### Definitions of "Adorn" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “adorn” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Furnish with power or authority; of kings or emperors.*
- *Make more beautiful or attractive.*
- *Be beautiful to look at.*
- *Make more attractive by adding ornament, colour, etc.*



## Synonyms of "Adorn" as a verb (11 Words)

**add ornament to** State or say further.

**beautify** Be beautiful to look at.  
*Another initiative to **beautify** the environment.*

**clothe** Provide someone with clothes.  
*They already had eight children to feed and **clothe**.*

<b>deck</b>	Decorate. <i>Lisa threatened to <b>deck</b> her if she didn't stop filming.</i>
<u><b>decorate</b></u>	Confer an award or medal on (a member of the armed forces). <i>He was <b>decorated</b> for outstanding bravery.</i>
<u><b>embellish</b></u>	Make (something) more attractive by the addition of decorative details or features. <i>Blue silk <b>embellished</b> with golden embroidery.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This sauce will <b>enhance</b> the flavor of the meat.</i>
<u><b>furnish</b></u>	Be a source of; provide. <i>We <b>furnished</b> the house in the Biedermeyer style.</i>
<u><b>grace</b></u>	(of a person or thing) be an attractive presence in or on; adorn. <i>He is one of the best players ever to have <b>graced</b> the game.</i>
<u><b>invest</b></u>	Make an investment. <i>Getting workers to <b>invest</b> in private pension funds.</i>
<b>ornament</b>	Make more attractive by adding ornament colour etc. <i>A jewel to <b>ornament</b> your wife's lovely throat.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Adorn" as a verb

- *Flowers adorned the tables everywhere.*
- *Pictures and prints adorned his walls.*



## Associations of "Adorn" (30 Words)

<b>adornment</b>	A decoration of color or interest that is added to relieve plainness. <i>The necktie is no longer a necessary male <b>adornment</b>.</i>
<b>aggrandize</b>	Enhance the reputation of (someone) beyond what is justified by the facts. <i>He hoped to <b>aggrandize</b> himself by dying a hero's death.</i>
<b>beaded</b>	Decorated or covered with beads. <i><b>Beaded</b> chiffon dresses.</i>
<b>beautification</b>	The action or process of improving the appearance of a person or place. <i>The city commissioned the <b>beautification</b> of the tunnel with work by five artists.</i>
<b>beautifully</b>	Very well; excellently. <i>All the elements combine <b>beautifully</b>.</i>
<b>beautify</b>	Make more attractive by adding ornament, colour, etc. <i><b>Beautify</b> yourself for the special day.</i>

<b>bedeck</b>	Decorate. <i>He led us into a room <b>bedecked</b> with tinsel.</i>
<b>carat</b>	A measure of the purity of gold pure gold being 24 carats. <i>22 <b>carat</b> gold.</i>
<b>circlet</b>	A small circle.
<b>decorate</b>	Confer an award or medal on (a member of the armed forces). <i>The town was <b>decorated</b> with Christmas lights.</i>
<b>decoration</b>	A medal or award conferred as an honour. <i>He was awarded the highest Australian <b>decoration</b>.</i>
<b>diamond</b>	One of the four suits in a conventional pack of playing cards denoted by a red diamond. <i>A <b>diamond</b> ring.</i>
<b>earring</b>	A piece of jewellery worn on the lobe or edge of the ear.
<b>elaborately</b>	In a detailed and carefully arranged manner. <i>The press conferences have become <b>elaborately</b> staged events.</i>
<b>embellish</b>	Make more attractive by adding ornament, colour, etc. <i>Followers often <b>embellish</b> stories about their heroes.</i>
<b>finery</b>	Expensive or ostentatious clothes or decoration. <i>Officers in their blue gold and scarlet <b>finery</b>.</i>
<b>gem</b>	Used in names of some brilliantly coloured hummingbirds e.g mountain gem. <i>He had the <b>gem</b> set in a ring for his wife.</i>
<b>gemstone</b>	A precious or semi-precious stone, especially one cut, polished, and used in a piece of jewellery.
<b>invaluable</b>	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. <i>An <b>invaluable</b> source of information.</i>
<b>jewel</b>	A person who is as brilliant and precious as a piece of jewelry. <i>She loved dressing up in her <b>jewels</b>.</i>
<b>jewellery</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems). <i>She had silver hair and chunky gold <b>jewellery</b>.</i>
<b>medallion</b>	A circular helping of food (especially a boneless cut of meat). <i><b>Medallions</b> of veal.</i>
<b>ornament</b>	Make more attractive by adding ornament colour etc. <i>The composer marked the vocal part with many aspirations accents and other <b>ornaments</b>.</i>



<b>precious</b>	Greatly loved or treasured by someone. <i>You and your <b>precious</b> schedule you've got to lighten up.</i>
<b>raiment</b>	Clothing. <i>Ladies clothed in <b>raiment</b> bedecked with jewels.</i>
<b>regalia</b>	The emblems or insignia of royalty, especially the crown, sceptre, and other ornaments used at a coronation. <i>The Bishop of Florence in full <b>regalia</b>.</i>
<b>rhinestone</b>	An imitation diamond, used in cheap jewellery and to decorate clothes. <i><b>Rhinestone</b> earrings.</i>
<b>royal</b>	A sail set next above the topgallant on a royal mast. <i>The coalition obtained <b>royal</b> approval for the appointment.</i>
<b>sparkling</b>	Shining brightly with flashes of light. <i>Her <b>sparkling</b> blue eyes.</i>
<b>treasure</b>	Any possession that is highly valued by its owner. <i>The island is <b>treasured</b> by walkers and conservationists.</i>
