### **Definitions of "Adulthood" as a noun**

- *The state (and responsibilities) of a person who has attained maturity.*
- *The period of time in your life after your physical growth has stopped and you are fully developed.*
- *The state or condition of being fully grown or mature.*

**adolescence** The time period between the beginning of puberty and adulthood.  
*During **adolescence** teenagers often experience violent mood swings.*

**adolescent** An adolescent boy or girl.  
***Adolescent** boys and girls.*

<b>adult</b>	Suitable only for adults used euphemistically to refer to a sexually explicit film book or magazine. <i>An <b>adult</b> woman.</i>
<b>age</b>	A particular stage in someone's life. <i>Children of primary school <b>age</b>.</i>
<b>aged</b>	Advanced in years aged is pronounced as two syllables. <i><b>Aged</b> rocks.</i>
<b>aging</b>	Acquiring desirable qualities by being left undisturbed for some time.
<b>anachronistic</b>	Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed. <i>English public schools are <b>anachronistic</b>.</i>
<b>antiquate</b>	Make obsolete or old-fashioned.
<b>dowdy</b>	Lacking in smartness or taste. <i>A <b>dowdy</b> grey outfit.</i>
<b>doyen</b>	The most respected or prominent person in a particular field. <i>He became the <b>doyen</b> of British physicists.</i>
<b>grandpa</b>	The father of your father or mother.
<b>grow</b>	Cause to grow or develop. <i>We <b>grow</b> wheat here.</i>
<b>grown</b>	Fully developed. <i>A <b>grown</b> woman.</i>
<b>hoary</b>	Used in names of animals and plants covered with whitish fur or short hairs e.g hoary bat hoary cress. <i><b>Hoary</b> jokes.</i>
<b>immature</b>	(used of living things especially persons) in an early period of life or development or growth. <i><b>Immature</b> behavior.</i>
<b>infancy</b>	The early stage of growth or development. <i>Opinion polls were in their <b>infancy</b>.</i>
<b>late</b>	Of a later stage in the development of a language or literature used especially of dead languages. <i>Talked <b>late</b> into the evening.</i>
<b>mangy</b>	In poor condition; shabby. <i>A <b>mangy</b> carpet.</i>
<b>manhood</b>	The status of being a man. <i>The unity of Godhead and <b>manhood</b> in Christ.</i>

<b>maturation</b>	The process by which wine or other fermented drinks become ready for drinking. <i>White wines generally need less <b>maturation</b> than reds.</i>
<b>maturational</b>	Relating to or involved in maturation.
<b>mature</b>	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>Full bodied <b>mature</b> wines.</i>
<b>maturity</b>	An insurance policy security etc having a fixed maturity date. <i>Interest is not paid until <b>maturity</b>.</i>
<b>senescence</b>	Loss of a cell's power of division and growth.
<b>senescent</b>	Growing old.
<b>seniority</b>	The property of being long-lived. <i>Pay and benefits rise with <b>seniority</b>.</i>
<b>superannuated</b>	Too old to be useful- Anthony Trollope. <i>She is not <b>superannuated</b> and has no paid holiday.</i>
<b>teenage</b>	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i>A <b>teenage</b> girl.</i>
<b>teenager</b>	A person aged between 13 and 19 years.
<b>yore</b>	Time long past.
