<b>care</b>	A cause for feeling concern. <i>No medical <b>care</b> was required.</i>
<b><u>devotion</u></b>	Feelings of ardent love. <i>The order's aim was to live a life of <b>devotion</b>.</i>
<b>esteem</b>	An attitude of admiration or esteem. <i>It is held in <b>esteem</b>.</i>
<b>exaltation</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion. <i>The <b>exaltation</b> of the army as a place for brotherhood.</i>
<b>extolment</b>	An expression of approval and commendation.
<b>fondness</b>	A positive feeling of liking. <i>I remember him with great <b>fondness</b>.</i>

<b>glorification</b>	The practice of acknowledging and revealing the glory of God by one's actions. <i>A romantic <b>glorification</b> of the past.</i>
<b>glory</b>	Magnificence or great beauty. <i>The <b>glory</b> of the sunrise.</i>
<b>homage</b>	Respectful deference. <i>Daniel s films were a <b>homage</b> to her.</i>
<b>idolisation</b>	The act of admiring strongly.
<b>idolization</b>	The act of admiring strongly.
<b>latria</b>	The worship given to God alone.
<b>laud</b>	Praise. <i>All glory <b>laud</b> and honour to Thee Redeemer King.</i>
<b>love</b>	A person or thing that one loves. <i>She was the <b>love</b> of his life.</i>
<b>pay homage to</b>	Something that remunerates.
<b>pay tribute to</b>	Something that remunerates.
<b>praise</b>	The expression of respect and gratitude as an act of worship. <i>He always appreciated <b>praise</b> for his work.</i>
<b>revere</b>	American silversmith remembered for his midnight ride (celebrated in a poem by Longfellow) to warn the colonists in Lexington and Concord that British troops were coming (1735-1818).
<b>reverence</b>	An act showing respect (especially a bow or curtsy). <i>The Chinese <b>reverence</b> for the dead.</i>
<b>revering</b>	American silversmith remembered for his midnight ride (celebrated in a poem by Longfellow) to warn the colonists in Lexington and Concord that British troops were coming (1735-1818).
<b>thanksgiving</b>	(in North America) an annual national holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal. The holiday commemorates a harvest festival celebrated by the Pilgrim Fathers in 1621, and is held in the US on the fourth Thursday in November. A similar holiday is held in Canada, usually on the second Monday in October. <i>He offered prayers in <b>thanksgiving</b> for his safe arrival.</i>
<b>veneration</b>	A feeling of profound respect for someone or something. <i>The traditional <b>veneration</b> of saints.</i>
<b>warmth</b>	The trait of being intensely emotional. <i>She smiled with real <b>warmth</b>.</i>

**Worship** of the Mother Goddess.

<b>canonize</b>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) officially declare (a dead person) to be a saint. <i>He <b>canonizes</b> women.</i>
<b>commend</b>	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. <i>His paintings <b>commend</b> him to the artistic world.</i>
<b><u>deference</u></b>	Polite submission and respect. <i>He addressed her with the <b>deference</b> due to age.</i>
<b>esteem</b>	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>Many of these qualities are <b>esteemed</b> by managers.</i>
<b>favorite</b>	Something regarded with special favor or liking. <i>That book is one of my <b>favorites</b>.</i>
<b><u>glowing</u></b>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i><b>Glowing</b> praise.</i>
<b><u>homage</u></b>	Formal public acknowledgement of feudal allegiance. <i>Daniel s films were a <b>homage</b> to her.</i>
<b>honor</b>	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>A man of <b>honor</b>.</i>
<b><u>idol</u></b>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>A soccer <b>idol</b>.</i>
<b>idolatry</b>	Religious zeal; the willingness to serve God. <i>We must not allow our <b>idolatry</b> of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
<b><u>idolize</u></b>	Love unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol. <i>He <b>idolized</b> his mother.</i>
<b>laud</b>	Praise. <i>The obituary <b>lauded</b> him as a great statesman and soldier.</i>
<b>obeisance</b>	A gesture expressing deferential respect, such as a bow or curtsy. <i>They paid <b>obeisance</b> to the Prince.</i>
<b>praise</b>	Offering words of homage as an act of worship. <i>Give <b>praise</b> to God.</i>
<b>respect</b>	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i><b>Respect</b> to Hill for a truly non superficial piece on the techno scene.</i>
<b>respectful</b>	Full of or exhibiting respect. <i><b>Respectful</b> behavior.</i>



<b>revere</b>	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>C zanne s still lifes were <b>revered</b> by his contemporaries.</i>
<b>reverence</b>	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>The messenger made his <b>reverence</b>.</i>
<b>savior</b>	A person who rescues you from harm or danger.
<b>venerate</b>	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>We <b>venerate</b> genius.</i>
<b>veneration</b>	Great respect; reverence. <i>The traditional <b>veneration</b> of saints.</i>
