latria	The worship given to God alone.
laud	Praise. <i>All glory laud and honour to Thee Redeemer King.</i>
love	A person or thing that one loves. <i>She was the love of his life.</i>
pay homage to	Something that remunerates.
pay tribute to	Something that remunerates.
praise	The expression of respect and gratitude as an act of worship. <i>He always appreciated praise for his work.</i>
revere	American silversmith remembered for his midnight ride (celebrated in a poem by Longfellow) to warn the colonists in Lexington and Concord that British troops were coming (1735-1818).
reverence	An act showing respect (especially a bow or curtsy). <i>The Chinese reverence for the dead.</i>
revering	American silversmith remembered for his midnight ride (celebrated in a poem by Longfellow) to warn the colonists in Lexington and Concord that British troops were coming (1735-1818).
thanksgiving	(in North America) an annual national holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal. The holiday commemorates a harvest festival celebrated by the Pilgrim Fathers in 1621, and is held in the US on the fourth Thursday in November. A similar holiday is held in Canada, usually on the second Monday in October. <i>He offered prayers in thanksgiving for his safe arrival.</i>
veneration	A feeling of profound respect for someone or something. <i>The traditional veneration of saints.</i>
warmth	The trait of being intensely emotional. <i>She smiled with real warmth.</i>

The activity of worshipping.
Worship of the Mother Goddess.

canonize	(in the Roman Catholic Church) officially declare (a dead person) to be a saint. <i>He canonizes women.</i>
commend	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. <i>His paintings commend him to the artistic world.</i>
<u>deference</u>	Polite submission and respect. <i>He addressed her with the deference due to age.</i>
esteem	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>Many of these qualities are esteemed by managers.</i>
favorite	Something regarded with special favor or liking. <i>That book is one of my favorites.</i>
<u>glowing</u>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>Glowing praise.</i>
<u>homage</u>	Formal public acknowledgement of feudal allegiance. <i>Daniel s films were a homage to her.</i>
honor	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>A man of honor.</i>
<u>idol</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>A soccer idol.</i>
idolatry	Religious zeal; the willingness to serve God. <i>We must not allow our idolatry of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
<u>idolize</u>	Love unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol. <i>He idolized his mother.</i>
laud	Praise. <i>The obituary lauded him as a great statesman and soldier.</i>
obeisance	A gesture expressing deferential respect, such as a bow or curtsy. <i>They paid obeisance to the Prince.</i>
praise	Offering words of homage as an act of worship. <i>Give praise to God.</i>
respect	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>Respect to Hill for a truly non superficial piece on the techno scene.</i>
respectful	Full of or exhibiting respect. <i>Respectful behavior.</i>

revere	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>C zanne s still lifes were revered by his contemporaries.</i>
reverence	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>The messenger made his reverence.</i>
savior	A person who rescues you from harm or danger.
venerate	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>We venerate genius.</i>
veneration	Great respect; reverence. <i>The traditional veneration of saints.</i>
wonder	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>A wonder drug.</i>
worship	The activity of worshipping. <i>Worship of the Mother Goddess.</i>
