fondness	A positive feeling of liking. I remember him with great fondness .



glorification	The practice of acknowledging and revealing the glory of God by one's actions. A romantic glorification of the past.
<u>glory</u>	Magnificence or great beauty. The glory of the sunrise.
<u>homage</u>	Respectful deference. Daniel s films were a homage to her.
idolisation	The act of admiring strongly.
idolization	The act of admiring strongly.
latria	The worship given to God alone.
laud	Praise. All glory laud and honour to Thee Redeemer King.
love	A person or thing that one loves. She was the love of his life.
pay homage to	Something that remunerates.
pay tribute to	Something that remunerates.
praise	The expression of respect and gratitude as an act of worship. <i>He always appreciated</i> praise <i>for his work.</i>
revere	American silversmith remembered for his midnight ride (celebrated in a poem by Longfellow) to warn the colonists in Lexington and Concord that British troops were coming (1735-1818.
reverence	An act showing respect (especially a bow or curtsy. <i>The Chinese reverence for the dead.</i>
revering	American silversmith remembered for his midnight ride (celebrated in a poem by Longfellow) to warn the colonists in Lexington and Concord that British troops were coming (1735-1818.
thanksgiving	(in North America) an annual national holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal. The holiday commemorates a harvest festival celebrated by the Pilgrim Fathers in 1621, and is held in the US on the fourth Thursday in November. A similar holiday is held in Canada, usually on the second Monday in October. <i>He offered prayers in thanksgiving for his safe arrival.</i>
veneration	A feeling of profound respect for someone or something. <i>The traditional veneration of saints.</i>
warmth	The trait of being intensely emotional. She smiled with real warmth .

The activity of worshipping. *Worship* of the Mother Goddess.

Associations of "Adoration" (30 Words)

admiration	A favorable judgment. A small token in admiration of your works.
admire	Feel admiration for. I admire your courage.
adore	Worship; venerate. She adore s Mexican cuisine.
adored	Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god. <i>Adored</i> grandchildren.
appreciation	Gratitude. I smiled in appreciation .
benediction	(in the Roman Catholic Church) a service in which the congregation is blessed with the sacrament. <i>He said the benediction</i> .
blessing	Grace said before or after a meal. A priest gave a blessing as the ship was launched.



canonize	(in the Roman Catholic Church) officially declare (a dead person) to be a saint. <i>He canonizes women.</i>
commend	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. His paintings commend him to the artistic world.
<u>deference</u>	Polite submission and respect. <i>He addressed her with the deference due to age.</i>
esteem	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. Many of these qualities are esteem ed by managers.
favorite	Something regarded with special favor or liking. That book is one of my favorite s.
<u>glowing</u>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>Glowing</i> praise.
<u>homage</u>	Formal public acknowledgement of feudal allegiance. Daniel s films were a homage to her.
honor	Bestow honor or rewards upon. A man of honor .
<u>idol</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. A soccer idol .
idolatry	Religious zeal; the willingness to serve God. We must not allow our idolatry of art to obscure issues of political significance.
<u>idolize</u>	Love unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol. <i>He</i> idolize <i>d his mother.</i>
laud	Praise. The obituary laud ed him as a great statesman and soldier.
obeisance	A gesture expressing deferential respect, such as a bow or curtsy. <i>They paid obeisance to the Prince.</i>
praise	Offering words of homage as an act of worship. <i>Give praise to God</i> .
respect	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. Respect to Hill for a truly non superficial piece on the techno scene.
respectful	Full of or exhibiting respect. Respectful behavior.



revere	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>C zanne s still lifes were revered by his contemporaries.</i>
reverence	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>The messenger made his reverence</i> .
<u>savior</u>	A person who rescues you from harm or danger.
<u>venerate</u>	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>We venerate</i> genius.
veneration	Great respect; reverence. The traditional veneration of saints.
wonder	Something that causes feelings of wonder. A wonder drug.
<u>worship</u>	The activity of worshipping. <i>Worship</i> of the Mother Goddess.
