- appealing** (of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings.  
*An **appealing** sense of humor.*
- attractive** Pleasing to the eye or mind especially through beauty or charm.  
*An **attractive** personality.*
- beautiful** Delighting the senses or exciting intellectual or emotional admiration.  
*A **beautiful** young woman.*
- bewitching** Enchanting or delightful.  
*I gazed deeply into the most **bewitching** blue eyes.*
- captivating** Capturing interest as if by a spell.  
*Roosevelt was a **captivating** speaker.*
- charming** Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare.  
*A **charming** country cottage.*

<b>cute</b>	Attractive especially by means of smallness or prettiness or quaintness. <i>Ryan s <b>cute</b> but he s kinda young.</i>
<b><u>darling</u></b>	Dearly loved. <i>His <b>darling</b> wife.</i>
<b><u>dear</u></b>	Endearing sweet. <i>My sisters and brothers are near and <b>dear</b>.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>The comedy was <b>delightful</b>.</i>
<b><u>enchanting</u></b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i><b>Enchanting</b> views.</i>
<b><u>endearing</u></b>	Inspiring affection. <i>An <b>endearing</b> little grin.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Charming and attractive. <i>An <b>engaging</b> frankness.</i>
<b>fetching</b>	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A <b>fetching</b> little garment of pink satin.</i>
<b>gorgeous</b>	Very pleasant or enjoyable. <i>A <b>gorgeous</b> Victorian gown.</i>
<b>lovable</b>	Having characteristics that attract love or affection. <i>A naughty but <b>lovable</b> child.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Lovable especially in a childlike or naive way. <i>How <b>lovely</b> to see you.</i>
<b>pleasing</b>	Pleasant or agreeable to the senses. <i>The <b>pleasing</b> austerity of the surroundings.</i>
<b>precious</b>	Used for emphasis, often in an ironic context. <i>Children are <b>precious</b>.</i>
<b><u>sweet</u></b>	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>The <b>sweet</b> face of a child.</i>
<b>winning</b>	Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition. <i>A <b>winning</b> personality.</i>
<b>winsome</b>	Attractive or appealing in a fresh, innocent way. <i>A <b>winsome</b> smile.</i>

<b>adore</b>	Love intensely. <i>He <b>adored</b> his mother.</i>
<b>alluring</b>	Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive. <i>The town offers <b>alluring</b> shops and restaurants.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	Relating to attraction between physical objects. <i>The job is <b>attractive</b> because of the pay.</i>
<b>baby</b>	Treat someone as a baby pamper or be overprotective towards. <i>Stop being a <b>baby</b>.</i>
<b>beautiful</b>	(of weather) highly enjoyable. <i>She spoke in <b>beautiful</b> English.</i>
<b>beautifully</b>	Very well; excellently. <i>A <b>beautifully</b> illustrated book.</i>
<b>charming</b>	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. <i>A <b>charming</b> personality.</i>
<b>coddle</b>	Cook in nearly boiling water. <i>I was <b>coddled</b> and cosseted.</i>
<b>cosset</b>	Care for and protect in an overindulgent way. <i>All her life she d been <b>cosseted</b> by her family.</i>
<b>cuddly</b>	Denoting a toy, especially a model of an animal, that is padded or spongy and covered in soft fabric. <i>A <b>cuddly</b> teddybear.</i>
<b>cute</b>	Sexually attractive; good-looking. <i>A <b>cute</b> guy.</i>
<b>darling</b>	A special loved one. <i>A <b>darling</b> little pillbox hat.</i>
<b>dear</b>	Dearly loved. <i>He is very <b>dear</b> to me.</i>
<b>dolly</b>	A small platform on wheels used for holding heavy objects, typically film or television cameras. <i>He fumbled a <b>dolly</b> at slip.</i>
<b>dote</b>	A sweet or adorable person. <i>The parson is now old and <b>dots</b>.</i>
<b>enchanted</b>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked <b>enchanted</b>.</i>
<b>eros</b>	(Greek mythology) god of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.

<b>glamorize</b>	Interpret romantically. <i>This new wallpaper really <b>glamorizes</b> the living room.</i>
<b>gorgeous</b>	Dazzlingly beautiful. <i>The weather was <b>gorgeous</b>.</i>
<b>handsome</b>	(of a number, sum of money, or margin) substantial. <i>He was elected by a <b>handsome</b> majority.</i>
<b><u>hug</u></b>	Fit closely or tightly. <i>A boy <b>hugging</b> a secret.</i>
<b>kitten</b>	Give birth to kittens. <i>Our cat <b>kittened</b> again this year.</i>
<b>lovable</b>	Having characteristics that attract love or affection. <i>A mischievous but <b>lovable</b> child.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>She looked <b>lovely</b>.</i>
<b>ma'am</b>	A woman of refinement.
<b>maiden</b>	(of an older woman) unmarried. <i>Two knights fought to win the hand of a fair <b>maiden</b>.</i>
<b><u>pamper</u></b>	Indulge with every attention, comfort, and kindness; spoil. <i>Grandparents often <b>pamper</b> the children.</i>
<b>pup</b>	Give birth to a puppy. <i>You saucy young <b>pup</b>.</i>
<b><u>tempt</u></b>	Risk provoking (a deity or abstract force), usually with undesirable consequences. <i>He was <b>tempted</b> out of retirement to save the team from relegation.</i>
