>
<b>enthusiast</b>	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. <i>A sports car <b>enthusiast</b>.</i>
<b>fan</b>	A thing resembling an open fan. <i><b>Fan</b> vaulting.</i>
<b>fanatic</b>	A person with an obsessive interest in and enthusiasm for a particular activity. <i>A <b>fanatic</b> is one who can t change his mind and won t change the subject.</i>
<b>follower</b>	A person who supports and admires a particular person or set of ideas. <i>She remains an immensely divisive figure but she has a million <b>followers</b> on Facebook.</i>
<b>friend</b>	(used as a polite form of address or in ironic reference) an acquaintance or a stranger one comes across. <i>She s a <b>friend</b> of mine.</i>
<b>girlfriend</b>	A person's regular female companion with whom they have a romantic or sexual relationship. <i>His <b>girlfriend</b> kicked him out.</i>
<b>lady friend</b>	A polite name for any woman.
<b>lady love</b>	A polite name for any woman.
<b>love</b>	A personified figure of love often represented as Cupid. <i>He hadn t had any <b>love</b> in months.</i>

- lover** A person who likes or enjoys a specified thing.  
*I think she had a secret **lover**.*
- man friend** A male person who plays a significant role (husband or lover or boyfriend) in the life of a particular woman.
- protagonist** An advocate or champion of a particular cause or idea.  
*The hard boiled **protagonist** of the movie Blade Runner.*
- suitor** A man who pursues a relationship with a particular woman, with a view to marriage.  
*She decided to marry her **suitor**.*
- supporter** Someone who supports or champions something.  
*An Oxford United **supporter**.*
- sweetheart** A particularly lovable or pleasing person or thing.  
*He s a **sweetheart**.*
- votary** A priest or priestess (or consecrated worshipper) in a non-Christian religion or cult.  
*A **votary** of Aphrodite.*
- wooper** The hard fibrous lignified substance under the bark of trees.
- worshipper** A person who feels great admiration or devotion for someone or something.  
*Three thousand **worshippers** attend the mosque.*
- young lady** United States jazz tenor saxophonist (1909-1959).
- young man** Any immature animal.
- zealot** A person who is fanatical and uncompromising in pursuit of their religious, political, or other ideals.

- agog** Very eager or curious to hear or see something.  
*I m all **agog**.*
- ardent** Characterized by strong enthusiasm.  
***Ardent** revolutionaries.*
- booster** An amplifier for restoring the strength of a transmitted signal.  
*A **booster** injection.*
- buff** A soft thick undyed leather from the skins of e g buffalo or oxen.  
*Swimming in the **buff** means to swim naked.*
- devote** Set aside or apart for a specific purpose or use.  
*The hostile army was **devoted** with dire execrations to the gods of war.*

<b>devotee</b>	A strong believer in a particular religion or god. <i>Devotees of Krishna.</i>
<b><u>disciple</u></b>	A follower or pupil of a teacher, leader, or philosopher. A <b>disciple</b> of Rousseau.
<b>drastically</b>	In a way that is likely to have a strong or far-reaching effect. <i>Management layers will be <b>drastically</b> reduced.</i>
<b>earnest</b>	Sincerely earnest. <i>Both sides were deeply in <b>earnest</b> even passionate.</i>
<b>enthusiast</b>	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. A sports car <b>enthusiast</b> .
<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing great excitement and interest. An <b>enthusiastic</b> response.
<b>enthusiastically</b>	With enthusiasm; in an enthusiastic manner. <i>The audience applauded <b>enthusiastically</b>.</i>
<b><u>fan</u></b>	A fan shaped alluvial or talus deposit at the foot of a slope. <i>Fan vaulting.</i>
<b>fanatic</b>	A person with an obsessive interest in and enthusiasm for a particular activity. <i>A <b>fanatic</b> is one who can't change his mind and won't change the subject.</i>
<b><u>fanaticism</u></b>	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>The dangers of religious <b>fanaticism</b>.</i>
<b><u>fervent</u></b>	(archaic) extremely hot, burning, or glowing. A <b>fervent</b> admirer.
<b>fervid</b>	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. <i>His <b>fervid</b> protestations of love.</i>
<b>heartily</b>	To a great degree; very (especially with reference to personal feelings). <i>She laughed <b>heartily</b>.</i>
<b><u>impassioned</u></b>	Characterized by intense emotion. An <b>impassioned</b> appeal.
<b><u>lover</u></b>	An ardent follower and admirer. <i>They had been <b>lovers</b> for years.</i>
<b>passion</b>	A state or outburst of strong emotion. <i>A man of impetuous <b>passion</b>.</i>
<b>passionate</b>	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>He's <b>passionate</b> about football.</i>

<b>passionately</b>	In a way that shows strong feelings or beliefs. <i>Ruth was <b>passionately</b> interested in politics.</i>
<b><u>rabid</u></b>	Having or proceeding from an extreme or fanatical support of or belief in something. <i>The show s small but <b>rabid</b> fan base.</i>
<b>supporter</b>	A person who is actively interested in and wishes success for a particular sports team. <i>All their <b>supporters</b> came out for the game.</i>
<b>torrid</b>	Full of passion arising from sexual love. <i>A <b>torrid</b> dance.</i>
<b>votary</b>	A devoted (almost religiously so) adherent of a cause or person or activity. <i>A <b>votary</b> of Aphrodite.</i>
<b>zealot</b>	A member of an ancient Jewish sect in Judea in the first century who fought to the death against the Romans and who killed or persecuted Jews who collaborated with the Romans.
<b>zealotry</b>	Fanatical and uncompromising pursuit of religious, political, or other ideals; fanaticism. <i>He expressed concern about religious <b>zealotry</b> playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
<b><u>zealous</u></b>	Having or showing zeal. <i>The council was extremely <b>zealous</b> in the application of the regulations.</i>
