- attractive** Pleasing to the eye or mind especially through beauty or charm.
*An **attractive** personality.*
- beautiful** Delighting the senses or exciting intellectual or emotional admiration.
*A **beautiful** young woman.*
- bewitching** Enchanting or delightful.
*I gazed deeply into the most **bewitching** blue eyes.*
- captivating** Capturing interest as if by a spell.
*Roosevelt was a **captivating** speaker.*
- charming** Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare.
*A **charming** country cottage.*

cute	Attractive especially by means of smallness or prettiness or quaintness. <i>Ryan s cute but he s kinda young.</i>
<u>darling</u>	Dearly loved. <i>His darling wife.</i>
<u>dear</u>	Endearing sweet. <i>My sisters and brothers are near and dear.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>The comedy was delightful.</i>
<u>enchancing</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Enchancing views.</i>
<u>endearing</u>	Inspiring affection. <i>An endearing little grin.</i>
engaging	Charming and attractive. <i>An engaging frankness.</i>
fetching	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A fetching little garment of pink satin.</i>
gorgeous	Very pleasant or enjoyable. <i>A gorgeous Victorian gown.</i>
lovable	Having characteristics that attract love or affection. <i>A naughty but lovable child.</i>
lovely	Lovable especially in a childlike or naive way. <i>How lovely to see you.</i>
pleasing	Pleasant or agreeable to the senses. <i>The pleasing austerity of the surroundings.</i>
precious	Used for emphasis, often in an ironic context. <i>Children are precious.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>The sweet face of a child.</i>
winning	Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition. <i>A winning personality.</i>
winsome	Attractive or appealing in a fresh, innocent way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>

adore	Love intensely. <i>He adored his mother.</i>
alluring	Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive. <i>The town offers alluring shops and restaurants.</i>
attractive	Relating to attraction between physical objects. <i>The job is attractive because of the pay.</i>
baby	Treat someone as a baby pamper or be overprotective towards. <i>Stop being a baby.</i>
beautiful	(of weather) highly enjoyable. <i>She spoke in beautiful English.</i>
beautifully	Very well; excellently. <i>A beautifully illustrated book.</i>
charming	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. <i>A charming personality.</i>
coddle	Cook in nearly boiling water. <i>I was coddled and cosseted.</i>
cosset	Care for and protect in an overindulgent way. <i>All her life she d been cosseted by her family.</i>
cuddly	Denoting a toy, especially a model of an animal, that is padded or spongy and covered in soft fabric. <i>A cuddly teddybear.</i>
cute	Sexually attractive; good-looking. <i>A cute guy.</i>
darling	A special loved one. <i>A darling little pillbox hat.</i>
dear	Dearly loved. <i>He is very dear to me.</i>
dolly	A small platform on wheels used for holding heavy objects, typically film or television cameras. <i>He fumbled a dolly at slip.</i>
dote	A sweet or adorable person. <i>The parson is now old and dotes.</i>
enchanting	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked enchanting.</i>
eros	(Greek mythology) god of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.

glamorize	Interpret romantically. <i>This new wallpaper really glamorizes the living room.</i>
gorgeous	Dazzlingly beautiful. <i>The weather was gorgeous.</i>
handsome	(of a number, sum of money, or margin) substantial. <i>He was elected by a handsome majority.</i>
<u>hug</u>	Fit closely or tightly. <i>A boy hugging a secret.</i>
kitten	Give birth to kittens. <i>Our cat kittened again this year.</i>
lovable	Having characteristics that attract love or affection. <i>A mischievous but lovable child.</i>
lovely	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>She looked lovely.</i>
ma'am	A woman of refinement.
maiden	(of an older woman) unmarried. <i>Two knights fought to win the hand of a fair maiden.</i>
<u>pamper</u>	Indulge with every attention, comfort, and kindness; spoil. <i>Grandparents often pamper the children.</i>
pup	Give birth to a puppy. <i>You saucy young pup.</i>
<u>tempt</u>	Risk provoking (a deity or abstract force), usually with undesirable consequences. <i>He was tempted out of retirement to save the team from relegation.</i>
