Definitions of "Adorn" as a verb

- *Furnish with power or authority; of kings or emperors.*
- *Make more beautiful or attractive.*
- *Be beautiful to look at.*
- *Make more attractive by adding ornament, colour, etc.*

clothe Provide someone with clothes.
*They already had eight children to feed and **clothe**.*

deck	Decorate. <i>Lisa threatened to deck her if she didn't stop filming.</i>
<u>decorate</u>	Confer an award or medal on (a member of the armed forces). <i>He was decorated for outstanding bravery.</i>
<u>embellish</u>	Make (something) more attractive by the addition of decorative details or features. <i>Blue silk embellished with golden embroidery.</i>
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This sauce will enhance the flavor of the meat.</i>
<u>furnish</u>	Be a source of; provide. <i>We furnished the house in the Biedermeyer style.</i>
<u>grace</u>	(of a person or thing) be an attractive presence in or on; adorn. <i>He is one of the best players ever to have graced the game.</i>
<u>invest</u>	Make an investment. <i>Getting workers to invest in private pension funds.</i>
ornament	Make more attractive by adding ornament colour etc. <i>A jewel to ornament your wife's lovely throat.</i>



Usage Examples of "Adorn" as a verb

- *Flowers adorned the tables everywhere.*
- *Pictures and prints adorned his walls.*



Associations of "Adorn" (30 Words)

- adornment** A decoration of color or interest that is added to relieve plainness.
*The necktie is no longer a necessary male **adornment**.*
- aggrandize** Enhance the reputation of (someone) beyond what is justified by the facts.
*He hoped to **aggrandize** himself by dying a hero's death.*
- beaded** Decorated or covered with beads.
***Beaded** chiffon dresses.*
- beautification** The action or process of improving the appearance of a person or place.
*The city commissioned the **beautification** of the tunnel with work by five artists.*
- beautifully** Very well; excellently.
*All the elements combine **beautifully**.*
- beautify** Make more attractive by adding ornament, colour, etc.
***Beautify** yourself for the special day.*

bedeck	Decorate. <i>He led us into a room bedecked with tinsel.</i>
carat	A measure of the purity of gold pure gold being 24 carats. <i>22 carat gold.</i>
circlet	A small circle.
decorate	Confer an award or medal on (a member of the armed forces). <i>The town was decorated with Christmas lights.</i>
decoration	A medal or award conferred as an honour. <i>He was awarded the highest Australian decoration.</i>
diamond	One of the four suits in a conventional pack of playing cards denoted by a red diamond. <i>A diamond ring.</i>
earring	A piece of jewellery worn on the lobe or edge of the ear.
elaborately	In a detailed and carefully arranged manner. <i>The press conferences have become elaborately staged events.</i>
embellish	Make more attractive by adding ornament, colour, etc. <i>Followers often embellish stories about their heroes.</i>
finery	Expensive or ostentatious clothes or decoration. <i>Officers in their blue gold and scarlet finery.</i>
gem	Used in names of some brilliantly coloured hummingbirds e.g mountain gem. <i>He had the gem set in a ring for his wife.</i>
gemstone	A precious or semi-precious stone, especially one cut, polished, and used in a piece of jewellery.
invaluable	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. <i>An invaluable source of information.</i>
jewel	A person who is as brilliant and precious as a piece of jewelry. <i>She loved dressing up in her jewels.</i>
jewellery	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems). <i>She had silver hair and chunky gold jewellery.</i>
medallion	A circular helping of food (especially a boneless cut of meat). <i>Medallions of veal.</i>
ornament	Make more attractive by adding ornament colour etc. <i>The composer marked the vocal part with many aspirations accents and other ornaments.</i>

- precious** Greatly loved or treasured by someone.
*You and your **precious** schedule you ve got to lighten up.*
- raiment** Clothing.
*Ladies clothed in **raiment** bedecked with jewels.*
- regalia** The emblems or insignia of royalty, especially the crown, sceptre, and other ornaments used at a coronation.
*The Bishop of Florence in full **regalia**.*
- rhinestone** An imitation diamond, used in cheap jewellery and to decorate clothes.
***Rhinestone** earrings.*
- royal** A sail set next above the topgallant on a royal mast.
*The coalition obtained **royal** approval for the appointment.*
- sparkling** Shining brightly with flashes of light.
*Her **sparkling** blue eyes.*
- treasure** Any possession that is highly valued by its owner.
*The island is **treasured** by walkers and conservationists.*
